WEST BENGAL

3.1% of cybercrime convictions in West Bengal in 2019-21

<u>News</u>

• According to a report tabled in Parliament, West Bengal has achieved a 3.1% conviction rate of all the persons who were charge-sheeted for cybercrime-related offences in the period of 2019-2021.

Details

- The number is slightly below the national average of 3.4%, and much lower than Jharkhand, which has a 6.6% conviction rate.
- Out of the 1,749 cybercrime cases reported in West Bengal, which constitute 1.8% of the total cybercrime cases in India, 773 persons were charge-sheeted and 663 were arrested.
- The number of cybercrime cases in Kolkata increased by 28% in 2021, mainly due to the pandemic-induced rise in cyber fraud.
- Experts have suggested that there is a need for effective trial monitoring, digital evidence collection and information-sharing among agencies to improve the investigation and prosecution of cybercrime cases in West Bengal.

SKOCH Awards

<u>News</u>

• The transport sector of West Bengal has been recognized with three prestigious SKOCH Awards for its outstanding performance and initiatives.

Details

- The first award, a Silver, was given to West Bengal Transport Corporation (WBTC) for transforming the 150-year-old Kolkata Tramways into a modern and attractive mode of transport.
- The second award, an Order of Merit, was given to WBTC for implementing e-governance in the bus ticketing system. This has resulted in increased revenue collection, better tracking of buses and enhanced traffic management.
- The third award, another Order of Merit, was given to WBTC for reviving the water transport sector by launching low-cost river cruises at Rs 39 and providing facilities like a boat library.

Swasthya Sathi

News

• West Bengal allocates Rs 5 lakh under Swasthya Sathi for a heart transplant

Details

- The Swasthya Sathi scheme aims to reduce the financial burden on the patients and their families by providing them with a one-time grant of Rs 5 lakh.
- The scheme will be funded by the state government and will be administered by the health department.
- The health department has also issued guidelines for the selection of the beneficiaries and the hospitals that will perform the heart transplant surgery. The beneficiaries will have to be below 65 years of age and have a valid Swasthya Sathi card.

National Health Mission

News

• The West Bengal government has recently announced a new policy that extends the retirement age of health mission doctors from 62 to 67 years.



Details

- This decision is aimed at addressing the shortage of doctors in the state, especially in rural and remote areas where health services are often inadequate.
- The health mission doctors are those who work under various schemes of the National Health Mission (NHM), such as the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), the National Urban Health Mission (NUHM), and the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY).
 - These doctors are appointed on a contractual basis and are paid a fixed monthly salary. They are not entitled to any benefits or allowances that regular government doctors enjoy.
- The new policy will benefit around 1,500 health mission doctors who are currently working in the state.
- According to health department officials, the extension of the retirement age will help retain the experienced and skilled doctors who have been serving the people for many years. It will also reduce the need for fresh recruitment and training of new doctors, which is a time-consuming and costly process

Biodiversity heritage sites

<u>News</u>

• West Bengal notified four more biodiversity heritage sites (BHS), taking the tally in the state to eight.

Details

- In a significant step towards the conservation of biodiversity and natural resources, the west bengal government has declared four new sites as biodiversity heritage parks. These are;
 - Char Balidanga (Nadia)
 - Namthing Pokhari (Darjeeling)
 - Amkhoi Wood Fossil Park (Birbhum)
 - State Horticulture Research and Development Station (Nadia).
- These sites have been selected for their unique ecological, historical and cultural values, and will be protected and managed by the state biodiversity board in collaboration with local communities and stakeholders.
- The biodiversity heritage parks aim to promote awareness, education and research on the rich diversity of flora and fauna in these areas, as well as to conserve the habitats and landscapes that sustain them.
- The four existing BHS in Bengal are
 - o Dhotrey and Tonglu both in Darjeeling
 - Chilkigarh Kanak Durga Biodiversity Heritage Site in Jhargram
 - o Baneswar Shiv Dighi in Cooch Behar

Kala Azar Elimination Programme <u>News</u>

• The West Bengal State health department to start the Kala Azar elimination programme across the state.

- There are 23 Kala-azar endemic blocks in Murshidabad, 16 in East Burdwan, 15 in Malda, 11 in Darjeeling, 10 in Hooghly, and nine each in the north and south Dinajpur.
- Around 500 doctors and nurses are likely to participate in the programme.
- Kala-azar, also known as visceral leishmaniasis, is a parasitic disease that affects the internal organs of the body. It is caused by

a protozoan parasite called Leishmania donovani, which is transmitted by the bite of infected sandflies.

- The symptoms of kala-azar include fever, weight loss, anaemia, enlarged spleen and liver, and skin darkening. If left untreated, kala-azar can be fatal.
- The disease is endemic in parts of Asia, Africa, and South America.
- The main treatment for kala azar is antimonial drugs, which are injected into the veins or muscles for several weeks.
- Prevention measures include avoiding sandfly bites, using insect repellents and nets, and controlling the sandfly population.





Dogri version of the Constitution of India

<u>News</u>

• The Union Minister of Law Kiren Rijiju has released the Dogri version of the Constitution of India.

Details

- Dogri is an Indo-Aryan language spoken by about 2.6 million people in the Jammu region of Jammu and Kashmir and some neighbouring areas.
- It is one of the 22 official languages of India and one of the 5 official languages of Jammu and Kashmir.
- The release of the Dogri version of the Constitution of India is a significant step towards preserving and promoting the linguistic and cultural diversity of the country.
- It will also help the Dogri speakers to understand and appreciate the fundamental rights and duties enshrined in the Constitution.
- The Dogri version of the Constitution is based on the original Hindi version and has been translated by a team of experts from Jammu University.

India's first water Metro

<u>News</u>

 Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated India's first water metro in Kochi, Kerala.

<u>Details</u>

- It aims to reduce traffic congestion and improve the connectivity of the city while promoting eco-friendly means of transportation.
- The Kochi Water Metro project has been implemented by Kochi Metro Rail Corporation



Limited (KMRL) along with the assistance of Kreditanstalt fur Wiederaufbau, a German funding agency.

Report on Promoting Millet in Diets

<u>News</u>

• NITI Aayog has released a report titled "Promoting Millets in Diets: Best Practices across States and Union Territories of India".

- The report highlights the importance of millets for food and nutrition security, especially in the context of climate change and non-communicable diseases.
- The report also showcases the good and innovative practices adopted by various states and organizations in promoting millets across the value chain, from production to consumption.



SWAGAT

<u>News</u>

• On April 27, Prime Minister attended a programme commemorating the 20th anniversary of the SWAGAT initiative in Gujarat.

Details

- SWAGAT (State Wide Attention on Grievances through Application of Technology) is a techbased grievance redressal programme.
- It acts as a bridge between the citizens and the government using technology by solving their day-to-day grievances in a quick, efficient and time-bound manner.

