

Goa hosts the 37th National Games

- Odisha's Victory in the 37th National Games in Goa
- Gymnast Pranati Nayak and the women's rugby squad helped Odisha win the 37th National Games in Goa.
- Pranati Nayak earned many gold medals in artistic gymnastics, while Tapan Mohanty took silver in men's gymnastics. The women's rugby team won gold after defeating Bihar in a thrilling final.
- The bronze medal went to the men's rugby team.
- Suresh Kumar Yadav won a bronze medal in the men's weightlifting.

Chandaka-Dampara Sanctuary

- The tiger population at Chandaka sanctuary on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar in Odisha has reportedly become zero. About Chandaka Sanctuary
- Spread over an area of 193.39 Sq. Km on the upland of North-Eastern Ghat of the biotic region, Chandaka- Dampara sanctuary is a treasure house of biodiversity.
- The park is known for the successful conservation of elephants which is the principal species here. It is also home to a number of threatened wild animals and birds.
- Chandaka landscape got sanctuary status in 1982 notification of the Government adjacent to temple city, Bhubaneswar popularly known as pachyderm country.

Para Asian Games Gold Medalist Pramod Bhagat

- Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today announced a cash award of Rs 2 crore for Odisha's Pramod Bhagat for his outstanding performance in the Para Asian Games.
- Bhagat has clinched gold in the para-badminton men's singles SL3 event at the ongoing Asian Para Games in Hangzhou, China.

Sarala Puraskar

- Sarala Puraskar for 2023 presented to Bhima Prusty
- Bhima Prusty awarded for his novel 'Jambuloka.'
- Sarala Puraskar includes a copper plaque and a cash reward of Rs 5 lakh.

Odia Documentary at IFFI 2023

• Film director Himansu Khatua's Odia documentary 'The Sea & Seven Villages,' is an official selection at the 54th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) 2023 in Goa.

Key Points:

- The documentary is included in the 'Non-Feature Films' category within the Indian Panorama, alongside 20 other films.
- The Sea & Seven Villages' delves into the Satabhaya region of Odisha's Kendrapada district, exploring the impact of climate change, rising sea levels, and erosion on the seven villages in the area.
- This documentary sheds light on the resilience and challenges faced by the people in confronting the relentless sea, and it has earned recognition at various international and Indian film festivals, including Lane Doc Fest in the United States and the Jagran Film Festival.

Chatar Yatra

- The Goddess Manikeswari Chatar Yatra in Kalahandi district recently finished.
- Chatar Jatra, also known as Chatar Yatra, is a traditional event in Kalahandi District, Orissa, India.
- The celebration honours Maa Manikeswari, the Kalahandi King's family goddess.
- Chhatra Jatra, Chatar Jatra, and Chatar Yatra are all ways to commemorate Vijaya Utsav with a joyful spirit and a spectacular display.
- The festival takes place during the Mahastami of the Durga puja season.
- During the event, Khonds (Adivasis of Kalahandi Districts) perform Nabakalevar (the revival of post-worship).

Asian Para Games

- Praveen Kumar and Unni Renu have won gold and bronze medals respectively in the Men's High Jump – T64 event
- The Asian Para Games, commonly known as Para Asiad, is a multi-sport tournament regulated by the Asian Paralympic Committee that's held every four years following the Asian Games for athletes with physical disabilities.
- The International Paralympic Committee (IPC) recognises the Games as the second largest multi-sport event after the Paralympic Games.
- The fourth Asian Para Games will run till October 28.

Similipal National Park

- The tiger census through camera traps inside Similipal National Park in Odisha's Mayurbhanj district will start soon.
- STR is located within the Mayurbhanj District, in the Northernmost part of Odisha.







- It is surrounded by high plateaus and hills, the highest peak being the twin peaks of Khairiburu and Meghashini (1515m above mean sea level).
- It was declared a 'Tiger Reserve' in the year 1956 and included under the national conservation programme 'Project Tiger' in 1973.
- The STR, along with a 'transitional area' of 2250 sq. km, has been included as a part of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves by UNESCO in the year 2009.
- It is the only landscape in the world that is home to melanistic tigers.

Watco project at Sikharchandi

- The Water Corporation of Odisha's (Watco) ongoing elevated water tank project at Sikharchandi hill on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar has received approval from the National Green Tribunal (NGT).
- Sikharchandi Hill is a part of the Eastern Ghat mountains, which is extremely rich in bio-diversity with varied flora and fauna, with an abundance of rare species of wild and medicinal plants.
- Junagarh block awarded for disaster management
- On the occasion of Odisha Disaster Preparedness Day 2023, held by Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA), Junagarh block in Kalahandi district took first place in disaster management and planning.

Kumar Purnima

- Kumar Purnima is a full moon day in October-November that is celebrated as the birthday of the goddess Laxmi, the deity of wealth.
- On Kumar Purnima, young ladies in Odisha undertake ancient rituals in the hope of finding good life partners.
- 'Puchi khela' is Kumar Purnima's hallmark game.
- 'Chanda chakata' is also spread among neighbors.

100 Chess Training Centres across Odisha

- Odisha's government plans to open 100 chess training centres.
- The state developed the Pro-Chess-Ta, Chess in Schools project, and efforts are underway to establish at least 100 Chess trainincenterses across Odisha.

Norman Borlaug Field Award 2023

• Dr Swati Nayak, a young Odia scientist working at the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) in New Delhi, has earned the coveted Norman Ernest Borlaug Award for Field Research and Application from the World Food Prize Foundation in Lowa City, US.

Animal Exchange Programme at the Nandankanan Zoo in Odisha

- As part of an animal exchange initiative, a male and female Cassowary bird were brought to Nandankanan Zoo on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar.
- The new guests arrived from Hyderabad after a nearly nine-year absence.
- Cassowaries are native to Australia and New Guinea.
- Because of its lethal attacks on people, this species is the most hazardous among birds.

'Baghuni,' an Odia film, is one of 20 films chosen for the 2023 NFDC Film Bazaar

• The National Film Development Corporation of India (NFDC) has selected 20 films from 11 nations for the 17th edition of the Film Bazaar, a coproduction market event held alongside the International Film Festival of India (IFFI).

Maa Peetha Danda

- During Navratri, a modest Devi shrine in Paralakhemundi, Gajapati district, is open to worshippers for only nine days a year.
- Dandakali is a part of Adishakti Maa Mahakali.
- The temple of Maa Danda Kali at Khantapada is situated near NH16 around 18 kilometers from Balasore district.
- The door of the temple opens only in Aswina month of Odia calendar every year.

