WEST BENGAL

Sarasari Mukhyamantri

- Mamata Banerjee, the chief minister of West Bengal, has launched a new initiative called "Sarasari Mukhyamantri" (Direct to CM).
- This initiative **aims to provide a platform for the citizens of West Bengal to directly voice their grievances and suggestions** to her through a dedicated helpline number.
- The number, 9137091370, will be functional from Monday to Saturday, between 10 am and 6 pm.
- CM said that this initiative is part of her commitment to serve the people with transparency and accountability, and she will personally monitor the feedback received from the helpline and take necessary actions.

IFA Women's Shield

- East Bengal women's team emerged victorious in the first edition of the IFA Women's Shield, a prestigious women's football cup tournament organized by the Indian Football Association in West Bengal.
- The team defeated Sreebhumi FC 5-0 in the final match, which was held at the Tehatta ground in Nadia district.
- Tulsi Hembram, the star striker of East Bengal was named the Player of the Tournament. She scored 15 goals in four matches.

Centre sanctioned Rs 2,000 crore to Bengal under the mid-day meal scheme

- The Centre has allocated Rs 2,000 crore to Bengal for the implementation of this scheme in the financial year 2023-24. This is a significant increase from the previous year's allocation of Rs 1,500 crore.
- The Centre hopes that this enhanced funding will help Bengal to achieve universal coverage of the scheme and ensure quality and hygiene standards in the food served to the children.
- The mid-day meal scheme in schools is a flagship programme of the Government of India that aims to provide nutritious food to children and improve their health and learning outcomes.
- The scheme was started in 1995 during 8th Five Year Plan all over India. In 2021 it was renamed as PM-POSHAN.

Swasthya Sathi Scheme

- The state government announced the rates for two types of cancer treatment procedures under this scheme: radiation therapy and nuclear medicine therapy. This decision came after the government tried to prevent the overuse of chemotherapy drugs by regulating their supply and distribution.
- The Swasthya Sathi scheme is a health insurance initiative by the West Bengal government that covers up to Rs 5 lakh per year per family for secondary and tertiary care treatment.





NATIONAL

Dimasa rebel group have signed a peace pact with the Centre and the Assam government

- In a historic development, the Dimasa rebel group, which has been fighting for a separate homeland for the Dimasa tribe in Assam, has signed a peace pact with the Centre and the Assam government.
- The peace pact provides for political, economic and cultural rights for the Dimasa people, as well as rehabilitation and surrender of arms by the rebels.
- The pact also envisages the creation of a Dimasa Development Council within Assam to address the developmental needs of the region.

Muhammad Iqbal

- He is widely known as Allama Iqbal, which means a very learned person. He was knighted by the British government in 1922 for his services to literature.
- He also **composed patriotic songs**, **such as Sare Jahan se Accha** (Better than the whole world) and Tarana-e-Milli (The Anthem of the Community), which inspired millions of people.
- Iqbal is regarded as the spiritual father of Pakistan, as he was the first one to propose the idea of a separate state for the Muslims in his presidential address at the Allahabad session of the Muslim League in 1930. He died in Lahore in 1938, nine years before the creation of Pakistan.

Thrissur Pooram

- The 36-hour-long Festivities of the famous Thrissur Pooram concluded on May 1.
- It is a famous Hindu festival **celebrated annually in Kerala**. It is held at the Vadakkunnathan Temple in Thrissur city every year.
- The festival is known for its spectacular display of fireworks, caparisoned elephants, traditional music and cultural performances.
- It is considered one of the most colourful and vibrant festivals in the world.

Mana village in Uttarakhand

- Mana village in Uttarakhand was earlier known as the last Indian village, but now it is **known as the first Indian village**.
- This change of status is due to the installation of a signboard by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) at the entrance of the village, which lies near the Indo-China border.
- The signboard welcomes visitors to Mana, the first Indian village, and showcases its rich cultural and natural heritage.

"Swagat Saptah" in Gujarat

- The "State Wide Attention on Grievances by Application of Technology" (SWAGAT) initiative is a unique platform that enables citizens of Gujarat to directly communicate with the Chief Minister and seek redressal of their grievances.
- The initiative was launched by Narendra Modi in 2003, when he was the Chief Minister of Gujarat, to make governance more responsive, transparent and accountable.
- SWAGAT has completed 20 years of successful implementation. To mark this occasion, the current Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel has declared the last week of April as "Swagat Saptah", a week-long celebration of the initiative.

Zero Shadow Day

- Bengaluru, the city that leads India in innovation and technology, will soon experience a rare astronomical phenomenon called "Zero Shadow Day," as announced by the Astronomical Society of India (ASI).
- This day is marked when the Sun will be exactly overhead and objects on the ground will not cast any shadow.



Millets Experience Centre

- India's Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar inaugurated the Millets Experience Centre (MEC) at Dilli Haat in New Delhi.
- The MEC is a joint initiative of the Ministry of Agriculture and the National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd (NAFED) to encourage the consumption of millet among the masses.
- The MEC showcases various types of millet and their products and provides information on their nutritional and environmental benefits.

Dotted Lands

- The Andhra Pradesh government has initiated a massive land survey to free up about 2 lakh acres of 'dotted lands' that have been encroached upon by various parties over the years.
- Dotted lands were marked with dots on the revenue maps by the British colonial administration, and were subject to various restrictions and regulations that prevented the farmers from freely selling or mortgaging them.

Centre for Policy Research

- According to a source from the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), the Centre for Policy Research (CPR), a Delhi-based think tank, has been temporarily barred from receiving foreign funds for 180 days.
- The MHA has suspended the CPR's Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act (FCRA) registration for allegedly violating some provisions of the law.

Article 142

- The Supreme Court of India has used its power under Article 142 of the Indian Constitution to recognise the right to divorce on the grounds of "irretrievable breakdown of marriage".
 - This means that couples who have no hope of reconciling their differences can seek the dissolution of their marriage without having to prove any fault or cruelty.
- The **court has exercised its power under Article 142 to do "complete justice"** in such cases, where the existing laws do not provide adequate relief.

CU-Chayan Portal

- University Grant Commission (UGC) Chairman M Jagadesh Kumar inaugurated CU-Chayan, a new recruitment portal for Central University faculty.
- The portal was developed to make the recruitment process more transparent, efficient and convenient for all the stakeholders involved.
- The portal would provide various features such as online application, document verification, interview scheduling and feedback mechanism for the applicants and the selection committee members.