Baisakhi Mahotsav

<u>News</u>

• To commemorate the rich and diverse Dogra culture and heritage, the Directorate of Tourism, Jammu is organising a three-day 'Baisakhi Mahotsav 2023' in Jammu and Kashmir from April 13 to 15 2023.

Details

• The event aims to promote tourism and cultural exchange in the region and to celebrate the spirit of Baisakhi, which marks the harvest season and the beginning of a new year.

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)

News

- AAP emerged from an anti-corruption movement and has become the latest party to be recognized as a national party by the Election Commission of India.
 - At present, a total of 6 political parties have the status of National Party.

Details

- It has fulfilled the criteria of securing at least 6% of the valid votes polled in four or more states in a general election or assembly election.
- The AAP is headed by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

Food Conclave

<u>News</u>

• Hyderabad, Telangana hosted the Food Conclave-2023 on April 28 and 29.

Details

- The event brings together 100 experts from the agri-food industry to discuss and exchange ideas on various topics related to food production, processing, and innovation.
- The event was organized by the Government of Telangana, with the support of several knowledge partners such as the World Economic Forum-India, etc.

National Apprenticeship Mela

News

• The Pradhan Mantri National Apprenticeship Mela (PMNAM) was held at the ITI College in Udhampur, Jammu and Kashmir by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE).

- The event aimed to provide a platform for the youth to explore various opportunities in skill development and apprenticeship.
- The mela showcased the initiatives and schemes of the MSDE and its partner organizations to promote skill development and employability among the young generation.



The mela also facilitated the interaction between the prospective apprentices and employers from different sectors and industries.

Gond Painting

<u>News</u>

• In April 2023, the Gond painting received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag from the Government of India.

Details

- Gond painting is a form of tribal art that originated in Madhya Pradesh and is associated with the Gond community.
- Gond paintings are usually done on walls, floors, or canvases using natural materials such as clay, cow dung, charcoal, and plant sap.

"Stay Safe" Campaign

News

• Stay Safe campaign was launched by WhatsApp.

Details

- WhatsApp launched a new campaign called "Stay Safe with WhatsApp" in April 2023 to educate users on online safety and how to use the app's features to protect themselves from scams and fraud.
- The campaign will focus on simple ways to enable WhatsApp's safety features that offer layers of protection to users as they spend more time online

Medical Device Parks

<u>News</u>

• National Medical Devices Policy 2023 was approved by the Union Cabinet on April 26, 2023.

Details

- Under the policy, the government plans to support the setting up of **4 medical device parks** in Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.
- These parks will provide infrastructure and facilities for the domestic production of medical devices and reduce the import dependence in this sector.

Tamil Nadu

<u>News</u>

• The government of Tamil Nadu has recently passed a bill to ban online gambling and regulate online games in the state.

Details

- The bill aims to prevent the exploitation of vulnerable sections of society by online gaming operators and to protect the public interest.
- It defines online games as those that involve betting or wagering of money or any other valuable thing on the outcome of a game, sport, event, or any other uncertain activity.
- It prohibits the electronic transfer of funds for online gaming and imposes penalties for offenders.

Bhoroxa' (Trust) App

<u>News</u>

• The President Draupadi Murmu has launched a mobile application called 'Bhoroxa' (Trust).

<u>Details</u>

- The app aims to provide safety and security to women in Assam by enabling them to send distress signals to the nearest police station and their emergency contacts in case of any threat or danger.
- It was developed by the Assam State Commission for Women (ASCW) with the support of the Department of Information Technology and Communication.
- It provides information on women's rights, laws, helplines and other services.
- The President praised the initiative and urged women to download and use the app for their protection and empowerment.

Himachal Pradesh

<u>News</u>

• Himachal Pradesh has become the "first state" to create a DNA database of unidentified bodies.

Details

- The state police have collected DNA samples from 1,200 unidentified bodies found in various parts of the state since 2014 and stored them in a digital database.
- The database can be accessed by any police station in the state and can be matched with the DNA samples of relatives of missing persons.
- The database will also help in identifying the victims of natural disasters, accidents, crimes and terrorism.
- The state police have also collaborated with the Centre for DNA Fingerprinting and Diagnostics (CDFD), Hyderabad, for technical support and quality assurance.
- The state police hope that this initiative will set an example for other states to follow and will improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the criminal justice system.

Karnataka

<u>News</u>

• The state of Karnataka has been honoured with the national award for the best implementation of Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) for the year 2022-23.

<u>Details</u>

- The award was given by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare in recognition of the state's efforts to provide timely and adequate crop insurance coverage to the farmers.
- Karnataka has implemented PMFBY transparently and efficiently, using technology and innovation to ensure speedy settlement of claims and grievance redressal.
- **Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY)** is a government-sponsored crop insurance scheme that aims to support production in agriculture by providing affordable and comprehensive risk cover for crops of farmers against all non-preventable natural risks from pre-sowing to the post-harvest stage, on an 'Area Approach Basis'.
 - The scheme was launched in 2016 and is being administered by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.

3D-printed post office

News

• The first 3D-printed post office in India is being constructed in Bangalore, Karnataka.

<u>Details</u>

- It was constructed by Larsen & Toubro Ltd (L&T), a leading engineering and construction company.
- The building cost 30-40% less than a conventional building of the same size.



- 3D printing is a process that creates three-dimensional objects by depositing layers of material on top of each other, following a digital model.
- The advantages of 3D printing include faster construction, reduced material wastage, lower labour costs, and greater design flexibility.
- The 3D-printed post office will showcase the potential of this innovative technology for creating sustainable and affordable public infrastructure in India.

Madhya Pradesh

<u>News</u>

• The Madhya Pradesh government has recently added the transgender community to the Other Backward Classes (OBC) list of the state.

Details

- The government has also announced plans to set up a Transgender Welfare Board to address the issues and grievances of the community.
- This move aims to provide social and economic benefits to the marginalized group and to ensure their equal participation in society.
- The transgender community has long faced discrimination and stigma in India, and this recognition is a step towards their empowerment and dignity.

Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras

<u>News</u>

• IIT Madras has announced to establishment its first international campus in Zanzibar, Tanzania in October 2023.

<u>Details</u>

- This will be the first time that an IIT will have a presence outside India, and it will offer undergraduate and postgraduate courses in engineering, science, management and humanities.
- The campus will offer undergraduate and postgraduate courses in engineering, science and humanities, as well as research facilities and industry collaborations.
- The campus aims to foster academic excellence and innovation in the African continent and beyond.

One Panchayat, One Playground

<u>News</u>

• The 'One Panchayat, One Playground' project is an initiative by the Kerala government to promote sports and physical activities among the people of the State.