A doctor from VIMSAR has opened a Rs 1 clinic for farmers in Bargarh

- A VIMSAR doctor, Burla, has established a clinic in Barikel village, Padampur subdivision, where patients can receive treatment for as little as Rs 1.
- Dr. Sankar Ramchandani is an assistant professor of medicine at VIMSAR.
- He established the 'Jay Kisan Farmers' Clinic' in a village yard near a farmland in order to give quality treatment to farmers in the Bargarh district.

The High Court has virtual branches in each of Odisha's 30 districts

• Orissa High Court virtual centres have been opened in ten more districts across the state.





- As a result, all 30 districts in the state now have Orissa HC virtual centres.
- Virtual Courts will cut litigation costs, boost efficiency, and assure swift justice.
- The Virtual Courts will hasten the adoption of technology in the country's judiciary.
- Odisha is the first state in India to establish HC virtual centres in every district.

Cabinet Approves 16 Proposals and Decides to Amend Law to Grant Raiyati Rights

- The Odisha Cabinet adopted the proposed Odisha Land Reforms Act- 1960 Amendment Bill.
- This statute grants raiyati rights to sub-tenants, raiyats, and successor-in-interests who own land in Sikkim.
- The Revenue Officer shall decide the compensation amount to be paid by sub-tenants/under-raiyats/successor-in-interests to the land owners at the rate of Rs 14, 200 only per standard acre.
- The government reserves the right to change the compensation amount at any moment.

MUKTA Scheme

- The training of Master Trainers began in Bhubaneswar as part of a capacity building initiative for the execution of the Odisha government's MUKTA project.
- Essential features of the Scheme
- The major purpose of the Mukhyamantri Karma Tatpara Abhiyan Yojana (MUKTA) is to reduce unemployment.
- It debuted in 2020.
- The scheme provides employment opportunities for migratory workers and the urban poor.
- This project would fund activities such as stormwater drainage, rainwater harvesting, green cover, improved sanitation, and the establishment of community centres.
- The State Government will support this plan from its own budget.

Irrigation programme Parbati Giri Mega Lift

- The scheme has not only improved farmers' living standards, but it has also increased productivity and agricultural yield in project regions, contributing to the state's GDP.
- About the Programme
- It debuted in 2011-12.
- The Parbati Giri Mega Lift irrigation scheme is one of the state government's main projects.

It aims to provide assured irrigation to 5.12 lakh hectares of agricultural highland areas by 2025-26 through 378 projects.

New technique for lowering carbon footprint

- To lower its carbon impact, the state administration has opted to implement a district-based energy transition strategy.
- Odisha's per capita greenhouse gas emissions are the second highest in the country, trailing only Chhattisgarh.
- It will expand at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 6%.
- Energy-intensive districts like as Keonjhar, Angul, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, and Jajpur will have district-specific energy transition plans developed.

Gaj Utsav

- Odisha Government Partners with WTI to Launch 'Gaj Utsav 'The Odisha government, in collaboration with the Wildlife Trust of India (WTI), launched the 'Gaj Utsav' campaign in Bhubaneswar as part of its elephant conservation efforts.
- The WTI's Gaj Utsav campaign aims to create awareness about preserving the future of India's National Heritage Animals while campaigning for their critical right of passage.
- Odisha has around 1900 elephants spread throughout three elephant reserves and 12 recognized elephant corridors.
- Gaj Utsav aims to promote collective action for wildlife protection among policymakers, the media, infrastructure agencies, legal professionals, and wildlife experts.

Former Orissa High Court Chief Justice S Muralidhar will practise law in the Supreme Court

- Former Orissa High Court Chief Justice Dr S Muralidhar, who just retired from service, will now practise law in the Supreme Court after the Supreme Court designated him as a senior advocate.
- A former high court judge may practise as a lawyer only in the Supreme Court or high courts where they have not served as a judge, according to Article 220 of the Constitution.
- Justice Muralidhar departed on August 7 after more than two years and seven months as the 32nd Chief Justice of the Orissa High Court.
- He also served on the high courts of Delhi, Punjab, and Haryana.





Odisha CM launches projects

• Chief Minister launched projects worth over Rs 311 crore in Cuttack and Kendrapada districts under the state government's "Ama Odisha, Nabin Odisha" programme.

About Programme

• This programme aims to spread Jagannathan culture in every village, develop every place of worship to strengthen the basic foundation of Odisha's culture and develop digital infrastructure across the state.

This will be the basic foundation for building an ambitious Odisha.

- Odisha To Recommend Inclusion Of Mundari Language In 8th Schedule Of Constitution Context
- The Odisha Cabinet decided to recommend the proposal for the inclusion of the Mundari language in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution of India.
- The 8th Schedule of the Indian Constitution is responsible for listing the authorized Indian languages of the Republic.
- The part of the constitution that deals with the official speeches in India is XVII, included in Articles 343 to 351.
- The Eighth Schedule to the Constitution consists of the following 22 languages: Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Kashmiri, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Nepali, Oriya, Punjabi, Sanskrit, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, Bodo, Santhali, Maithili and Dogri.

Odisha CM launches Mission Shakti Scooter Scheme

- Odisha CM launched 'Mission Shakti' scooter scheme
- Aim: to provide mobility support to self-help group members and strengthen women's empowerment in the State.

Mission Shakti Scooter Yojana

- A scheme aimed at providing interest subvention on bank loans up to INR 1,00,000 to beneficiaries, enabling them to purchase a scooter.
- This initiative grants affordable access to twowheelers for Mission Shakti Federation Leaders and CSS (Community Support Staff).
- It will empower them to fulfill their responsibilities more efficiently, thus increasing their effectiveness and extending their outreach within the community.

Odisha Government Will Concentrate On Mangrove Densification

- The Chief Secretary of Odisha stressed the importance of mangrove densification as an efficient natural defence against cyclones.
- Mangroves are a distinct form of coastal environment found in tropical and subtropical regions.
- They are dense forests of salt-tolerant trees and plants that flourish in intertidal zones, where land meets water.
- These ecosystems are defined by their ability to survive extreme conditions such as saline water, tidal variations, and muddy, oxygen-depleted soils.
- Mangrove plants feature unique roots, such as prop roots and pneumatophores, that help to obstruct water flow and offer support in the difficult tidal environment.

The International Convention on Millets in Odisha

- Odisha is preparing to host an International Millets Convention.
- Odisha is the only state to host such an international millet convention.
- The International Year of Millets will take place in 2023.
- The event intends to promote the importance of millets and tribal populations in Odisha.
- Millets are both climate resilient and nutritional powerhouses.