Geetha Karmikula Bhima

- A new **insurance scheme for toddy tappers has been launched by the Telangana** government under the name of 'Geetha Karmikula Bhima.'
- The scheme is designed to provide financial support to the families of toddy tappers who lose their lives due to accidents while collecting toddy from palm trees in the fields.
- The scheme is modelled after the 'Rythu Bhima' program for farmers and aims to provide financial support to the families of toddy tappers who lose their lives in accidents while harvesting toddy from palm trees in the fields.

Indira Gandhi Mahila Samman Nidhi

- The **Himachal Pradesh** Cabinet, under the leadership of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, has announced a **monthly incentive of Rs 1,500 for women in the Spiti Valley**.
 - The Spiti Valley is a cold desert mountain valley located high in the Himalayas in the northeastern part of Himachal Pradesh. The name "Spiti" means "The middle land", i.e. the land between Tibet and India.
- The incentive will be provided to all eligible women, including Buddhist nuns, above the age of 18 years. This initiative is called the Indira Gandhi Mahila Samman Nidhi.



Ramaland

- To attract more tourists and showcase the rich cultural heritage of Ayodhya, the Uttar Pradesh government is planning to develop a theme park 'Ramaland' modelled on Disneyland.
- The theme park will narrate the story of Lord Ram through various attractions, such as a replica of his palace, a 3D theatre, a musical fountain, and a Ramayana museum.
- The project aims to boost the economy and employment opportunities in the region, as well as to promote Ayodhya as a global tourism hotspot.

"Mo Ghara" Scheme

- The government of **Odisha has announced a new scheme called 'Mo Ghara'**, which aims to provide housing assistance to the rural population under the Panchayati Raj & Drinking Water Department.
- The scheme will benefit eligible households who do not have a pucca house or who live in dilapidated houses.
- The scheme aims to cover all such families who were left out of the existing housing schemes due to stringent eligibility criteria or insufficient allocation and also those who had received housing assistance of smaller amounts in the past and now want to upgrade or expand their houses.

8th Governing Council Meeting of Niti Aayog

- Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi recently presided over the 8th Governing Council Meeting of Niti Aayog, held at the New Convention Centre in New Delhi.
- The theme of the Governing Council meeting is "Viksit Bharat @2047: Role of Team India".
- The meeting saw the participation of Chief Ministers and Lieutenant Governors representing 19 states and 6 union territories.
- In his address, Prime Minister Modi underscored the importance of collaborative efforts between the central government, states, and union territories to realize the aspirations of the people and transform India into a developed nation by 2047.

Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL)

- The Mumbai Trans Harbour Link, also known as the Sewri–Nhava Sheva Trans Harbour Link, is an under-construction 21.8 km 6-lane access-controlled expressway grade road bridge.
- It will connect Mumbai with Navi Mumbai, its satellite city. The road will be linked to the Mumbai–Pune Expressway in the east and the under-construction Coastal Road in the west.
- The Mumbai Trans Harbour Link will be the **longest sea bridge in the country** with a total stretch of 16.5 km above the sea.

Conference on Universal Holistic Health

- The Thematic Conference on Universal Holistic Health, held in Bangaram Island, Lakshadweep, kicked off with the opening session of Science 20.
- The speakers highlighted the importance of recognizing and honouring the diverse cultural perspectives and practices that contribute to universal holistic health. They also discussed the challenges and opportunities for integrating scientific knowledge and holistic wisdom in addressing the health needs of the global community.

'Harit Sagar' Green Port Guidelines 2023

- The Ministry of Ports, Shipping & Waterways has launched the 'Harit Sagar' Green Port Guidelines 2023 to achieve its vision of zero carbon emissions.
- The guidelines provide a comprehensive framework for the major ports to create a comprehensive action plan aimed at achieving quantifiable reductions in carbon emissions over defined timelines.
- The guidelines also cover aspects of the National Green Hydrogen Mission about ports, development of green hydrogen facilities, LNG bunkering, offshore wind energy etc. and provide provisions for adopting global Green Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards.

Hare Krishna Heritage Tower

- Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao laid the foundation for the Hare Krishna Heritage Tower.
- The tower, which will be a landmark of cultural and spiritual significance, is being constructed by the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) with the support of the state government.

State Robotics Framework

- The State Robotics Framework is a policy initiative launched by the Telangana government in May 2023.
- It aims to create a self-sustaining robotics ecosystem and position the state as a leader in robotics in India.
- The framework focuses on key domains such as agriculture, healthcare, industrial automation, and consumer robotics, where robotics technology can have a significant impact.

SAKSHAM

- SAKSHAM (Stimulating Advanced Knowledge for Sustainable Health Management) is a Learning Management Information System (LMIS) developed by the National Institute of Health & Family Welfare (NIHFW) for the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW).
- It is a digital platform that aims to stimulate advanced knowledge for sustainable health management among health professionals and administrators.

Kapileshwar Temple

- The Kapileshwar Temple is a historic Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva in Bhubaneswar, Odisha.
- The temple has a 62-foot-high shrine with a circular yonipitha and a Siva-lingam at its centre. The temple also has a pond surrounded by stone steps, which is known as the Manikarnika tank.
- The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is planning to bring the Kapileshwar Temple under its ambit and declare it a 'Monument of National Importance.'

Space Science and Technology Awareness Training (START)

- START is a new online training programme launched by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) for students of physical sciences and technology.
- The programme is aimed at post-graduate and final-year undergraduate students who are interested in pursuing a career in space science and technology.
- START will cover various topics related to space science and technology, such as satellite communication, remote sensing, navigation, space exploration, and space applications.

Union Law Minister

- Kiren Rijiju has stepped down from his position as Union Law Minister and will now assume the role of Minister of Earth Sciences.
- He was replaced by Arjun Ram Meghwal, who has been given the independent charge as Minister of State in the Ministry of Law and Justice.

Bhopal

- Bhopal, the capital of Madhya Pradesh, has taken a lead role in India's efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- The city has implemented a Voluntary Local Review (VLR) process, which is a method that enables cities to evaluate their performance on the SDGs and identify gaps and opportunities for improvement.

Homeocon 2023

- The National Homoeopathic Convention 'Homeocon 2023' was inaugurated by Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami at Doon University, Dehradun.
- The convention was a platform to highlight the importance of homoeopathy as a widely practised system of medicine across the world.