<u>Details</u>

- The project aims to provide quality playgrounds in every panchayat, where children and adults can play various games and sports.
- It is expected to improve the health and well-being of the people of Kerala, as well as to foster a sense of community and social harmony.

Global Buddhist Summit

<u>News</u>

- Prime Minister hosted the first Global Buddhist Summit in New Delhi on April 20, 2023.
- Theme "Responses to Contemporary Challenges: Philosophy to Praxis".

<u>Details</u>

- This two-day summit was hosted by the Ministry of Culture.
- The summit brought together Buddhist leaders, scholars, and followers from around the world to discuss the relevance of Buddhism in the contemporary world.



- The summit focused on how to disseminate and internalize universal values based on Buddha's teachings of peace, well-being, harmony, and compassion.
- The summit concluded with the adoption of the New Delhi Declaration, which reaffirmed the commitment of the participants to work together for the welfare of all sentient beings and the protection of the environment.

Assam

- North-East's first All India Institute of Medical Science (AIIMS) was inaugurated by Prime Minister in Guwahati, Assam,
- It has a total bed capacity of 750, including 30 AYUSH beds, and an annual admission capacity of 100 MBBS students.

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) Report

<u>News</u>

• According to a recent report by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), 29 out of the 30 chief ministers (CMs) in India have declared assets worth more than one crore rupees.

Details

- Andhra Pradesh's CM Jagan Mohan Reddy has the highest assets, totalling Rs 510 crore, followed by Arunachal Pradesh's Pema Khandu (over Rs 163 crore) and Odisha's Naveen Patnaik (over Rs 63 crore), according to the ADR Report.
- West Bengal Chief Minister Mamta Banerjee has the lowest total assets of around Rs 15 lakh.
- 29 of the 30 CMs studied are crorepatis, with an average asset value of Rs 33.96 crore for each.

India Justice Report

<u>News</u>

• Karnataka ranked first among the 18 major and mid-sized states with a population of over one crore in the India Justice Report (IJR) 2022, a project of Tata Trusts.

<u>Details</u>

- Sikkim is at the top small state (population less than one million).
- Police, prisons, the judiciary, and legal aid are the four main pillars of the judicial system.

First Metro Project in Odisha

<u>News</u>

• Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on April 1 announced the creation of the State's first metro project, connecting the capital city Bhubaneswar with other peripheral urban centres – Cuttack, Puri and Khordha, with its funding.

Details

- The route will connect the capital city of Bhubaneswar with the industrial hub of Cuttack, covering a distance of 28 km and 22 stations.
- The metro trunk route will be implemented by Odisha Metro Rail Corporation (OMRC), a joint venture between the State government and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs.
- The estimated cost of the project is Rs 8,300 crore, and it is expected to be completed by 2027.
- The metro route will have both elevated and underground sections, with state-of-the-art features such as an automatic fare collection system, platform screen doors, CCTV surveillance, Wi-Fi connectivity and emergency evacuation facilities.

Chenab Rail Bridge

<u>News</u>

• The railway minister Ashwini Vaishnaw conducted the first trial run on a track-mounted vehicle on the Chenab rail bridge in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district.



- The bridge, which is part of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link project, is the world's highest railway bridge with a height of 359 metres above the Chenab River.
- The Chenab Bridge can withstand high wind speeds, earthquakes and blasts.

India's first ropeway transport in Varanasi

<u>News</u>

• Prime Minister announced India's 1st ropeway transport in Varanasi.

Details

- Varanasi, the ancient city of temples and ghats, is set to become the first city in India to have a ropeway service for public transportation.
- The project aims to ease traffic congestion and provide a scenic view of the city to commuters and tourists.
- It will reduce travel time and pollution, and offer a panoramic view of the city's heritage and beauty.

Sukhashraya Bill

<u>News</u>

• The Sukhashraya bill, which aims to provide financial assistance and social security to orphans in Himachal Pradesh, was passed by the state assembly.

<u>Details</u>

- The bill proposes to give a monthly allowance of Rs 3,000 to orphans up to the age of 18 years, and Rs 2,000 to those between 18 and 21 years who are pursuing higher education or vocational training.
- The bill also provides for free education, health care, and legal aid to orphans. The bill defines an orphan as a child who has lost both parents or whose parents are unknown or have abandoned him or her.
- The bill also empowers the district magistrates to issue certificates of orphanhood to eligible children.
- The bill was supported by all parties in the assembly and hailed as a progressive and humanitarian step by the government.

Project Sanjeevani

News

• The State Government of Himachal Pradesh (HP) has launched project Sanjeevani to empower the livelihood of small dairy farmers and livestock owners.

<u>Details</u>

- The project aims to provide quality animal health care services, enhance milk production and productivity, and promote value addition and marketing of dairy products.
- The project will also support the development of fodder and feed resources, improve animal breeding and genetics, and strengthen the institutional and policy framework for the dairy sector.
- Project Sanjeevani is expected to benefit about 200,000 rural households in HP, especially women and youth, who are engaged in dairying and livestock-rearing activities.
- The project will also contribute to the state's vision of becoming self-reliant in milk production and processing by 2024.

Spring Fiesta 2023

<u>News</u>

• To celebrate its 69th anniversary, the NGMA organized a grand event called Spring Fiesta 2023.

<u>Details</u>



- The National Gallery of Modern Art (NGMA) is one of the most prestigious institutions of art in India, with branches in New Delhi, Mumbai and Bangalore.
- It houses a collection of more than 17000 works of modern and contemporary art by Indian and international artists.
- The NGMA was established in 1954 and has been promoting the appreciation and understanding of modern art ever since.

Cool Roof Policy

<u>News</u>

• Telangana launched the Telangana Cool Roof Policy 2023-28, which aims to reduce the temperature in Hyderabad and other urban areas in Telangana by promoting the adoption of cool roofs.

<u>Details</u>

- Urban heat islands (UHIs) are areas where the temperature is significantly higher than the surrounding rural or natural areas. UHIs can have negative impacts on human health, energy consumption, air quality, and water resources.
 - UHIs are mainly caused by the modification of land surfaces, such as replacing vegetation with concrete and asphalt, and the emission of heat from buildings, vehicles, and industrial activities.
- Cool roofs are roofs that reflect more sunlight and absorb less heat than conventional roofs. They can lower the surface temperature of the roof by up to 20°C and reduce the cooling load of the building by up to 15%.

Varanasi

<u>News</u>

• 'Kashi' (Varanasi) has been declared the first tourism and cultural capital of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO).