LAccMI scheme

- The chief minister will officially inaugurate the Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative (LAccMI) plan, a flagship programme of the State Government.
- LAccMI stands for Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative.
- The project aims to provide rural farmers and SHG entrepreneurs with sustainable, inexpensive, and safe mobility.
- The programme will provide a road connection between rural and distant settlements and the blocks and district headquarters.

Odisha will display Handicrafts, Tribal Culture, and Delicacies at the IITF in New Delhi

• Odisha's handcraft items, tribal culture, and delicacies will be showcased in the state's pavilion at the India International Trade Fair (IITF), which is set to begin in New Delhi.

- International Trade Fair in India
- It began in 1980.
- It has grown into a significant event for the business community.
- The India Trade Promotion Organisation, the Government of India's principal trade promotion agency, organises this top event.

App MUKTASoft

- The training of delegates from 25 urban local bodies (ULBs) on the MUKTASoft App has begun in Bhubaneswar.
- Its purpose is to carry out the Odisha government's Mukhya Mantri Karma Tatpara Abhiyan (MUKTA) initiative.
- It is the government's flagship programme.
- It takes a bottom-up, community-driven strategy to guaranteeing livelihood options for the state's vulnerable urban workforce and migrant labourers in 115 urban districts.
- The government devised and developed MUKTASoft, a web-based platform, to streamline implementation and provide prompt payment to stakeholders.
- On a trial basis, the MUKTASoft application version-1 was implemented in the municipalities of Dhenkanal and Jatani.

The Odisha government has approved an additional Rs 175 crore for Special Development Councils

- An additional Rs 175.5 crore grant for Special Development Councils (SDCs), With the increased award, the total sanctioned amount for the current fiscal year is Rs 351 crore.
- Koraput, Malkangiri, Gajapati, Mayurbhanj, Rayagada, Keonjhar, Kandhamal, Sundargarh, and Nabarangpur have SDCs established by the state government.
- The money will go towards the preservation of tribal languages, art, culture, and tradition.

SDCs (Special Development Councils)

- The goal of this effort is to maintain and promote tribal culture while also assuring economic prosperity.
- The SDCs are primarily concerned with recognising and promoting essential cultural markers of tribal identities, such as language, sacred groves, and tribal artisans.
- Odisha has 62 tribal groupings in total, including 13 particularly vulnerable tribal groups (PVTGs).

Srimandir Heritage Corridor Project

• The state government has set a December deadline for the completion of the Shri Jagannath Heritage Corridor project.

Puri Heritage Corridor Project:

- It is a redevelopment project of the Odisha government in Puri.
- Its aim is to create an international heritage site, including the Jagannath temple.
- The Shree Jagannatha Heritage Corridor (SJHC) or the Shree Mandira Parikrama Project aims to revamp the area around the temple.
- The project includes Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) building redevelopment, a 600-capacity Srimandir reception center, Puri Lake, Musa River revival plan, etc.
- The Odisha government has listed three objectives for the revamp of the area around the temple- the security of the temple, the safety of devotees, and the creation of a religious atmosphere for devotees.

Odisha State Cooperative Bank won the National Award

- Odisha State Cooperative Bank was named the third-best cooperative bank in the country for service and performance.
- The National Federation of State Cooperative Bank Ltd. (NAFSCOB) presented this honour to Odisha for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 annual sessions held in Rajasthan.

JSP Foundation unveils ambitious plans to expand Mission Zero Hunger Program

• The JSP Foundation is set to expand the operational scope of its Mission Zero Hunger program.

Zero Hunger Programme

- It is an ambitious government scheme aimed at reducing hunger across the country.
- India's Zero Hunger Programme was launched on October 16, 2017.

The programme created by-

- The Indian Council of Agricultural Research
- Indian Council of Medical Research
- M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation
- Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC).
- The program focuses on developing farm equipment, revamping the farming system, setting up genetic gardens for biofortified plants and beginning zero hunger training.
- The Zero Hunger Programme aims to-





- Decrease child stunting for children 2 years and younger
- Ensure access to food all year round
- Create stable food systems
- Increase small farmer productivity and income
- Eliminate food waste.

Ama Gaon Ama Bikash

- The CAG's performance assessment discovered major inconsistencies in the utilisation of funds under Odisha's Ama Gaon Ama Bikash (AGAB) scheme.
- The programme began in 2018.
- Its goal is to reach out to individuals in rural regions and encourage them to participate in development efforts.
- The overarching goal is to accelerate local development through small and critical projects of local significance.
- The state government pays for it.
- The project should cost between 1 lakh and 10 lakh rupees.
- People can send their suggestions directly to the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) at the Secretariat in Bhubaneswar under this programme.
- Suggestions can be sent by Wi-Fi equipped latest technology, video wall vans, and so on.

The Odisha government has banned highly dangerous substances. Paraquat

- Odisha's state government has prohibited the use of paraquat, a very hazardous chemical extensively used as a weed killer.
- The decision was made to avoid the chemical's negative impact on human and animal health.
- The sale, stockpiling, distribution, manufacturing, and use of this hazardous substance will be restricted throughout the state.
- The restriction will be in place for two months initially under the 1968 Insecticides Act.
- It is a highly toxic chemical that is commonly used as a herbicide to kill weeds.
- An chemical molecule known as methyl viologen.
- This is a type of salt that is commonly used as a herbicide.

Under PMKSY, Odisha creates irrigation potential for 4.2 lakh hectares

• Under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY), the state government has increased irrigation potential for about 4.20 lakh hectares and improved on-farm water usage efficiency for over one lakh hectares.

One health program started in Odisha

• One Health program proposed by the World Health Organization (WHO) will be implemented in Odisha on the basis of a pilot project.

National One Health Mission:

- It is based on one health approach
- One Health approach is an integrated, unifying approach that aims to balance the health of people, animals and ecosystems.
- Mission works at the local, regional, national, and global levels
- It recognizes the interconnection between people, animals, plants, and their shared environment.

39.3 percent of Odisha's population belongs to backward classes – as per Survey

- Recently the Odisha State Commission for Backward Classes (OSCBC) conducted a survey according to the resolution passed by the Odisha government.
- Over 39.31 percent of Odisha's population belongs to socially and economically backward classes (SEBCs)
- The population of SEBCs is mostly concentrated in coastal districts.

Aim of survey:

- To present the social and educational status
- to facilitate the formulation of specific policies and programs to bring them into the fold of development.
- Other findings about SEBCs:
- 37.6 percent have a primary level of education.
- 10.1 percent illiterate.
- The representation in government jobs is only 2.8 percent.
- While 22 per cent have passed matriculation, intermediate, and ITI/diploma holders.