India's New Parliament House

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the new Parliament building on 28 May, showcasing its exquisite artwork and featuring a ceremonial sceptre called 'Sengol' among its many highlights.
- The new Parliament House features a unique triangular shape, ensuring efficient space utilization within the complex. This design allows for maximum functionality and accommodates larger legislative chambers.
- The Lok Sabha, based on India's national bird, the peacock, will have an expanded seating capacity. With 888 seats, it will accommodate nearly three times the current capacity. The Lok Sabha hall will also be able to accommodate 1,272 seats for joint sessions.
- The Rajya Sabha, inspired by the national flower, the lotus, will have 348 seats.
- A notable addition to the new Parliament House is the Constitutional Hall, located in the centre of the complex. This hall will serve as a significant space within the building.

8th-century idol with an inscription of Lord Buddha unearthed at Rameswar temple in Puri

- A recent discovery at Rameswar temple in the Puri district of Odisha has shed new light on the history of Buddhism in India.
- An 8th-century idol of Lord Buddha with an inscription in Pali language was unearthed by the temple priest, who noticed something written on its back.
- The idol is a broken part of the temple, which belongs to the Eastern Ganga dynasty period.
- The inscription praises Lord Buddha and his teachings and is a rare example of such a message on a small idol.

National Academy of Coastal Policing

- The Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah recently laid the foundation stone for the permanent campus of the National Academy of Coastal Policing in Dwaraka, Gujarat.
- The academy, which is the first of its kind in the country, will train police personnel from various states and union territories in coastal security, maritime law enforcement, and disaster management.
- The academy will also collaborate with national and international agencies to share best practices and expertise in coastal policing.

Centre of Excellence on Sustainable Land Management

- The Union Minister Bhupender Yadav inaugurated the Centre of Excellence on Sustainable Land Management (CoE-SLM) at the Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) in Dehradun.
- The CoE-SLM aims to provide scientific and technical support to the government and other stakeholders on various aspects of land degradation and restoration.
- The centre will also conduct research and training on best practices and innovative solutions for sustainable land management.

₹75 coins

- The Ministry of Finance has announced the launch of a special ₹75 coin to commemorate the inauguration of India's new parliament building.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled the coin on Sunday, 28 May, coinciding with the celebration of India's 75 years of independence.

"Meri LiFE, Mera Swachh Shehar" campaign

- The "Meri LiFE, Mera Swachh Shehar" campaign, launched by Union Minister Shri Hardeep S. Puri on 15th May 2023, to transform waste into wealth, a nationwide campaign encourages cities to establish Reduce, Reuse, Recycle (RRR) Centres.
- According to the Ministry, the RRR Centres are one-stop collection centres for citizens to contribute clothes, shoes, old books, toys and used plastic to be reused or recycled.
- The campaign also promotes Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment), which aims to protect and preserve the environment by adopting sustainable daily habits.



NEP SAARTHI

- To facilitate the smooth transition to the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a new initiative called 'NEP SAARTHI – Student Ambassador for Academic Reforms in Transforming Higher Education in India'.
- This program aims to engage students as active participants in the reform process and to empower them to voice their opinions and suggestions on various aspects of the NEP 2020.

West Bengal has the highest number of missing women cases in India

- According to the latest data from the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), West Bengal has the highest number of missing women cases in India, with 40, 719 cases registered till 2021.
- National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB)
 - It is an Indian government agency that collects and analyzes crime data as defined by the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Special and Local Laws (SLL).
 - It was established in 1986 to function as a repository of information on crime and criminals, and to assist the investigators in linking crime to the perpetrators.
 - It also monitors coordinates and implements the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems (CCTNS) project, which connects more than 15,000 police stations and 6,000 higher offices of police in the country.
 - It publishes an annual report called 'Crime in India', which contains comprehensive information on various aspects of crime in the country, such as cases registered and their disposal, persons arrested and their disposal, crime against vulnerable sections of society, cyber crimes, human trafficking, economic crimes, etc.

Sinthan Snow Festival 2023 organized in J&K

- The Sinthan Snow Festival-2023, a two-day event celebrating snow and winter activities, was organized by the Directorate of Tourism, Jammu and KTDA at Sinthan Maidan, Kishtwar, J&K.
- The festival was organized in collaboration with the District Administration Kishtwar, the JKAACL, and the Army.

Punjab becomes first state to enforce 'right to walk'

- Punjab has become the first state in India to implement the 'right to walk' by making it mandatory for all road-owning agencies, including the NHAI, to provide footpaths and cycle tracks in all future expansions of roads and construction.
- The state government has issued these directions following two court orders after PILs were filed at Punjab and Haryana High Court and another at the Supreme Court. The courts have sought the action taken reports on the safety of pedestrians and cyclists.

Kerala becomes the first state to have Drone Surveillance in all police districts

- Kerala has become the first state in the country to have a drone surveillance system in all police districts in the state.
- Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan distributed the drones to all police districts and the drone pilot licences to specially trained drone pilots.





INTERNATIONAL

The Report titled 'Born too Soon: Decade of Action on Pre-term Birth'

- The report, released **by the World Health Organization (WHO)** and other partners, highlights the global burden of pre-term birth and the urgent need for action to prevent and care for pre-term babies.
- Pre-term birth is defined as a baby born alive before 37 weeks of pregnancy is completed. According to the report, an estimated 15 million babies are born pre-term every year, and this number is rising.
- The report reveals that India had 3.5 million pre-term births in 2019, the second highest after China (4.1 million).
- The report also shows that India has made some progress in reducing pre-term birth rates over the past decade, from 13.4% in 2010 to 12.3% in 2019. However, this rate is still higher than the global average of 10.6%, and much higher than the Sustainable Development Goal target of 8.6% by 2030.

India and the UK have signed an MOU for collaboration on science and innovation

- A new agreement has been reached between India and the United Kingdom to foster cooperation on science and innovation.
- The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlines the areas of mutual interest and the mechanisms for joint activities and funding.
- The MOU aims to enhance the bilateral partnership and support the development of scientific and technological solutions for global challenges.

World Press Freedom Index 2023

- The 2023 World Press Freedom Index, published by the international non-governmental organization Reporters Without Borders (RSF), reveals a worrying decline in the state of media freedom in India.
- India has fallen to the 161st position out of 180 countries ranked in the index, down from 142nd in 2020 and 140th in 2019.
- The report cites various factors for this deterioration, such as increased violence against journalists, legal harassment, online trolling, censorship and self-censorship.
- Nordic countries like Norway, Ireland, and Denmark ranked top three respectively while Vietnam, China, and North Korea were the bottom three countries on the index.

International Civil Aviation Organisation

- India has announced that it will participate in the International Civil Aviation Organisation's (ICAO) Carbon Offsetting and Reduction Scheme for International Aviation (CORSIA) and the Long-Term Aspirational Goals (LTAG) from 2027.
- CORSIA is a scheme that aims to stabilize net CO2 emissions from international flights at 2020 levels by requiring airlines to offset their excess emissions with carbon credits from the carbon market.