Details

- It is one of the oldest and most sacred cities in India. It is located on the banks of the river Ganga in Uttar Pradesh. It is known for its rich cultural heritage, religious significance, and artistic traditions. It is also a hub of education, tourism, and handicrafts.
- The declaration was welcomed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who expressed his gratitude to the SCO members for their support and appreciation of India's culture and civilization.
- The declaration is expected to boost tourism and cultural exchange between India and other SCO members. It will also showcase India's diversity and pluralism to the world.
- The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) is a Eurasian political, economic, international security and defence organization.
 - The SCO was founded in 2001 by China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. India and Pakistan joined as full members in 2017.
 - The SCO aims to promote cooperation among its members in various fields such as security, trade, energy, culture, education, and health.

Mehangai Rahat Camp

<u>News</u>

• Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot launches 'Mehangai Rahat Camp' in Jaipur

- This initiative aims to provide relief to the people of the state from inflation and unemployment by connecting them with various welfare schemes of the state government.
- Some of these schemes include providing LPG cylinders at Rs 500 under Ujjwala Yojna, free accident insurance of Rs 10 lakhs, and job cards under MGNREGA.

Mizoram

<u>News</u>

Mizoram was declared the happiest state in India.

Details

- Mizoram, a state in the northeastern part of India, has been declared the happiest state in the country by a study at the Management Development Institute in Gurugram.
- The study measured the happiness index of Mizoram based on six parameters: family relationships, work-related issues, social issues and philanthropy, religion, Covid-19's effect on happiness, and physical and mental health.
- According to the study, Mizoram has a unique social structure that plays a significant role in enhancing the happiness of its young population.
- Some of the factors that contribute to Mizoram's happiness are a High literacy rate, Employment opportunities, Equal social status, Friendly schooling, and Financial independence.



Tulsi Ghat Restoration Project

<u>News</u>

• The 'Tulsi Ghat Restoration Project' is a cultural initiative launched by India's External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on April 10, 2023, during his visit to Uganda's capital city Kampala.

Details

- The project aims to conserve and beautify the Tulsi Ghat, one of the ancient ghats in Varanasi, where the poet-saint Tulsidas wrote the Ramcharitmanas, a revered epic of Hinduism.

 - According to the report, achieving this ambitious target will require a massive transformation of the energy landscape, with renewable energy playing a central role.
- The report highlights the main challenges and opportunities for the energy transition, such as the need for increased investment, policy support, international cooperation, social inclusion and innovation.



It also provides insights into the technology choices, investment needs, policy frameworks and socio-economic impacts of achieving a sustainable, resilient and inclusive energy future.

Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) <u>News</u>

- Captagon, also known as "poor man's coke", is an amphetamine-type stimulant that is popular in Saudi Arabia and other Arab states, where it is used for recreational purposes and to enhance performance and endurance.
- The captagon industry in Syria is not only lucrative but also sophisticated and adaptive. The drug is manufactured across the country, using imported precursor chemicals and advanced equipment.

New York

News

• Union Commerce, Industry and Textiles Minister Piyush Goyal unveiled a new foreign trade policy that aims to boost India's exports and reduce its trade deficit.

Details

- The policy will be effective from April 1, 2023, to March 31, 2028, and has five key objectives:
 - Diversifying export markets and products
 - Enhancing the competitiveness of domestic industries
 - Promoting value-added exports
 - Facilitating trade facilitation and ease of doing business
 - Ensuring a level playing field for Indian exporters.
- It provides incentives for exporters in sectors such as agriculture, textiles, leather, gems and jewellery, engineering, electronics, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, and services.
- It addresses the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the changing global trade scenario.
- It provides flexibility to respond to emerging situations and opportunities and aligns with the government's vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India).



Key highlights from India's updated Foreign Trade Policy:

It focuses on lowering costs for smaller firms and offering swifter clearances

It aims at tripling exports to \$2 trillion by 2030 from \$760 billion in 2022-23

- Jupiter claims to be India's first full-stack digital bank that leverages artificial intelligence and data analytics to cater to the needs and preferences of its users. With the NBFC license, Jupiter hopes to expand its customer base and reach new segments of the market.

eShram Portal

<u>News</u>

• Recently, the Union Minister for Labour & Employment Shri Bhupender Yadav launched new features in the eShram portal.

Details

- It is a national database of unorganised workers including migrant workers, construction workers, gig and platform workers, etc.
- It aims to provide social security benefits, skill development opportunities, employment opportunities and other welfare schemes to the unorganised workers, who constitute about 90% of the total workforce in the country.

Logistic Performance Index

• Logistics Performance Index 2023 published by the World Bank.

Details

- The Index ranks India at 38th position among 139 countries, up from 44th in 2018.
- It is a comprehensive indicator that measures the quality of logistics services, infrastructure, customs clearance, tracking and tracing, timeliness, and international shipments.

Small Saving Schemes

• The Union Government has announced a hike in the interest rates of most small saving schemes.

Details

Details

- The Ministry of Education has announced the launch of the New India Literacy Programme (NILP), a flagship initiative to eradicate illiteracy in the country.
- The NILP aims to provide basic literacy and numeracy skills to 5.00 crore non-literate adults in the age group of 15 years and above, especially women, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, minorities and other disadvantaged groups.
- The programme will be implemented through a network of volunteers, NGOs, civil society organizations and local self-governments.
- The NILP will also leverage digital technologies and online platforms to deliver learning materials and assessments.
- The programme is expected to have a positive impact on the socio-economic development of the country and contribute to the vision of a New India.

World Bank

<u>News</u>

• The World Bank has lowered its forecast for India's economic growth in the current fiscal year that started on April 1 to 6.3% from 6.6%.

Details

- This revision reflects the challenging external environment and the moderation in domestic demand.
- The Update also highlights the risks to India's growth outlook from the spillovers of recent developments in global financial markets and geopolitical tensions.
- The rise in US interest rates and the tapering of asset purchases by the Federal Reserve have led to a tightening of global liquidity conditions and a reversal of capital flows to emerging markets, including India. This has put pressure on the exchange rate and increased volatility in domestic financial markets.
 - Moreover, the escalation of the conflict between Russia and Ukraine has disrupted global supply chains and raised uncertainty about energy prices and trade flows.
- The World Bank urges India to continue its efforts to improve its business environment, enhance its human capital, and invest in green and resilient infrastructure to achieve its aspiration of becoming a high-income country by 2047.

World Bank

- The World Bank was founded in 1944 as part of the Bretton Woods Agreement, which aimed to establish a stable international monetary system after World War II.
- The World Bank consists of two main institutions: the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) and the International Development Association (IDA).
- The World Bank is headquartered in Washington, USA.
- The World Bank is governed by its 189 member countries, which elect a board of executive directors that oversees the management and policies of the organization.
- The president of the World Bank is nominated by the United States, which is the largest shareholder of the organization, and approved by the board. The current president is David Malpass.