Ama Hospital Scheme

• The Odisha Government has decided to extend the Ama Hospital scheme to all government hospitals to transform the healthcare system.

Key facts:

- All district headquarters and sub-divisional hospitals besides CHCs and PHCs would be transformed in the next four years at the cost of 750 cr.
- The hospitals to be transformed included
- 30 district headquarters
- 30 sub-divisional, 82 community health centers (CHCs)





- two urban primary health centers (PHCs) and City Hospital at Cuttack
- Capital Hospital and Rourkela Government Hospital

About Scheme:

- 'Ama Hospital' is a scheme of the government to improve infrastructure and ensure enough manpower in the state-run healthcare facilities.
- The district collectors will implement the scheme with the assistance of district-level committees.

Saura Art Gallery

• A group of tribal painters in Odisha's Rayagada district transformed their entire hamlet into an art gallery using their artistic skills and brushstrokes.

Art by Saora/Saura:

- Lanjia Saora tribals create Saora artwork on the mud walls of their homes.
- The tribe lives along the Bansadhara River in southern Odisha.
- Idital is a Saora painting, and the artist who creates it is known as the iditalma.
- Saura paintings are created to please their patron deity, Edital.
- Each painting has a rectangle frame and depicts deity or natural iconography.
- The only colours utilised were geru (red earth) and white (from rice paste).
- Motifs include people, trees, the sun, the moon, animals, village activities, and so on.

Kendrapara residents recall the MS Foundation's efforts to save mangroves.

• Villagers in Kendrapara recall MS Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF)'s initiative to save mangroves following storms after MS Swaminathan's death.

MSSRF Details:

- The M. S. Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) was founded in 1988.
- It is a charitable trust.
- Professor M S Swaminathan envisioned and established MSSRF using profits from his 1987 First World Food Prize.
- The Foundation's mission is to expedite the application of current research to sustainable agricultural and rural development.MSSRF is a pro-poor, pro-women, and pro-nature organisation that focuses primarily on tribal and rural populations.

The 'seed girl' of Odisha Harshita Priyadarshini Mohanty

• Harshita Priyadarshini Mohanty, inspired by Kamala Pujari, is on a quest to preserve uncommon kinds of paddy and millets in Koraput district.

Important points:

- Kamala Pujari is well-known for encouraging organic farming and maintaining over 100 varieties of indigenous paddy seeds.
- Hrashita was also present in the Global Symposium on Farmers' Rights.

'Rasabali' gets a GI tag

• Rasabali, a popular sweetmeat in Odisha's Kendrapara area, has been designated as a GI.

Rasabali:

- The sweet is a traditional Odia treat.
- 'Rasabali' is one of the 56 Chhapan Bhog delicacies offered to Lord Jagannath and his siblings in Puri Srimandir.
- The sweet is also available at the Baladevjew shrine in Kendrapara.

Odisha women's empowerment

• Women entrepreneurs lead 43 percent of startups in Odisha, compared to the national average of 18%.

Important information:

- The government of Odisha has taken considerable steps in this regard.
- In 2022-23, the government has granted Rs 11,000 crore in institutional finance to four lakh SHGs.
- The state creates its own Gender Budget.
- The Mission Shakti department earned the greatest funding (41.57 percent) in this Gender Budget 2023-24.
- Odisha was the first state in India to implement a 33% reservation for women in PRIs in 1999.

Odisha will increase coffee cultivation in six districts

• Odisha's state government has set a goal of increasing coffee bean cultivation by tenfold over the next five years.

Important points:

- This is part of the "Coffee Mission."
- The Agriculture Department will carry out the mission.
- Rayagada, Gajapati, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, and Keonjhar are among the districts.
- The mission will be carried out through a new programme named "Coffee Plantation for Sustainable Livelihoods."





- Only in Koraput is coffee farmed on a considerable scale at the moment.
- According to the Coffee Board of India, coffee is currently planted on 4,339 hectares of land in the state.

Project Alabira Power

• Grid Corporation of Odisha Limited (GRIDCO) and NLC India Limited (NLCIL) inked a power purchase agreement for the purchase of 400 MW of power each from the Central PSU's Talabira supercritical thermal power facility.

About the project:

- It is a Steam Turbine power plant.
- The power plant is dual fuel capable. The plant's principal fuel is coal.
- In the event of a coal shortage, the facility will run on Light Diesel Oil/Heavy Fuel Oil.
- The NLC Talabira Thermal Power Project consists of three steam turbines with a total capacity of 800 MW.

Transfer of Property Act, 1882

- According to the Transfer of Property Act of 1882 (TPA), rents collected by a borrower can be assigned to a lender as an "actionable claim" by the Supreme Court.
- Transfer Of Property Act, 1882:
- The TPA is a significant piece of legislation in India that controls the transfer of property between live beings (inter vivos).
- The TPA is primarily concerned with the transfer of immovable property; nevertheless, some sections and clauses of this Act also address the transfer of moveable property.
- This Act was first introduced in 1882, and it has been amended multiple times since then.
- It describes the various modalities of transfer required as well as the legal requirements to ensure the transfer is valid.

DNA and facial recognition systems in police stations

- Despite the fact that the Criminal Procedure Identification Act (CrPI), 2022, was approved by Parliament more than a year ago, the Centre is prepared to implement 'DNA and Face Matching' systems at 1,300 police stations across the country, despite the Act's provisions not yet being completely implemented.
- Under the Criminal Procedure Identification Act 2022 (CrPI), the Indian government plans to install "DNA and Face Matching" equipment in 1,300 police stations around the country. (The Act, which expanded the scope to acquire new data, replaced the 100-year-old Identification of Prisoners Act, of 1920.)
- In policing, face recognition technologies identify and quantify facial traits in order to authenticate individuals from photographs or video frames.

Intelligence Bureau: Exempted From RTI

- The Delhi High Court recently ruled that the Intelligence Bureau stands exempted from the rigors of the RTI Act by virtue of Section 24 (Act not to apply to certain organizations) thereof.
- IB is an internal intelligence agency of India that is used to gather intelligence from within India and also execute counter-intelligence and counter-terrorism tasks.
- In addition to domestic intelligence responsibilities, the IB is particularly tasked with

intelligence collection in border areas, following the 1951 recommendations of the Himmatsinhji Committee (also known as the North and North-East Border Committee), a task entrusted to military intelligence organizations, prior to independence in 1947.