India and Israel have signed MoU on industrial research and development cooperation

- The Ministry of Science & Technology of India announced that it has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Defense of Israel on Industrial Research and Development Cooperation.
- The MoU covers several key technology areas, such as AI, quantum, semiconductors, healthcare, aerospace, sustainable energy and agriculture.
- The MoU was signed by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) of India and the Directorate of Defense Research and Development (DDR&D) of Israel in the presence of Union Minister for Science & Technology, Dr Jitendra Singh.



G20 TechSprint 2023

- The G20 TechSprint 2023 is a global initiative launched by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) to foster innovation and collaboration in the field of cross-border payments.
- The competition, which was announced on May 4, invites global innovators to submit their technology solutions that can enhance the efficiency, speed, security and inclusiveness of cross-border payments.

Shanghai Cooperation Organisation

- A high-level diplomatic gathering was held in Goa on May 4 and 5, involving the foreign ministers of eight countries that belong to the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO).
- The purpose of this meeting is to prepare for the SCO Leaders' Summit, which will be hosted by India in New Delhi in July.

Russia celebrated Victory Day

- On May 9th, Russia celebrated the 78th anniversary of its Victory Day with a military parade on Red Square in Moscow.
- The event honoured the historic triumph of the Soviet Union over Nazi Germany in 1945, which ended World War II in Europe and is known in Russia as the Great Patriotic War.
- The parade featured more than 12,000 troops and 190 pieces of hardware, including tanks, missiles and aircraft.

'Machines Can See 2023' Summit

- The 'Machines Can See 2023' Summit is a prestigious event that showcases the latest developments and innovations in Artificial Intelligence (AI).
- Organized by the UAE government, the summit brings together experts, researchers, policymakers and industry leaders from around the world to discuss and exchange ideas on how AI can benefit humanity and society.
- The summit is held at the Museum of the Future in Dubai, a unique venue that exhibits futuristic concepts and technologies that aim to shape the future.
- The summit covers various topics related to AI, such as computer vision, natural language processing, machine learning, robotics, ethics and governance.

India became the main source of refined fuels for Europe

- According to Kpler data, India has overtaken Saudi Arabia as the main source of refined fuels for Europe.
- This shift is due to Europe's limited access to Russian oil and its increasing reliance on Indian crude oil products.

Arab League

- The Arab League has welcomed Syria back into its fold after more than 10 years of suspension.
- The decision was made in recognition of the Syrian government's efforts to restore stability and security in the country, which has been ravaged by a civil war since 2011. The war began when the Assad regime violently suppressed peaceful protests demanding political reforms and human rights.
- The Arab League has 22 member states. It was founded in Cairo, Egypt in 1945.

42nd ASEAN Summit

- Indonesia is hosting the 42nd ASEAN Summit with a theme of "ASEAN Affairs: Epicenter of Growth."
- The summit brings together the leaders of the 10-member bloc to discuss their vision and strategies for global development.
- The summit showcases the bloc's ambition and potential to be the centre and catalyst of growth in the world.

Petersberg Climate Dialogue

• The event was **co-hosted by Germany and the United Arab Emirates**, and attended by delegates from 40 countries, as well as UN officials and civil society representatives.



CURRENT AFFAIRS FOR WBCS: APRIL 2023

- The main topics of discussion included climate adaptation, climate finance, loss and damage, and the first-ever global stocktake of the progress made towards the Paris Agreement goals.
- The Petersberg Climate Dialogue was initiated in 2010 by former German Chancellor Angela Merkel after the disappointing outcome of COP15 in Copenhagen. Since then, it has become a regular platform for high-level political dialogue on climate action ahead of the UN Climate Conferences.

Global Road Safety Week

- Every year in May, the UN organizes a Global Road Safety Week to draw attention to the issue of road safety and how it can be improved.
- This year, the 7th edition of the event will take place from 15-21 May, with a focus on sustainable transport.
- The aim is to encourage governments to promote walking, cycling and public transport as safe, healthy and environmentally friendly modes of mobility.
- The campaign invites everyone to #RethinkMobility and joins the movement for safer and greener transport.

World's oldest tree

- The world's **oldest tree may be a Patagonian cypress that grows in Chile**. According to a recent study, this tree is estimated to be 5,000 years old and has witnessed the rise and fall of many civilizations.
- The Patagonian cypress is also the largest tree species in South America, reaching up to 70 meters in height and 5 meters in diameter. It has a thick, fibrous bark that helps it survive wildfires and volcanic eruptions.

Ireland

- Ireland is on track to become the first country to enforce mandatory health advisories on alcohol products. The new legislation, which is expected to come into effect by the end of this year, will require all alcoholic beverages sold in the country to display warning labels about the risks of alcohol consumption, such as cancer, liver disease and mental health problems.
- The law aims to raise awareness among consumers about the harmful effects of alcohol and to encourage them to drink responsibly and moderately.

India announced credit for Sri Lanka

- India has announced that it will extend its credit line of USD 1 billion to Sri Lanka for another year, in a move that reflects the strong bilateral ties between the two countries.
- The credit line, which was due to expire in June 2023, will now be valid until June 2024. The extension will enable Sri Lanka to access funds for various development projects, such as infrastructure, energy, and health. I

Hindi Language

- The University of Edinburgh and the Indian consulate in the UK have launched a new initiative to promote Hindi language learning.
- The course will be available online for free and aims to provide learners with basic skills in reading, writing and speaking Hindi.
- The course also covers aspects of Indian culture and society, such as festivals, cuisine and literature. The course is designed for beginners who have no prior knowledge of Hindi or Devanagari script.
- Hindi day celebrated on 10th January.
- National Hindi day marked on 14th September.
- 1st Indian to address UNGA meeting in Hindi was AB Vajpayee in 1977.



ECONOMICS

IRDAI asks insurance firms to lay down social media rules

- The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has issued a circular to all insurance companies, asking them to formulate and implement a policy on the use of social media platforms.
- IRDAI is an autonomous statutory body that regulates and supervises the insurance sector in India. It aims to protect the interests of policyholders, promote fair and healthy competition among insurers, and ensure the orderly growth of the insurance industry.

India's first International Multimodal Logistics Park

- The project of building **India's first International Multimodal Logistics Park in Jogighopa**, Assam, is progressing smoothly, and the jetty is likely to be finished by the end of this year.
- The park will facilitate the seamless movement of goods and services across different modes of transportation, such as road, rail, air and water.
- The park will also boost the economic development of the region and create employment opportunities for the local population.