• Union Bank of India, one of the largest public sector banks in India, has secured the first rank in the EASE (Enhanced Access and Service Excellence) reforms index for the year 2020-21.

Details

- The scheme will also create a network of PM SHRI schools that will collaborate and share their experiences and learnings.

SATHI Portal and Mobile App

• The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has launched a new portal and mobile app called SATHI, which stands for Seed Authentication Traceability and Holistic Inventory.

Details

- The campaign is expected to benefit more than 10 crore rural women across the country by empowering them to become self-reliant and confident.


Animal Pandemic Preparedness Initiative (APPI)

<u>News</u>

• The "Animal Pandemic Preparedness Initiative (APPI)" will be launched by the Union Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Shri Parshottam Rupala.

<u>Details</u>

- The APPI is a comprehensive and integrated program that aims to strengthen the animal health system and prevent the emergence and spread of zoonotic diseases that can pose a threat to both animals and humans.
- The APPI will focus on four key areas: surveillance and early detection of animal diseases, rapid response and containment of outbreaks, research and development of vaccines and diagnostics, and awareness and capacity building of stakeholders.
- The APPI will also leverage the existing infrastructure and resources of the National Animal Disease Control Program (NADCP) and the National Livestock Mission (NLM) to ensure effective implementation and coordination.
- According to the World Health Organization (WHO), about 60% of human infectious diseases are zoonotic in nature, and about 75% of new or emerging infectious diseases in humans are of animal origin. Therefore, protecting animals from diseases is not only essential for their wellbeing but also for safeguarding human health and livelihoods.





Asian Development Bank

News

• The Asian Development Bank has cut India's growth forecast for 2023-24 to 6.4% from 7.2% estimated earlier.

Details

- The ADB says that India's growth will be affected by an expected global economic slowdown, tight monetary conditions, and persistently elevated oil prices.
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is a regional development bank that aims to promote social and economic development in Asia and the Pacific.
- The ADB was established in 1966 and has 68 members, of which 49 are from the region. The ADB's headquarters are in Manila, Philippines.
- The ADB's main activities include providing loans, grants, technical assistance, and equity investments to support projects and programs that address poverty reduction, inclusive growth, environmental sustainability, regional cooperation and integration, and governance and institutional capacity.
- The ADB also conducts research and policy dialogue on development issues and challenges facing the region.

PRAVAAH Portal

<u>News</u>

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) launched a secured web-based centralized portal named 'PRAVAAH' (Platform for Regulatory Application, Validation AndAutHorisation).

<u>Details</u>

- It aims to simplify and streamline the application processes for various regulatory approvals and authorisations.
- It will enable applicants to submit their applications online, track the status of their applications, and receive notifications and alerts from the RBI.
- It will facilitate the RBI to process the applications faster and more accurately, using automated workflows and validations.
- It will cover various regulatory functions of the RBI, such as banking supervision, foreign exchange management, payment systems, consumer protection, and financial inclusion.

'Mircha' rice

<u>News</u>

• West Champaran in Bihar received the GI designation for its 'Mircha' rice.

Details

- Mircha or Marcha Rice gets its name from the size and form of the grain, which resembles black pepper.
- The rice is grown in the floodplains of the Gandak river, where the soil is rich in minerals and organic matter.
- The rice is harvested by hand and sun-dried, preserving its natural qualities. Recently, the 'Mircha' rice of West Champaran received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag from the Government of India, recognizing its origin and quality.

RBI Bimonthly Monetary Policy

<u>News</u>

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued its bimonthly monetary policy, maintaining the repo rate at 6.50%.
- In the current fiscal year, GDP is predicted to increase by 6.5%.

<u>Details</u>



- The RBI Bimonthly Monetary Policy outlines the key decisions taken by the RBI's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) regarding the interest rates, inflation, growth and liquidity in the Indian economy.
- The MPC consists of six members: three from the RBI and three external experts appointed by the government.
- The policy repo rate influences the cost and availability of credit in the economy and affects various macroeconomic variables such as inflation, growth, exchange rate and balance of payments.
- The MPC aims to maintain price stability while keeping in mind the objective of growth. The MPC follows a flexible inflation targeting framework, which means that it targets a band of 2-6% for consumer price inflation over a medium-term horizon.
- The MPC also publishes its projections for inflation and growth for the current and next financial year, along with its rationale and assessment of various risks and uncertainties.

Anemia Mukta Lakhsya AbhiyaN (AMLAN)

<u>News</u>

• Students of all government and government-aided schools in Odisha will get iron and folic acid (IFA) tablets during the summer vacation under the Anemia Mukta Lakhsya AbhiyaN (AMLAN).

About Anaemia Mukta Lakhya Abhiyan (AMLAN)

- The initiative was launched by Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on November 24, 2022, to eradicate anaemia from the state.
- Anaemia is a blood disorder that causes low levels of haemoglobin, which carries oxygen to the body's tissues.
 - Anaemia can cause fatigue, weakness, dizziness and shortness of breath, among other symptoms.
- AMLAN aims to benefit about 1.37 crore people, including pregnant women, lactating mothers, women of reproductive age groups, adolescents and children.
- The programme will be rolled out in 55,000 government and government-aided schools and 74,000 Anganwadi Centres across the state.
- The programme will involve various interventions such as strengthening iron and folic acid supplementation, testing for haemoglobin, treatment of anaemic patients, capacity building of service providers and social behaviour change communication.
- It is implemented with the joint efforts of several departments such as Health and Family Welfare, School and Mass Education, and Women and Child Development.

State Energy Efficiency Index

<u>News</u>

• The Union Minister of Power and New & Renewable Energy, Shri R. K. Singh has released the report of the State Energy Efficiency Index (SEEI) 2021-22

- The State Energy Efficiency Index (SEEI) 2021-22 is a comprehensive assessment of the energy efficiency performance of states and UTs in India.
- The index is developed by the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), a statutory body under the Ministry of Power, in association with Alliance for an Energy-Efficient Economy (AEEE).
- The index tracks the progress of states and UTs in implementing energy efficiency initiatives across seven sectors: buildings, industry, municipal services, transport, agriculture, DISCOMs, and cross-sector.
- According to the index, five states Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Rajasthan, and Telangana are in the Front Runner category (>60 points), while four states Assam, Haryana, Maharashtra, and Punjab are in the Achiever category (50-60 points).
- Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Assam, and Chandigarh are the top-performing states in their respective state groups, while Telangana and Andhra Pradesh showed the most improvement since the last index.



The index aims to help states identify areas for improvement, learn from best practices, and adopt an economy-wide approach to energy efficiency implementation.

Kerala

<u>News</u>

• Kerala has achieved a remarkable feat by securing the highest number of geographical indication (GI) tags in the country for the financial year 2022-23.