• It comes under the administrative control of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023

- The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023 Parliamentary Committee has evaluated the BNS 2023 Bill, which proposes significant changes to India's Criminal Justice System, including a gender-neutral provision criminalizing adultery.
- The Ministry of Home Affairs has introduced the BNS Bill, which aims to replace the colonial-era IPC (Indian Penal Code).

Withholding Tax: Supreme Court Decision

- The Supreme Court (SC) has ruled that without clear notification, firms cannot automatically claim a lower withholding tax of 5%, even if provided for in the Direct Tax Avoidance Agreement (DTAA).
- When certain types of income, such as wages, dividends, interest, and royalties, are paid to the recipient (non-resident individual), withholding tax is withheld or deducted.
- It is also known as the Retention Tax.
- The goal of withholding tax in India is to ensure that the government receives a share of the recipient's income tax.
- Payments made to non-resident individuals are subject to withholding tax.

APAAR stands for One Nation, One Student ID

- Recently, the Union Education Ministry recommended all states to establish the Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR), also known as the "One Nation, One Student ID."
- The Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR) is also known as 'One Nation, One Student ID.'
- It's an Education Ecosystem Registry, often known as a 'EduLocker.'
- The Ministry of Education's National Educational Technology Forum (NETF) developed the concept







of creating a comprehensive educational ecosystem registry that includes students, teachers, schools, and colleges.

 In addition to the current Aadhaar ID, APAAR assigns a unique identifying number to each student from pre-primary to higher education.

The Supreme Court has refused to recognise same-sex marriages

- A five-judge Constitution Bench led by Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud unanimously rejected same-sex marriages and civil unions for non-heterosexual couples.
- The CJI and the other four judges on the Bench concurred that there is no basic right to marry under the Indian Constitution.
- The use of gender-neutral wording to interpret the Special Marriage Act of 1954 to allow same-sex marriage was ruled impracticable.
- The decision did not recognise same-sex weddings or civil unions, but it did recognise the ability to select partners and live-in relationships.
- The court emphasised that family laws disproportionately exclude the LGBTQ community.
- The responsibility for legal reforms and inclusivity in family law was placed on the legislature.

Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act: Update

- The Supreme Court of India recognized an unborn child's rights by rejecting a woman's request to abort her 27-week-old pregnancy.
- The court cited the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act as a breach because there was no immediate threat to the mother or any foetal defect.
- However, the court permitted the parents to choose whether or not to place the infant for adoption and ordered the state to cover all medical expenses.

Ethics committee of Lok Sabha

- Lok Sabha Speaker has referred a "cash-for-query" complaint made by a BJP MP against a Trinamool Congress member to the Ethics Committee of the Lower House.
- The complaint is based on evidence from an advocate, which he claims shows the exchange of bribes between the accused and a businessman.
- He also pointed out that a significant number of recent parliamentary questions were focused on the Adani Group, a conglomerate she has accused of malpractices.

- The Lok Sabha Ethics Committee examines complaints of unethical conduct by members of the Lok Sabha.
- The committee was established in 2000 by the late Speaker G M C Balayogi. It became a permanent part of the House in 2015.
- The committee was established in Rajya Sabha in 1997.

The committee's functions include:

- Examining complaints of unethical conduct by members of the Lok Sabha
- Making recommendations
- Formulating a code of conduct for members
- Suggesting amendments or additions to the code of conduct

Remote EVM (R-EVM): Issues related to Domestic Migrant Voting

- The Election Commission of India (ECI) proposed a Remote EVM (R-EVM) to address issues related to domestic migrant voting. The goal was to improve the 67.4% voter turnout in the 2019 general election.
- A survey by Lokniti-CSDS was conducted in September 2023, involving 1,017 migrants living in Delhi's slums, with 63% men and 37% women, aiming to understand whether the proposed R-EVM system would gain a viable level of trust among its intended users, setting aside legal and logistical concerns raised by political parties.
- Remote EVM (R-EVM) stands for "Remote Electronic Voting Machine."
- It is a proposed system by the Election Commission of India (ECI) aimed at facilitating voting for domestic migrants who are unable to vote in their home constituencies due to their current location away from their registered constituencies.
- The R-EVM is designed to address the issue of domestic migrant voting, allowing registered voters who have moved away from their home constituencies to cast their votes remotely.

Bihar Caste Survey

• This comprehensive survey provides crucial data on the composition of various caste groups and their implications for politics, policies, and social dynamics.

Key Findings of the Bihar Caste Survey:

• The Extremely Backward Classes (EBCs) constitute the largest social group, comprising 36.01% of Bihar's population, totaling 4,70,80,514 individuals.





- Other Backward Classes (OBCs) make up 27.12% of the population, with a total of 3,54,63,936 members.
- Scheduled Castes (SCs) account for 19.65%, numbering 2,56,89,820 individuals.
- Scheduled Tribes (STs) form a minority, representing only 1.68%, with 21,99,361 members.
- The "unreserved" category, often referred to as "forward" castes, comprises 15.52% of the population, totaling 2,02,91,679 individuals.
- The overall population of Bihar, according to the survey, is 13,07,25,310, an increase from the 2011 census figure of 10.41 crore.

Sarna Tribal Religious Code: Jharkhand

- The jharkhand Chief minister wrote to the Prime Minister, demanding acceptance of the Sarna religious code for tribals.
- Concerns have been expressed about the Sarna Code's neglect, which could have a negative impact on tribal development programs under the Constitution's Fifth and Sixth Schedules.
- Sarna religion, practiced by a substantial tribal population in Jharkhand, is distinct from mainstream religions since it is based on nature worship.
- There is a need to safeguard tribals' cultural and religious identities.
- The Fifth Schedule contains provisions for the administration and control of Scheduled Areas and STs in states that are not 6th Schedule States.
- The sixth schedule governs tribal government in Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, and Mizoram.

Approved Nutrient-Based Subsidy

- The Union Cabinet has approved Nutrient Based Subsidy (NBS) prices for Rabi and Kharif Season nutrients for 2022-23.
- NBS approved for Nitrogen (N), Phosphorus (P), Potash (K), and Sulphur (S) for Rabi Season 2022-23.
- NBS pricing for Phosphatic and Potassic (P&K) Fertilisers approved for Kharif Season 2023.
- The Nutrient Based Subsidy (NBS) Regime provides farmers with fertilisers at subsidised rates based on the nutrients (N, P, K, and S) included in these fertilisers.
- Additionally, fertilisers supplemented with secondary and micronutrients such as molybdenum (Mo) and zinc receive additional subsidies.
- PUSA-44 Paddy Variety : Banned

- The Punjab Chief Minister has announced a ban on the cultivation of the PUSA-44 paddy variety starting next year.
- PUSA-44 was developed in 1993 and gained immense popularity among Punjab's farmers, covering 70 to 80 percent of the state's paddy cultivation area due to its high yield.