Tamil Nadu

- According to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data, **Tamil Nadu has topped the list of States in terms of** market borrowings for the third consecutive year.
- The State raised ₹68,000 crore through State Development Loans (SDLs) in the first 11 months of FY23.

Aadhaar-enabled Payment System (AePS)

- Airtel Payments Bank has collaborated with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) to introduce face authentication for the Aadhaar-enabled Payment System (AePS) at its banking points.
- It will allow customers to access AePS services using their facial biometrics, without the need for any physical documents or PINs. The face authentication will be done through the NPCI's Aadhaar Authentication Service (AAS).

National Manufacturing Innovation Survey (NMIS) 2021-22

- The National Manufacturing Innovation Survey (NMIS) 2021-22, a joint study by the Department of Science and Technology (DST) and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), has ranked **Karnataka as the most innovative state in India**, followed by Telangana and Tamil Nadu.
- The survey assessed the innovation performance of manufacturing firms across states, sectors, and firm sizes, based on their ability to produce new products, services, and business processes.
- The survey revealed that innovation in manufacturing is the lowest in the Northeastern states (excluding Assam), followed by Bihar.

Dawki land port

- The **Dawki land port, located in Meghalaya**'s West Jaintia Hills district, was inaugurated by Union Minister Nityanand Rai on May 4, 2023.
- The land port is the first of its kind in the state and is situated along the international border between India and Bangladesh.
- The land port aims to promote trade and commerce between the two countries by facilitating the movement of goods, people, and vehicles across the border. It also simplifies border crossing procedures for passengers and tourists.

Lithium reserves

• According to sources, lithium reserves have been **discovered in Rajasthan's Degana** following the recent discovery in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi.



- Lithium is a key element in the production of batteries for electric vehicles and other devices.
- The discovery of lithium reserves in India could boost the country's efforts to reduce its dependence on fossil fuels and transition to cleaner energy sources.

World Economic Situation and Prospects Report

- The United Nations released the World Economic Situation and Prospects report, which **forecasts India's** economic growth at 6.7% in 2024.
- The report attributes this growth to India's strong domestic demand, which has shown resilience amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The report also warns that India may face challenges from higher interest rates and weaker external demand, which could affect investment and exports in 2023.

Odisha to provide free crop insurance to farmers

- The Odisha government announced that it will provide free crop insurance to all farmers in the state for the next three years.
- The Cooperation Department would bear the premium of the insurance from the 2023 Kharif season to the 2025-26 Rabi season.
- Odisha is the **first state in the country to provide free crop insurance to farmers**.
- 1st crop insurance programme was introduced in Gujarat in 1972-73

'SAMARTH' Campaign

- The Union Minister for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Shri Giriraj Singh, recently launched the 'SAMARTH Campaign on Promoting Digital Transactions in 50,000 Gram Panchayats' under the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav in Lucknow.
- The **SAMARTH Campaign will provide training and awareness to the rural population on various digital platforms and modes of payment**, such as BHIM UPI, Aadhaar Enabled Payment System (AePS), Bharat Bill Payment System (BBPS), etc.

Global Financial Innovation Network (GFIN)

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced its collaboration with the Global Financial Innovation Network (GFIN) to take part in the Greenwashing TechSprint.
- The initiative is designed to tackle the issue of greenwashing, which refers to the practice of making false or exaggerated claims about the environmental, social, and governance (ESG) performance of products or services.
- The RBI and the GFIN aim to develop innovative solutions that can enhance transparency and accountability in the ESG sector.

UTSAH Portal

- To enhance the quality of higher education in India, the **University Grants Commission (UGC) has** launched two new portals: the UTSAH Portal and the Professor of Practice (PoP) Portal.
- The UTSAH Portal aims to provide a platform for sharing best practices, innovative ideas and transformative strategies in higher education.
- The PoP Portal enables the appointment of eminent professionals from various fields as professors in universities and colleges to enrich the academic environment and foster industry-academia linkages.

"Meri LiFE" App

- A new app called "Meri LiFE" was inaugurated by Shri Bhupender Yadav, the Union Minister for Environment, Forest, and Climate Change.
- It aims to transform how people and groups monitor their achievements in the global mass movement known as Mission LiFE.

RBI transfer to Government

• The RBI has announced that it will transfer a surplus of Rs 87,416 crore to the central government for the fiscal year 2022-23.



- This decision was taken after a review of the economic and financial conditions of the country and the bank's performance.
- The surplus transfer will help the government in meeting its fiscal deficit target and boost public spending amid the pandemic.

Andhra Pradesh

- A loan agreement of \$141.12 million was recently signed by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Indian government to fund the improvement of internal infrastructure in Andhra Pradesh (AP).
- This agreement aims to enhance the quality and accessibility of essential services such as water supply, sanitation, and solid waste management in the state.

UDAN 5.1

- The Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik (UDAN) is a flagship initiative of the Ministry of Civil Aviation to provide affordable and accessible air travel to the common people of India.
- After four successful rounds of UDAN, the ministry has launched UDAN 5.1, a new version of the fifth round that is already underway.
- The main objective of UDAN 5.1 is to achieve last-mile connectivity through helicopters, especially in remote and hilly areas of the country.





DEFENCE AND SECURITY

Air Droppable Container (ADC-150)

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Navy successfully conducted the maiden test trial of an indigenously designed and developed Air Droppable Container (ADC-150) from an IL 38SD aircraft.
- The ADC-150 has a payload capacity of 150 kg and can be used to deliver critical engineering stores to ships that are deployed far away from the coast.

Indian Air Force Heritage Centre

- The Indian Air Force Heritage Centre in Chandigarh was inaugurated by India's Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on 8 May 2023.
- The centre displays various vintage aircraft, weapons, engines, simulators and artefacts that showcase the IAF's role in different wars and operations. The centre also aims to inspire and educate the visitors about the history, culture and values of the IAF.

Buland Bharat

- 'Buland Bharat' is the name of a joint training exercise that involves various forces operating at the highest and longest Artillery Ranges in the eastern region.
- The exercise showcases the coordination and synergy between the Artillery and Infantry units, as well as the Special Forces, Aviation, and CAPF, who are deployed in the West Kameng and Tawang districts of Arunachal Pradesh.

Exercise "Samudra Shakti-23"

- The INS Kavaratti, a state-of-the-art anti-submarine warfare corvette visited Batam, Indonesia to participate in the 4th India-Indonesia Bilateral exercise, Samudra Shakti-23, from May 14 to May 19, 2023.
- The ship is the last of the four Kamorta-class corvettes built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers, Kolkata, under Project 28 of the Indian Navy. The ship boasts of a high degree of indigenisation, with 90% of its content drawn from India itself.