Details

- A GI tag is a sign used on products that have a specific geographical origin and possess qualities or a reputation that are due to that origin.
 - It helps in protecting the uniqueness and authenticity of such products and promotes their economic value.
- According to the data released by the Geographical Indications Registry under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Kerala obtained 12 GI tags out of the total 38 granted in India during the period from April 2022 to March 2023.



Exercise "Cope India 2023"

- In Paschim Medinipur district of West Bengal, a joint exercise between the air forces of India and America took place.
- The exercise, named "Cope India 2023", aimed to enhance interoperability and cooperation between the two countries.

Operation Kaveri

<u>News</u>

• Operation Kaveri is the evacuation operation carried out by the Indian government to bring back its citizens from Sudan, a country that has been engulfed in a violent conflict between the military and a paramilitary force.

Details

- The operation involves the use of Indian Navy and Indian Air Force assets, as well as coordination with other countries and international organizations.
- The Sudan crisis erupted on April 15, 2023, when the Rapid Support Force (RSF), a powerful paramilitary group that was part of the transitional government, clashed with the Sudanese army over a coup attempt.
 - The fighting soon spread to the capital Khartoum and other parts of the country, leaving hundreds of people dead and thousands injured.
 - The situation also triggered a humanitarian crisis, as millions of people faced food shortages, power cuts, and internet blackouts.
- Among those affected by the crisis were around 3,400 Indian nationals, mostly working in the oil and construction sectors, who were stranded in various locations across Sudan.

World Military Expenditure

<u>News</u>

• A report on Trends in World Military Expenditure in 2022, published by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI)

<u>Details</u>

• India was the world's fourth-largest military spender in 2022.



- India's military spending rose mainly due to its arms imports, which increased by 33 per cent between 2018–22 and 2013–17.
- India was the second largest arms importer in the world after Saudi Arabia in 2018–22, receiving 9.5 per cent of the global arms transfers.
- The main suppliers of arms to India were Russia (49%), France (18%) and Israel (13%)

Nagastra

- Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) 'Nagastra' can perform reconnaissance, surveillance and attack missions.
- It is India's first indigenous loitering munition which can strike enemy targets with precision.

Exercise INIOCHOS-23

- It is a multinational air exercise that takes place at the Andravida Air Base in Greece from April 24 to May 4.
- The Indian Air Force (IAF) participated in this exercise, along with other countries such as France, Israel, Spain, and the United States.
- The exercise aims to enhance interoperability and cooperation among the participating air forces, as well as to improve their readiness and combat skills.

Exercise Orion

- The Indian Air Force participated part in the multinational international Exercise Orion, which was held at Mont-de-Marsan in France from April 17 to May 5, 2023.
- The IAF Contingent participated in the exercise with four Rafale, two C-17, two ll-78 aircraft, and 165 air warriors.

Exercise 'Ex KAVACH'

- The Army, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard participated in the large-scale Joint Military Exercise 'Ex KAVACH' led by the Andaman and Nicobar Command (ANC).
- The KAVACH exercise began on February 23, 2023, and ended on April 7, 2023.
- To improve interoperability and operational synergy among the forces by fine-tuning joint combat capabilities and SOPs







Malaria Vaccine

<u>News</u>

• Ghana has become the first country in the world to approve a new malaria vaccine from Oxford University.

Details

- The vaccine, called R21/Matrix-M, has shown an efficacy of 77% in clinical trials and could prevent millions of deaths from the disease.
- Malaria is a life-threatening disease that affects millions of people around the world. It is caused by parasites of the genus Plasmodium, which are transmitted by the bites of infected female Anopheles mosquitoes.
- The most common symptoms of malaria are fever, headache, and chills, which usually appear 10 to 15 days after the mosquito bite. If left untreated, malaria can lead to severe complications such as organ failure, cerebral malaria, and death.

ISRO's PSLV-C55

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully launched the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle C55 (PSLV-C55) mission carrying two Singaporean satellites from Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.
- The primary payload of the mission was Singapore's TeLEOS-2 satellite, a high-resolution earth observation satellite weighing about 400 kg.

JUICE Mission

<u>News</u>

• On April 14, 2023, the European Space Agency (ESA) launched its flagship JUICE (Jupiter ICy moons Explorer) mission.

Details

- An Ariane 5 rocket was launched from Europe's Spaceport in Kourou, French Guiana. It will take an eight-year journey to reach Jupiter.
- The goal is to determine whether there are livable conditions among the frozen moons and around Jupiter.
- Jupiter has the highest number of Moon.

LIGO-India

News

• The LIGO-India project has recently received approval from the Union Cabinet to be constructed in the Hingoli district of Maharashtra at an estimated cost of Rs 2,600 crore. The facility is expected to be completed by 2030 and start observations by the end of the decade.

- Gravitational waves are ripples in the fabric of space and time that are produced by violent events in the cosmos, such as collisions of black holes or neutron stars. These waves carry information about the nature and origin of these sources, as well as the properties of gravity itself.
- However, detecting gravitational waves is extremely challenging, as they are very weak and require highly sensitive instruments to measure them. The Laser Interferometer Gravitational-wave Observatory (LIGO) is a network of two such detectors in the United States, located in Hanford, Washington and Livingston, Louisiana.



• LIGO has made history by making the first direct detection of gravitational waves in 2015, and since then has observed several more signals from binary black holes and binary neutron star mergers.

National Quantum Mission

<u>News</u>

• The Government of India has approved the National Quantum Mission (NQM) with a budget outlay of Rs 6003.65 Crores for a period of five years.

Details

- The NQM aims to foster research and innovation in quantum science and technology and establish India as a global leader in this emerging field.
- Quantum science and technology is a rapidly evolving domain that exploits the principles of quantum mechanics to develop novel applications in computing, communication, cryptography, sensing, metrology, and artificial intelligence.
- Quantum technologies have the potential to transform various sectors such as defence, security, healthcare, agriculture, education, and industry.
- The NQM will support basic and applied research in quantum science and technology, as well as human resource development and infrastructure creation.
- The mission will also facilitate the development of quantum products and services by fostering collaboration among academia, industry, and government.
- The NQM will also promote public awareness and outreach activities to generate interest and enthusiasm among students and citizens about quantum science and technology.

Mefeego

<u>News</u>

• Japan's Health Ministry has approved the country's first abortion pill Mefeego, which can be used to terminate early pregnancies up to nine weeks of gestation.

Details

- The pill, which contains mifepristone and misoprostol, works by blocking the hormone progesterone and inducing contractions to expel the embryo.
- Mefeego is expected to provide a safe and effective alternative to surgical abortion, which is the only legal method of abortion in Japan. Surgical abortion requires anaesthesia and hospitalization and can pose risks of infection, bleeding and damage to the uterus.
- Mefeego can be taken at home or in a clinic and has fewer side effects and complications.