The reasons behind the ban on PUSA-44

- PUSA-44 has a longer maturity period, requiring around 160 days to mature, which is approximately 35 to 40 days longer than other paddy varieties.
- Punjab faces severe groundwater depletion, and the government aims to conserve one month of irrigation water by banning PUSA-44.
- PUSA-44 exacerbates the problem of stubble burning in Punjab.
- Its harvesting just before the ideal time for wheat sowing (typically at the end of October) leaves a limited timeframe of 20 to 25 days for stubble disposal before wheat sowing.

Rashtriya Gokul Mission

- The Rashtriya Gokul Mission is promoting the Gir indigenous cow breed.
- Since December 2014, the Rashtriya Gokul Mission has been working to produce and conserve indigenous bovine breeds.
- It is continued under the umbrella scheme Rashtriya Pashudhan Vikas Yojana from 2021 to 2026.

Operation Chakra 2: CBI

- The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has recently initiated Operation Chakra II.
- 'Operation Chakra-2' was launched in response to the filing of five different cases of cyber-enabled financial crime, including a 100-crore cryptocurrency scam.
- The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has initiated Operation Chakra II.
- The goal is to combat transnationally organised cyber-enabled financial crime in India.
- Its goal is to combat transnational organised cyberenabled financial crime in India. (The CBI and its problems)

The 5th National Level Steering Committee Meeting of the Atal Bhujal Yojana

• The National Level Steering Committee (NLSC) of the Atal Bhujal Yojana (ATAL JAL) met for the







fifth time to examine the scheme's overall development.

- The World Bank has been participating in the program's assessment.
- The committee advised governments to incorporate Water Security Plans (WSPs) into Gramme Panchayat Development Plans, which will ensure the scheme's approach is sustainable long after the programme ends.

The 7th Edition of The India Mobile Congress 2023 In New Delhi

• India's Prime Minister launched the 7th Edition of the India Mobile Congress 2023.

- The India Mobile Congress (IMC) is Asia's largest telecom, media, and technology gathering, and it will take place from October 27th to 29th, 2023.
- 'Global Digital Innovation' is the theme of the IMC.
- The IMC 2023 intends to increase India's status as a significant cutting-edge technology innovator, manufacturer, and exporter.
- The Prime Minister presented 100 '5G Use Case Labs' to educational institutions throughout the country.
- The '100 5G laboratories programme' is an effort to realise the benefits of 5G technology by stimulating the creation of 5G applications.
- The 5G deployment is complete, with plans to extend service nationwide by the end of the year.



INTERNATIONAL

Visa Shopping

The practice of 'visa shopping' has been gaining popularity in several Indian states.

- 1. "Visa shopping" is a practice where individuals obtain visas for countries, they may not visit during the visa's validity period.
- 2. The objective is to use these visas as a means to enter their preferred countries, particularly in Europe, even if they already have a visa for another European nation.
- 3. People also buy visas for countries they don't intend to visit immediately to increase their chances of getting visas for their preferred destinations in the future.
- 4. This practice is prevalent in India, particularly in Punjab, and it has raised legal implications.

Restrict Exports of Graphite: China

- China has unveiled plans to restrict exports of graphite – a mineral crucial to the manufacture of batteries for electric vehicles (EVs) – on national security grounds.
- Graphite is an opaque, non-metallic carbon polymorph that is blackish silver in color and metallic to dull in sheen.
- Since it resembles metal lead, it is also known colloquially as black lead or plumbago.
- It is formed by the metamorphosis of sediments containing carbonaceous material.
- It is a naturally occurring form of crystalline carbon.

UN Approved Multinational Security Mission in Haiti

- The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) has approved the Multinational Security Mission(MSS), led by Kenya, to restore security, protect critical infrastructure and control spiraling violence in Haiti.
- Haiti faced escalating gang violence, causing chaos and suffering throughout the country.
- A group of gangs known as "G9 and Family" disrupted the main fuel port and the Capital city Port-au-Prince, leading to a nationwide crisis.
- This has resulted in widespread killings of nearly 2,800 people, between October 2022 and June 2023.

India Tanzania Investment Forum

- India welcomed the President of Tanzania at the India-Tanzania Investment Forum in New Delhi.
- India and Tanzania have upgraded their bilateral relations to the level of a strategic partnership.
- Both nations inked six agreements to strengthen cooperation across various vital domains.
- It encompasses cooperation in the digital domain, culture, sports, maritime industries, and white shipping information sharing.
- These agreements lay the foundation for fostering technological and cultural exchange between the two nations.

United Nations Convention Against Transnational Organised Crime

• The union Minister of State for Home Affairs participated in the two-day UN Convention against Transnational Organised Crime Ministerial Conference at Palermo in Italy.

- United Nations Convention against Transnational Organised Crime is a multinational treaty against transnational organized crime that was established by the United Nations in 2000.
- It is often known as the Palermo Convention.
- The UNTOC has a total of 147 signatories and 190 parties to the convention.
- The Convention is further supplemented by three Protocols
- The Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children;
- The Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air; and
- The Protocol against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, their Parts and Components and Ammunition.

AUKUS Initiative

- As part of the AUKUS initiative with Australia and the US, the UK has given three UK businesses a 4-billion-pound (\$4.9 billion) contract to design and build an attack submarine powered by nuclear energy.
- AUKUS established in 2021, the AUKUS is intended to be a strategic partnership among Australia, the United Kingdom (UK), and the United States to bolster their allied deterrence and defense capabilities in the Indo-Pacific.
- The trilateral partnership, which builds on their decades-long security cooperation, has two pillars.
- Pillar I revolves around the acquisition and development of conventionally armed nuclear-powered submarines for the Royal Australian Navy;
- Pillar II calls for collaboration on advanced capabilities that will involve technology and information sharing;
- It is designed to equip Australia with nuclearpowered attack submarines (SSNs).

Social Security Agreement: India-Argentina

- India and Argentina have signed a significant Social Security Agreement (SSA) aimed at protecting the rights of professionals and workers from both countries regarding social security contributions.
- The SSA covers areas related to old-age benefits, survivor's pensions, and permanent, total disability pensions for employed individuals in India.
- In Argentina, it applies to contributory benefits provided by the Social Security System.
- The agreement ensures that detached workers and their family members, who temporarily work in another country, retain their rights to contributory benefits under local legislation without reduction, modification, suspension, suppression, or retention.
- The SSA establishes a legal framework for regulating the insurance period (period of services with contributions) and contributory benefits for detached workers, including crew members of airlines and ships.
- It ensures the smooth export of these benefits to the home country of the worker.