Exercise 'Sudarshan Shakti 2023'

- The Indian Army's South Western Command, also known as Sapta Shakti Command, conducted a major exercise called 'Sudarshan Shakti 2023' along the western borders of Rajasthan and Punjab from May 22 to 25.
- The exercise aimed to transform the forces into a modern, lean, and agile fighting combination capable of leveraging new-age technologies. The exercise tested the operational plans, combat power, combat support, and logistic support capabilities of the army in a network-centric environment.

India has launched 'Operation Karuna'

- India has launched 'Operation Karuna' to assist Myanmar, which has been hit by Cyclone Mocha, a super cyclone that caused widespread damage and killed hundreds of people.
- As part of the operation, four Indian Navy ships reached Yangon with relief materials, including food, tents, medicines, generators and hygiene items. India has expressed its solidarity and friendship with the people of Myanmar in this time of crisis.



SCIENCE

GigaChat

- Sberbank, the largest bank in Russia, has developed a new technology named GigaChat to compete with ChatGPT in the artificial intelligence chatbot race.
- GigaChat aims to rival ChatGPT, a chatbot from the Microsoft-backed startup OpenAI, which was released last year and has caused a sprint in the technology sector to put AI into more users' hands.

GBMDriver

- A new computational tool called GBMDriver has been developed by researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology Madras using machine learning techniques.
- This tool can help improve the diagnosis of tumours in the brain and spinal cord that can cause cancer.
- GBMDriver uses genomic data to identify the key drivers of tumour formation and progression.

Daam Malware

- Daam is a dangerous malware that targets Android devices in India.
- According to the Indian cyber security agency CERT-IN, Daam can steal sensitive data, bypass antivirus programs, and deploy ransomware on infected devices.
- Daam can also access call recordings, contacts, cameras, passwords, screenshots, SMS, and other files on the device.
- CERT-IN has issued some recommendations to keep the devices safe from Daam, such as downloading apps only from official app stores, reviewing app details and permissions, installing Android updates and anti-virus software, avoiding untrusted links and websites, and reporting any unusual activity in bank accounts.

Shenzhou 16

- Shenzhou 16 is a Chinese spaceflight to the Tiangong space station, launched on 30 May 2023 on board a Shenzhou spacecraft.
- It carries two People's Liberation Army Astronaut Corps (PLAAC) taikonauts and a payload specialist from Beihang University.
- The mission is the eleventh crewed and sixteenth flight overall of the Shenzhou program.

AI Supercomputer 'AIRAWAT'

- India's AI Supercomputer 'AIRAWAT', which has been installed at C-DAC Pune, has been ranked 75th in the Top 500 Global Supercomputing List at the International Supercomputing Conference (ISC 2023) in Germany.
- AIRAWAT (AI Research, Analytics and Knowledge Assimilation) is an AI-based cloud computing infrastructure.

IIT-Kanpur launches cybersecurity skilling programme

- A new Cybersecurity Skilling Programme has been launched by IIT Kanpur's C3iHub, a hub for cybersecurity technology innovation. The programme is supported by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, under the NM-ICPS.
- The programme also receives assistance from two C3iHub-incubated start-ups: Threat Guardians Pvt Ltd and Worker Union Support.





5th Asian youth athletics championships in Tashkent, Uzbekistan

- In the fifth edition of the biennial Asian U18 Athletics Championships held in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, from 27 to 30 April 2023, India's Priyanshu and Rahul Sarnaliya clinched the gold and silver medals respectively in the boys' 1500m event.
- India also bagged two bronze medals; Arati in the girls' 5km walk and Mubassina Mohammed in the long jump.
- India ended the campaign with a total of 24 medals, including 6 golds, 11 silvers and 7 bronzes, behind China who topped the medal table with 15 golds.

Kurpfalz Gala athletics meet

- Jyothi Yarraji, the national record-holder in women's 100m hurdles, has made history by clinching the gold medal at the Kurpfalz Gala athletics meet in Germany.
- She clocked a season-best time of 12.84 seconds, which is also the fastest time by an Asian athlete this year. She improved her national record of 12.82 seconds, which she set in Bengaluru last October.
- Jyothi's remarkable performance has boosted her confidence for the upcoming World Athletics Championships in Oregon, USA, where she hopes to qualify for the Paris Olympics in 2024.

USATF Los Angeles Grand Prix 2023

- Indian athlete Parul Chaudhary won the bronze medal in the women's 3000m steeplechase at the USATF Los Angeles Grand Prix 2023, a World Athletics Continental Tour gold label meeting.
- Parul finished behind USA's Madie Boreman and Poland's Alicja Konieczek who took the gold and silver medals respectively.

Kelvin Kiptum

- Kelvin Kiptum, a 23-year-old Kenyan athlete, made history by winning the London Marathon with the second-fastest time ever recorded for the 42-kilometre race.
- However, moments after crossing the finish line, he collapsed to the ground and was rushed to a nearby hospital for medical attention.

World's 10 Highest-Paid Athletes 2023 by Forbes

- In the year 2023, the global sports industry is dominated by three international soccer stars who earn more than any other athletes in the world.
- Cristiano Ronaldo, Lionel Messi and Kylian Mbappe are the top three highest-paid athletes, according to Forbes.
- Ronaldo, who plays for Manchester United, tops the list with \$136 million in total earnings.

Azerbaijan Grand Prix

• In a thrilling race at Baku, Sergio Perez secured his second victory of the 2023 Formula 1 season, beating Max Verstappen by a narrow margin.

Badminton Asia Championships

- Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty created history by becoming the first Indian men's doubles pair to clinch a gold medal at the Badminton Asia Championships.
- The Indian duo edged past the Malaysian pair of Ong Yew Sin and Teo Ee Yi in a nail-biting three-game encounter that lasted for more than an hour.



Golden Globe Race

• After more than seven months at sea, Indian sailor Commander Abhilash Tomy (retd.) returned to land. He was one of the participants in the Golden Globe Race (GGR), a challenging solo non-stop yacht race around the world.

Shabnim Ismail

- Shabnim Ismail, the legendary South African speedster, has called it quits from international cricket at 34 years of age.
- Ismail, who holds the record for the most wickets by a South African woman in all three formats. Her retirement comes as a huge setback for South Africa, who were dependent on her fiery bowling in their successful run to the final of the T20 World Cup earlier this year.