Kenya Space Agency

<u>News</u>

• The Kenya Space Agency (KSA) is set to launch its first operational Earth observation satellite "Taifa-1" or "Nation-1" in Swahili, on April 10, 2023

Details

- Taifa-1 is a microsatellite with a mass of about 100 kg and a lifespan of five years.
- It will capture high-resolution images of the Earth's surface, which will be used for various applications such as agriculture, disaster management, security, urban planning and resource management.

Fengyun-3G

<u>News</u>

• China successfully launched the Fengyun-3G satellite from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Center in Shanxi Province.

<u>Details</u>



- The Fengyun-3G satellite is part of China's third-generation polar-orbiting meteorological satellite system, which aims to improve the country's capabilities in weather forecasting, climate change research and disaster prevention and mitigation.
- The satellite carries payloads, including a microwave humidity sounder, a microwave temperature sounder, a microwave imager and a lightning mapper.
- The satellite can observe the distribution and intensity of precipitation, cloud cover, atmospheric temperature and humidity, sea surface temperature and wind speed, as well as the location and frequency of lightning strikes.
- It can also detect the formation and development of typhoons, floods, droughts and other natural disasters.



Sachin Tendulkar

- Sachin Tendulkar has been honoured with a special gesture by the Sharjah cricket stadium in the UAE.
- The West Stand of the stadium, where Tendulkar scored many of his runs, has been renamed after him on his 50th birthday.

David Warner

- David Warner, the captain of Delhi Capitals became the fastest batsman to reach the 6000-run mark in the IPL during a match against Rajasthan Royals at the Barsapara Stadium in Guwahati.
- He achieved this feat in just 165 innings, which is faster than Virat Kohli and Shikhar Dhawan, who are the only other players to have scored 6000 runs in the IPL.

Nisha Dahiya

- The silver medal in the women's 68kg category at the Asian wrestling championships 2023 held in Astana, Kazakhstan was won by India's Nisha Dahiya.
- She defeated Delgermaa Enkhsaikhan of Mongolia and Feng Zhou of China in the quarterfinals and semi-finals respectively, before losing to Japan's Ami Ishi in the final.

Wisden's leading T20I cricketer

<u>News</u>

• Suryakumar Yadav and Harmanpreet Kaur were awarded Wisden's leading T20I cricketer of the year.

- Suryakumar Yadav, the Indian male team batsman who made his international debut in 2021, has been named the leading male cricketer in the world.
 - He scored 1,234 runs in 25 matches across all formats, with an average of 61.70 and a strike rate of 144.67.
 - He also hit four centuries and eight fifties.
- Harmanpreet Kaur, the captain of the Indian women's team, has been named the leading female cricketer in the world.
 - She scored 1,098 runs in 24 matches across all formats, with an average of 54.90 and a strike rate of 132.45.
 - She also smashed three centuries and six fifties, including a record-breaking 171 not out off 115 balls against Australia in the ODI World Cup semi-final.



Aman Sehrawat

- Aman Sehrawat, a freestyle wrestler, won India's first gold medal in the Asian Wrestling Championship 2023.
- He defeated Ahmet Duman of Turkey 12-4 in the final of the 57kg category, becoming the first Indian wrestler to win gold.

Jyothi Surekha Vennam

- Indian archery Jyothi Surekha Vennam won two gold medals at the Archery World Cup Stage 1 in Antalya, Turkey.
- She became the first Indian woman to win an individual gold medal in compound archery at the World Cup.

Super Cup

News

- Odisha FC clinched their maiden trophy after defeating Bengaluru FC 2-1 in the final of the Super Cup.
- It was the first-ever final for Odisha, it was the third of the season for Bengaluru.

Details

- The 2023 Super Cup was the 3rd edition of the Super Cup and the 41st season of the national knockout football competition in India.
- The competition was sponsored by Hero MotoCorp and is known as the Hero Super Cup for sponsorship purposes.
- The tournament was being organised after a gap of four years due to various scheduling issues, with the latest edition being played in 2019.
- This was the first time the Super Cup champions had a spot allotted in the AFC competitions.
- The 2023 edition of the Super Cup was played across two cities of Kerala, Kozhikode and Manjeri.
- Top goal scorer: Wilmar Jordán (7 goals)
- Best player: Diego Mauricio

Indian Hockey

<u>News</u>

• The Odisha government decided to further extend its sponsorship for both the Men and Women's Indian Hockey Teams (senior and junior) for another ten years from 2023 to 2033.

Details

- In 2018, the Odisha government became the official sponsor of the Indian national hockey teams, both men and women, senior and junior, for a period of five years.
- The sponsorship agreement was a significant step towards the growth and development of hockey in India, as it provided financial stability and security to the players and coaches.
- It also enabled Hockey India to invest in infrastructure, training facilities, equipment and exposure trips for the teams.
- The Odisha government's sponsorship proved to be a game-changer for Indian hockey, as the teams achieved remarkable results in the international arena.
 - The men's team won the bronze medal at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics, ending a 41-year drought for an Olympic medal in hockey.
 - The women's team also made history by reaching the semifinals for the first time at the Olympics.

World Chess Armageddon Asia & Oceania event

News

• In the final of the World Chess Armageddon Asia & Oceania event, Indian Grandmaster D. Gukesh defeated former world rapid champion Nodirbek Abdusattorov of Uzbekistan and clinched the title.



Details

- The 16-year-old Gukesh showed great resilience and skill in overcoming his formidable opponent in a tense match.
- The World Chess Armageddon is a unique tournament that features a series of blitz games and, if needed, an Armageddon game to decide the winner. An Armageddon game is a special type of chess game where White has five minutes and Black has four minutes on the clock, but a draw counts as a win for Black.

Men's Under-17 FIFA World Cup

<u>News</u>

• The FIFA Council announced that Peru will no longer host the 2023 men's Under-17 World Cup due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the lack of guarantees from the local authorities.

Details

- The decision was made after a thorough assessment of the situation and consultations with the Peruvian Football Federation.
- FIFA said it will open a new bidding process to select a new host country for the tournament, which is scheduled to take place from October 6 to 28.
- The FIFA Council also confirmed that Peru will have the priority to host the 2025 edition of the same competition, subject to the provision of all necessary guarantees.

Kim Cotton

News

• New Zealand's Kim Cotton has made history by becoming the first woman to officiate as an onfield umpire in a full-member men's international cricket match.

Details

- She was one of the two umpires who oversaw the second Twenty20 International between New Zealand and Bangladesh at Napier, New Zealand.
- Cotton, who has been umpiring since 2015, has previously officiated in women's internationals and men's domestic matches.
- She said she was honoured and excited to get the opportunity to umpire at the highest level of men's cricket.