Whoosh: Southeast Asia's First High-Speed Railway

- Indonesian President Joko Widodo officially inaugurated Southeast Asia's first high-speed railway marking a significant milestone for the nation's infrastructure development.
- The ambitious project, known as the "Whoosh" high-speed railway, is a key component of China's Belt and Road Initiative and is poised to dramatically reduce travel times between two vital Indonesian cities. ...
- The high-speed railway connects the sprawling metropolis of Jakarta with Bandung, the bustling capital of West Java province.
- This transformational rail link is set to reduce the arduous three-hour commute between these cities to a mere 40 minutes, greatly enhancing regional connectivity and facilitating economic growth.

International Competition Network

- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has joined the International Competition Network's (ICN) distinguished 18-member steering committee.
- The International Competition Policy Advisory Committee (ICPAC), a body founded in 1997, offered suggestions that led to the creation of the ICN.







- It was founded in October 2001 by representatives from 15 different competition authorities from around the world.
- The ICN's governing body is the steering committee.
- The ICN, which is made up of 140 competition agencies, normally serves as a specialized, although informal, arena for antitrust authorities to maintain regular contacts and handle practical competition concerns.

CCI:

- It is a statutory body established by the Government of India in March 2009 under the Competition Act, of 2002.
- The purpose of CCI is to develop and preserve fair competition in the economy, which will offer a 'level playing field' for producers and make markets work for the benefit of consumers.

Global Tax Evasion Report 2024

- The European Union Tax Observatory has produced the 'Global Tax Evasion Report 2024,' which highlights several significant topics connected to tax evasion, including the Global Minimum Tax (GMT) on billionaires and anti-tax evasion measures.
- The paper looks into the effects of international changes implemented over the last decade, such as the automatic worldwide exchange of bank information and the international agreement on a global minimum tax for multinational corporations, among other things.
- Tax evasion is the illegal act of failing to pay taxes owed to the government by underreporting income, inflating deductions, concealing funds in offshore accounts, or employing other deceptive methods to decrease one's tax responsibility.

Leniency Plus Norms: CCI

- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has published a draft of amended reduced penalty laws that call for the implementation of a "leniency plus" scheme.
- The 'leniency plus' criteria are a new cartel detection instrument that sheds light on how the competition watchdog intends to implement it.
- The "Leniency Plus" regime was included in the Competition Amendment Act 2023.
- Leniency Plus is a proactive antitrust enforcement method that encourages companies who are currently under investigation for one cartel to report other cartels that are unknown to the competition regulator.

Yuva Sangam (Phase III)

• Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) has established the registration portal for Phase III of Yuva Sangam.

- Yuva Sangam is a Government of India program to improve people-to-people ties among youth from various Indian states and union territories.
- Interested youth between the ages of 18 and 30, primarily students, NSS (National Service Scheme)/NYKS (Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan) volunteers, employed/self-employed individuals, and so on, should register through the YUVA SANGAM site to participate in the upcoming Phase.
- It was launched under the EBSB and is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.
- It emphasizes firsthand experiencing learning and acquiring knowledge of India's rich diversity.

India Skills 2023-24

- The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship has announced the commencement of India Skills 2023-24 and congratulated the World Skills Competition (WSC) 2022 winners.
- India Skills 2023-24 is a skill development competition that aims to cultivate and improve individuals' skills in a variety of fields, preparing them for national and international contests.
- India Skills is the competition that precedes World Skills. Participants who thrive at the national level in India Skills will be invited to compete in the global event World Skills.
- The curriculum emphasizes the necessity of building employable skills that fit with market needs in order to increase workforce acceptance within the industry.

What is Stock Split?

- Sigachi Industries (SIGACHI) recently initiated its long-anticipated 10:1 stock split.
- Stock Split happens when a company increases the number of its shares to boost the stock's liquidity.
- It is a corporate action in which a company issues additional shares to shareholders, increasing the total by the specified ratio based on the shares they held previously.
- Although the number of shares outstanding increases, there is no change to the company's total market capitalization as the price of each share will split as well.
- The most common split ratios are 2-for-1 or 3-for-1 (sometimes denoted as 2:1 or 3:1). This means that for every share held before the split, each stockholder will have two or three shares, respectively, after the split.





Passport to Earning (P2E) Initiative

- Passport to Earning (P2E), UNICEF's worldwide learning-to-earning solution, has trained and certified over one million young people in India in financial literacy and digital productivity.
- The P2E program, which is in line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, provides free access to certificate courses in digital productivity, financial literacy, employability skills, and other in-demand, job-ready abilities.
- Notably, 62% of P2E course participants in India are adolescent girls and young women.
- P2E is an important addition to the nation's educational and economic landscape, with the goal of giving long-term sustainable skills to 5 million youngsters in India aged 14-29 by 2024 and connecting them to employment and entrepreneurship opportunities.

Poorvottar Sampark Setu Portal

- The Union Ministry of Development of North-East Region virtually launched "MDoNER Data Analytics Dashboard" and "Poorvottar Sampark Setu" portal at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.
- It is a powerful tool designed to streamline and enhance monitoring of Fortnightly visits of Union Ministers to NER.

Features:

- The dashboard provides valuable insights and graphical information about State-wise/ District-wise visits to the North Eastern Region by Union Ministers to be used by all the stake holders in one place.
- The portal generates a curated list of Ministers who can be nominated for visit to NER in the upcoming months.
- After the visit, the Minister can submit their tour reports along with their recommendations online.
- MDoNER can forward the recommendations to respective line Ministries/Departments/State Governments for quick action, after analyzing the same.
- The Portal generates the summary report.

Resilient and Inclusive Supply-Chain Enhancement (RISE) Initiative: World Bank and Japan

- In Morocco, the World Bank and Japan established the Resilient and Inclusive Supply-chain Enhancement (RISE) initiative.
- This effort aims to address the dual concerns of job creation and climate change by assisting emerging markets and developing nations in growing their manufacturing of clean-energy products and

increasing their participation in the minerals sector.

- The effort intends to boost economic growth and create local job possibilities, ultimately helping to reduce poverty.
- This united endeavor highlights the significance of international cooperation in driving economic growth in these nations while also boosting clean energy and vital mineral supply chains.