Neeraj Chopra

- Neeraj Chopra, the Olympic gold medalist in javelin throw, has dominated the Doha Diamond League 2023 with a stunning 88.67 m throw in his first attempt.
- Chopra, who made history at the Tokyo Olympics 2020, has continued his impressive form in the new season and has set a high standard for his competitors.

NSC-CAVA Women's Volleyball Challenge Cup

- India has won the NSC-CAVA Women's Volleyball Challenge Cup trophy in Kathmandu, Nepal.
- The Indian team beat Kazakhstan in the final match at the National Sports Council's Covered Hall in Tripureshwor, Kathmandu.

Mark Nicholas

- The prestigious Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) has announced that Mark Nicholas, a former England cricketer and well-known commentator, will be its new president.
- Nicholas, who played for Hampshire and captained the county for 11 years, has been a popular voice in cricket broadcasting for over three decades.
- He will take over the role from Kumar Sangakkara, the former Sri Lanka captain, who became the first non-British president of the MCC in 2019.

Babar Azam

- Babar Azam, the captain of the Pakistan cricket team, has set a new record by becoming the fastest player to score 5000 runs in One Day International (ODI) cricket.
- He achieved this feat in his 97th ODI match. He surpassed the previous record held by Africa's Hashim Amla, who reached the 5000-run mark in 101 innings.

- It aims to create a coalition of countries that are committed to reducing their greenhouse gas emissions and supporting each other in achieving their climate goals.

OBITUARIES

Kaur Singh passed away

- Kaur Singh, a former Indian boxer and Asian Games gold medallist passed away at the age of 74.
- He joined the Sikh Regiment of the Indian Army. He learnt boxing there and rose to fame by becoming the Asian champion in 1980.
- He also won the heavyweight boxing gold medal at the 1982 Asian Games in New Delhi.
- He was conferred with the Arjuna Award in 1982 and Padma Shri in 1983 for his achievements in boxing.

Ranajit Guha passed away

- Ranajit Guha, a renowned historian and a pioneer of the Subaltern Studies group, passed away at the age of 100.
- He was also involved in communist politics in his youth and represented India in international forums.
- Guha was a prolific writer and editor who contributed to the field of South Asian history from a subaltern perspective. He challenged the elitist and nationalist narratives of Indian history and focused on the role of peasants, workers, tribals and other marginalized groups in shaping the society and culture of the region.

Tori Bowie passed away

- Tori was a former 100m world champion and a three-time Olympic medalist for the United States of America.
- She died at the age of 32 after a long battle with a rare form of cancer.
- She inspired millions of people around the world with her achievements and her courage.

N. Gopalakrishnan passed away

- N. Gopalakrishnan, a renowned scholar and researcher who founded the Indian Institute of Scientific Heritage (IISH) to promote the scientific and cultural heritage of India, died at the age of 68.
- He was a former scientist at the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and had authored several books and articles on various aspects of Indian science, philosophy, and culture.

Arun Gandhi passed away

- Arun Gandhi, the grandson of Mahatma Gandhi and a prominent activist himself died in Kolhapur, Maharashtra.
- He was born in 1934 in Durban to Manilal Gandhi and Sushila Mashruwala, who was also involved in the freedom struggle.
- Arun Gandhi carried on the legacy of his grandfather by advocating for peace and nonviolence.

Osama Hamad

- Her crime drama Anatomy of a Fall impressed the jury and critics alike with its gripping plot and nuanced performances.




Damodar Mauzo

Ayushman Bharat Diwas

- The Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT) celebrated its 60th Foundation Day on May 3, 2023. The institute was established in 1963 by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to promote foreign trade and provide training and research in international business.
- The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a portal called 'CU-Chayan' for faculty recruitment in central universities. The portal allows applicants to register online, upload documents, pay fees and track their application status.



CURRENT AFFAIRS FOR WBCS: APRIL 2023

- India's domestic coal production has risen by over 22 % during the last five years, according to the Ministry of Coal. The coal production increased from 567.36 million tonnes in 2016-17 to 692.95 million tonnes in 2020-21.
- Microsoft has launched a new initiative 'Aspire for Her', which is a mentorship programme for women entrepreneurs to access guidance, resources and networking opportunities from Microsoft experts and partners.
- Microsoft has launched a new initiative 'Highway to a Hundred Unicorns', which is a platform for startups to showcase their solutions, connect with investors and mentors, and scale up their businesses.
- The Telangana government has implemented an insurance scheme for toddy tappers in the state. The scheme provides a cover of Rs 5 lakh to the tappers in case of accidental death or permanent disability while tapping toddy from palm trees.
- The logo and mascot of the Khelo India University Games 2022 were launched by the Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports Anurag Thakur. The logo depicts a torch with three flames representing excellence, courage and unity, while the mascot is a lion named 'Shakti', symbolising strength, speed and agility.
- The National Manufacturing Innovation Survey 2021-22 was released by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT). The survey covers over 12,000 manufacturing enterprises across various sectors such as automobiles, textiles, pharmaceuticals, electronics and food processing.
- The 10th Landport between India and Bangladesh was inaugurated in Meghalaya, it will facilitate trade and movement of people between the two countries. The land port has facilities such as customs clearance, immigration, cargo inspection, quarantine and security.
- The 'Youth-20 Consultation Programme' conference concluded in Uttarakhand. The conference was organised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports in collaboration with the G20 Secretariat and the United Nations Volunteers India to engage the youth in the G20 agenda and priorities.
- India's first Air Force Heritage Centre was inaugurated in Chandigarh by Air Chief Marshal RKS Bhadauria. The centre is located at the Chandigarh Air Force Station and showcases the history, achievements and legacy of the Indian Air Force (IAF) through exhibits, models, photographs and audio-visual displays.
- A PM Jan Aushadhi Kendra was inaugurated at Warasiguda in Secunderabad, by Union Minister of Chemicals and Fertilizers Mansukh Mandaviya. The Kendra is a part of the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP), which aims to provide quality medicines at affordable prices to the common people.
- Japan has agreed to train 1000 Indian engineers for the bullet train project under the Japan-India Institute for Manufacturing (JIM) programme. The JIM programme is a collaboration between the governments of Japan and India to impart Japanese-style manufacturing skills and practices to Indian youth.
- Pakistan is the largest recipient of Asian Development Bank loans in Asia, with a total of \$37 billion committed since 1966. In 2021, ADB disbursed \$1.31 billion to Pakistan for various projects and programs.
- India is set to hand over a fast patrol vessel ship and a landing craft to the Maldives as part of its defence cooperation with the island nation. The ship and the craft will be used for maritime surveillance, disaster relief, and humanitarian assistance.
- Russia's Sberbank, the largest bank in the country, has launched an artificial intelligence platform called ChatGPT to compete with global giants like Google and Amazon. ChatGPT is based on the GPT-3 language model and can generate natural language responses for various tasks and domains.
- The World Press Freedom Index 2023 has ranked India at 161 out of 180 countries, a drop of two places from the previous year. The index, compiled by Reporters Without Borders, cited increased violence against journalists, censorship, and digital surveillance as reasons for India's poor performance. Norway topped the index for the fifth consecutive year.
- The foreign ministers' meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) member countries began in Goa. The meeting is expected to discuss regional security, economic cooperation, and cultural exchange among the eight member states: China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan.
- The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has launched the 'Machines Can See 2023' Summit, a global event that showcases the latest innovations and applications of computer vision and machine learning.