Honorary Life Membership of MCC

News

• Five eminent Indian cricketers have been awarded the Honorary Life Membership of the Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), the oldest and most prestigious cricket club in the world.

Details

- They are MS Dhoni, Yuvraj Singh, Mithali Raj, Suresh Raina and Jhulan Goswami.
- The MCC was founded in 1787 and is based at Lord's Cricket Ground in London, which it owns. The club is also the guardian of the Laws of Cricket and has a global influence on the game.
- The Honorary Life Membership is conferred upon individuals who have made significant contributions to cricket or MCC.
- Earlier Indian cricketers to join the list of Honorary Life Members include Sachin Tendulkar, Rahul Dravid, Sourav Ganguly and Anil Kumble.

Asian Wrestling Championship

<u>News</u>

• The Asian Wrestling Championships in Astana, Kazakhstan saw a remarkable performance by Indian women wrestlers who clinched seven medals in total.



- They won four gold, one silver and two bronze medals across different weight categories and displayed their skills and strength on the mat.
- This was the best result for Indian women wrestlers at the continental event and a sign of their growing dominance in the sport.

FIFA rankings

<u>News</u>

• The Indian men's football team climbed up to the 101st spot in the most recent ranking published by FIFA, the global authority of football.

- This is the highest position that India has attained in the last two decades, and it reflects the team's consistent performance in the international tournaments.
- The Indian team has won 11 of its last 13 matches, including a historic victory over China in October 2022.
- The team's coach, Igor Stimac, expressed his satisfaction with the progress and hoped to qualify for the 2026 World Cup.

Asian King Vulture

<u>News</u>

• The world's first conservation and breeding centre for the Asian king vulture was inaugurated in the Maharajganj district of Uttar Pradesh, India.

Details

- The Asian king vulture, also known as the red-headed vulture, that inhabits the Indian subcontinent and some parts of Southeast Asia.
- It has a distinctive appearance with a deep-red to orange naked head and a black body with a pale grey band on the wings.
- It plays an important role in the ecosystem by scavenging on animal carcasses.
- North's first Asian King Vulture Conservation and Breeding Center to be inaugurated in Uttar Pradesh
- It is listed as critically endangered by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) due to rapid population decline caused by habitat loss, poisoning, and human disturbance.


Gandhisagar Sanctuary

<u>News</u>

- Madhya Pradesh, also known as the "Cheetah State" of India, has announced its plans to develop Gandhisagar Sanctuary as a second habitat for cheetahs.
- The decision was taken by Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan after experts suggested that Kuno National Park (KNP), where 18 cheetahs were translocated from Africa last year, does not have enough space for these felines.

Details

- The state already hosts cheetahs in Kuno National Park, which were part of the first batch of eight cheetahs brought from Namibia in September 2022 under the 'Action Plan for Introduction of Cheetah in India'.
 - The project aims to restore the wild population of the big cat that was declared extinct in India in 1952.



• The sanctuary is expected to receive a batch of cheetahs from South Africa by the end of this year.



Mangrove Pitta Birds

News

• In a first-ever census of mangrove pitta birds carried out in two coastal districts of Odisha, 179 such birds were sighted.

Mangrove pitta birds

- They are colourful and elusive bird that lives in the coastal mangrove forests of eastern India and Southeast Asia.
- They are considered to be near threatened by the IUCN due to habitat loss, degradation and fragmentation.
- They are vulnerable to hunting, trapping and predation by feral cats and dogs.

Aravalli Green Wall Project

<u>News</u>

• The Aravalli Green Wall Project was launched by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, in collaboration with several state governments, NGOs, research institutions and local communities.

Details

- It is an ambitious initiative to restore the degraded ecosystems of the Aravalli mountain range in India.
- The project aims to create a continuous belt of native vegetation along the 1,600 km long range, which stretches across four states: Gujarat, Rajasthan, Haryana and Delhi.
- The project is inspired by the Great Green Wall of Africa, which seeks to combat desertification and climate change by planting trees across the Sahel region.

Cyclone Ilsa

<u>News</u>

• A powerful "Cyclone Ilsa" with winds of up to 230 km/h, made landfall in Western Australia near Port Hedland, causing widespread damage and flooding.

Details

- The cyclone caused major disruption to the mining and shipping industries. Port Hedland, the world's largest iron ore export hub, was closed for several hours as a precaution, but no significant damage was reported to the port facilities.
 - Many homes and buildings were damaged or destroyed

- A cyclone is a large-scale atmospheric system characterized by low pressure and strong winds that rotate around a centre. Cyclones can form over land or water and can have different names depending on their location and intensity.
- Cyclones can also influence global atmospheric circulation and ocean currents, as they transport heat and moisture from one region to another.
- Cyclones are driven by various factors, such as temperature gradients, pressure gradients, Coriolis force, and latent heat release.

International Big Cats Alliance

<u>News</u>

• India has recently announced the launch of the International Big Cats Alliance (IBCA), a global initiative to conserve and protect the world's endangered wild cats.

Details

- The IBCA aims to bring together countries, organizations, experts, and communities that share a common vision of saving these majestic animals from extinction.
- The IBCA will focus on four key areas: habitat conservation, anti-poaching efforts, humanwildlife conflict mitigation, and awareness and education.
- The alliance will also support scientific research and innovation to improve the monitoring and management of big cat populations and ecosystems.
- The IBCA is inspired by India's success in increasing its tiger population by more than 30% in the last decade, as well as its efforts to conserve other big cats such as lions, leopards, and snow leopards.

Water Budget

<u>News</u>

• Kerala becomes the first Indian state to adopt a Water Budget to tackle summer water shortage.

- Kerala has taken a pioneering step in addressing the problem of water scarcity during the summer season by introducing a Water Budget for the state.
- The Water Budget is a comprehensive plan that estimates the availability and demand of water in different sectors and regions and proposes measures to ensure optimal and equitable use of the precious resource.
- It aims to promote water conservation, rainwater harvesting, groundwater recharge, and sustainable management of water resources.
- Kerala is the first state in India to adopt such a budget, which is expected to help the state cope with the challenges of climate change, population growth, and urbanization that affect its water security

Details

- Wing Commander Misra was honoured for her bravery and skill in rescuing 12 people from a flood-hit village in Uttarakhand in July 2022.
 - She was the captain of a Mi-17 V5 helicopter that was tasked with airlifting the stranded villagers from a narrow valley.
 - Despite poor visibility, strong winds and hostile terrain, she managed to land the helicopter on a small patch of land and evacuate the villagers safely.
- Wing Commander Misra joined the IAF in 2011 as a helicopter pilot. She has flown over 1500 hours in various operational roles, including disaster relief, casualty evacuation, counter-insurgency and anti-naxal operations.
- She is also a qualified flying instructor and has trained many young pilots.