- Union Minister of State for Culture and Tourism Kiren Rijiju launched the trailer of the first Tagine language film 'Sangtamla'. The film depicts the culture, traditions and lifestyle of the Sangtam tribe of Nagaland through a love story set in the backdrop of World War II.
- The first Pharma Park in India will be built in Uttar Pradesh with an investment of Rs 600 crore. The park will have facilities for research and development, manufacturing, testing and packaging of various drugs and formulations.
- India has operationalized Sittwe Port in Myanmar as part of the Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project (KMMTTP). The project is a joint initiative of India and Myanmar to enhance connectivity and trade between the two countries through sea, riverine and road routes.
- Ajit Mohanty has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) of India.
- Santiago Peña, the candidate of Paraguay's ruling Colorado Party, has won the presidential election.
- Ajay Banga, an Indian-origin business leader, has been appointed as the next president of the World Bank. He will take over from David Malpass.
- PM Prasad, a senior Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer, has been selected as the next chairman and managing director of Coal India Limited (CIL), the world's largest coal producer.
- Mark Nicholas, a former England cricketer and a popular commentator, has been elected as the next president of Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), the custodian of cricket's laws and traditions.
- Wakefit, a leading online sleep solutions company, has signed Bollywood actor Ayushmann Khurrana as its brand ambassador.
- The Delhi High Court has appointed former Karnataka High Court judge P Krishna Bhat as the administrator of the Basketball Federation of India (BFI).
- Neera Tandon, an Indian-origin policy expert and former adviser to Hillary Clinton, has become the domestic policy advisor in the administration of US President Joe Biden.
- Maria Stepanova, a Russian poet and journalist, has won the prestigious Leipzig Book Prize 2023 for her novel In Memory of Memory. The Leipzig Book Prize is awarded annually to outstanding works of fiction, non-fiction and translation from German-speaking countries.
- Meera Syal, a British-Indian actor and writer, will receive a British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA) fellowship in London. The fellowship is the highest honour bestowed by BAFTA and recognises Syal's contribution to film, television and theatre.
- Three Iranian female journalists Niloufar Hamedi, Elaheh Mohammadi, and Narges Mohammadi have won the top UN prize for their courage and professionalism in reporting human rights violations in Iran. The prize honours journalists who risk their lives to defend press freedom.
- The maiden ASEAN-India Maritime Exercise (AIMEX) started in Singapore. The exercise involves naval ships and aircraft from India and nine ASEAN countries: Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam.
- INS Magar, an amphibious warfare vessel of the Indian Navy, was decommissioned after 36 years of service in the country. The ship was commissioned in 1987 and participated in various operations such as Operation Pawan in Sri Lanka, Operation Restore Hope in Somalia and Operation Vijay in Kargil.
- Historian Ranjit Guha died at 100. He was famous for subaltern studies and colonial history.
- Telangana CM K Chandrasekhar Rao laid the foundation stone of Hare Krishna Heritage Tower in Hyderabad. It will showcase the state's culture and heritage.
- Oil Ministry panel proposed a ban on four-wheeler diesel vehicles by 2027. It will reduce air pollution and carbon emissions.
- New lithium deposits found in Rajasthan after Jammu & Kashmir. It will boost electric vehicle manufacturing in India.
- Centre for Innovation, Incubation, Research and Entrepreneurship inaugurated in Telangana by Union Minister Annapurna Devi. It will foster innovation and entrepreneurship among students and faculty.
- Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) signed MoU with Emjay Control Systems to develop electromechanical bollards. They are devices to control vehicular access to sensitive areas.
- ISRO announced an online training programme for PG and final-year UG students in space technology. It will run from June 21 to July 2, 2021.
- Border haat between India and Bangladesh was inaugurated at Bholaganj in Sylhet by Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri and Bangladesh Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi. It will facilitate trade and cultural exchange between border people.



- PM Modi inaugurated projects worth over Rs 5,500 crore in Rajasthan via video conferencing. The projects include an oil refinery, medical college and water supply project.
- UP became the first state to make digital health cards for children under 18 years. The cards will contain health records and the immunization status of children and will be linked to Aadhaar cards.
- Airtel developed an AI-based solution to tackle fraud messages by unscrupulous entities. The solution uses natural language processing and machine learning to identify and block such messages.
- India extended a \$1 billion credit line for Sri Lanka by a year. It will help Sri Lanka overcome economic challenges amid the Covid-19 pandemic. The credit line was announced by PM Modi during a virtual summit with Sri Lankan President Gotabaya Rajapaksa in September 2020.
- Health Ministry launched SAKSHAM LMIS, a digital platform for training and capacity building of health workers. The platform will provide online courses, webinars, videos and other learning resources on health care delivery.
- Telangana government introduced Robotics Framework to promote robotics education and innovation in schools and colleges. The framework will provide guidelines for setting up robotics labs, conducting workshops and competitions, and creating a network of robotics mentors and experts.
- IIT Madras and DRDO developed sensor technology for underwater communications. The technology uses piezoelectric materials that can convert mechanical vibrations into electrical signals and vice versa. The technology can enable wireless transmission of data from underwater vehicles and sensors.
- BITS Pilani developed a face mask with a sensor that can check for illness symptoms such as fever, cough and shortness of breath. The sensor can also monitor the oxygen saturation level and heart rate of the wearer. The mask can alert the wearer or health care provider if any abnormality is detected.
- MyGov and the Ministry of Culture launched 'YUVA PRATIBHA', a talent hunt programme for young artists in music, dance, drama and fine arts. The programme aims to identify and nurture the creative potential of youth and provide them with a platform to showcase their talent.
- Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma launched Ayushman Assam Scheme, a health insurance scheme that will cover 1.6 crore families in the state. The scheme will provide annual coverage of Rs 5 lakh per family for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization.