One CGIAR Global Initiative

- The International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) has joined the global effort One Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR).
- One CGIAR worldwide program seeks to develop a cohesive approach to reforming food, land, and water systems in response to the challenges posed by the climate catastrophe.
- The CGIAR System Organization and 12 One CGIAR research centers are involved in this endeavor.
- The CGIAR is a publicly sponsored network of agrifood research centers that seeks to alter food, land, and water systems in the face of a climate crisis. It is operational in over 80 countries.

Bima Vahak: IRDAI

- The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has announced that the guidelines for the women-centric insurance distribution channel known as "Bima Vahak" will go into effect with the launch of "Bima Vistaar," an all-in-one standard insurance product that is currently in development.
- Bima Vahak's major goal is to create a dedicated distribution channel focused on expanding insurance inclusion and awareness in every village/gram panchayat, hence increasing insurance accessibility and availability across the country.
- The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India is abbreviated as IRDAI. It was founded on April 19, 2000, to govern India's insurance market.
- The IRDAI's responsibilities include the following:
- In India, the insurance and reinsurance businesses are regulated and licensed.
- Protecting the policyholder's interests

Accredited Social Health Activist: Planning for Incentives

• The government intends to reward ASHA health activists who mobilize eligible individuals for





sickle cell disease screening and the distribution of sickle cell cards.

- ASHA is a female community health activist who has received training.
- ASHA workers are an essential component of the Government of India's National Rural Health Mission.
- The ASHA, who will be chosen from the community and held accountable to it, will be taught to act as a liaison between the community and the public health system.

Veer Gatha Project 3.0

- Over 1.36 crore school pupils from all 36 Indian states and union territories took part in the third iteration of the Veer Gatha Project.
- The project, which will be launched in 2021 under the Gallantry Awards Portal (GAP), intends to showcase acts of courage by Armed Forces members and instill patriotism and civic consciousness in schoolchildren.
- To honor these courageous individuals, students sent poems, paintings, essays, videos, and other works.
- Various activities were carried out at the school level as part of the Veer Gatha Project 3.0, with schools sending their finest entries to the MyGov portal.
- The Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Defence will jointly honor 100 winners (Super 100) at the national level, with each getting a cash prize of Rs 10,000.

Protein Binders Not Permitted: FSSAI

- The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has said that the addition of protein binders to milk and milk products is prohibited.
- This clarification comes at a time when some players are adding protein binders to dairy products like curd to provide a thicker texture.
- Protein binders, which are biological agents, have emerged as a significant and necessary class of ingredients in the development of a wide range of new food items, particularly semi-solid or solid foods.
- These are known to have an effect on the digestibility of the protein bound and consequently on the biological and nutritional value of milk proteins.
- Protein binding affects the bioavailability and distribution of active substances as well.
- Milk protein is high in critical amino acids.

Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) Scheme: RBI

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) recently extended the Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) plan for another two years, and beneficiaries of the PM Vishwakarma scheme would be included.
- The RBI announced the Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) Scheme in January 2021 for a three-year period.
- The goal is to double the number of payment acceptance devices in the country.
- The PIDF is a fund established by the RBI in collaboration with major approved card networks to aid in the development of payment acceptance infrastructure in India's tier 3 to tier 6 cities and northeastern states.
- Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh will also be given special consideration.
- Beneficiaries of the PM SVANidhi Scheme in Tier-1 and 2 centres were later included in August 2021.
- The PIDF is funded by the RBI and the major authorized card networks in India.
- The scheme provides financial assistance to banks and non-bank financial companies (NBFCs) for the deployment of PoS terminals and other payment acceptance infrastructure in eligible regions.

National Means-Cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme

- The Ministry of Education recently opened online registration for the 2023-24 National Merit Cumulative Means Scholarship Scheme.
- The National Means-Current-Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme that was established in May of 2008.
- Scholarships will be awarded to deserving students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds in order to prevent dropouts in class VIII and encourage them to continue their education at the secondary level.
- Every year, the Ministry of Human Resource Development awards one lakh new scholarships to selected students from grades IX to XII in accredited Government, Government-aided, and local body institutions.
- The scholarship amount is Rs. 12000/- per year (Rs. 1000/- per month) for each student.

SUGAM REC App

• The Maharatna Central Public Sector Enterprise, REC Limited, has launched an SUGAM REC mobile application.





- The SUGAM REC App is only available to current and prospective investors in REC's 54EC Capital Gain Tax Exemption Bonds.
- Investors will be able to download their e-bond certificates, apply for new investments, download relevant forms relating to KYC updates, and communicate with REC's Investor Cell via phone, email, or WhatsApp.

Card-on-File Tokenisation: Reserve Bank of India

- Card-on-file tokenization (CoFT) was proposed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).
- Card-on-file transactions occur when cardholders permit businesses to securely retain their payment information and bill their stored accounts for future purchases.
- Tokenization is the process of replacing genuine credit and debit card details with an alternative code known as the "token," which is unique for each combination of card, token requestor, and device.
- This must be unique for each card, token requestor (the entity that accepts a customer's request for tokenization of a card and forwards it to the card network to issue a corresponding token), and merchant (the token requestor and merchant may or may not be the same entity).

GEOGRAPHY & ENVIRONMENT

Hunter's Moon Lunar Eclipse

- On Saturday, October 28, 2023, at 3:35 p.m. EST, the "Hunter's Moon" will be fully lighted.
- The Hunter's Moon is one of several names for the full moons that occur throughout the year.
- Because of the way sunlight is scattered by the Earth's atmosphere, the Hunter's Moon might seem red or orange at times.
- This is most common when the moon is low in the sky, like at sunrise and sunset.
- The "Hunter's Moon" this year will be more colorful and larger than at any other time of night.

National Turmeric Board: Established

- The National Turmeric Board was created by the Government of India.
- Because India is the world's largest producer (75% of global turmeric production), user, and exporter of turmeric, this effort intends to boost the development and expansion of the country's turmeric sector.
- The Board will include a chairperson appointed by the Central Government, members from key government departments such as the Ministry of AYUSH, the Union Government's Departments of Pharmaceuticals, Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, and Commerce & Industry, as well as rotating senior State Government representatives from three states.
- The Board is intended to assist in the development and growth of the spice sector in India, which controls over 62% of the global turmeric trade.
- Turmeric is mostly produced in Maharashtra, Telangana, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu.

20th Edition of the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2024

- The Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2024 have been revealed, and 91 Indian institutes have gained a spot.
- There are 1,904 universities from 108 nations and regions represented in the 2024 rankings.
- The 2024 Rankings examine research-intensive universities globally based on 18 important parameters spread across five categories: teaching (29.5%), research environment (29%), research quality (30%), industry (4%), and international outlook (7.5%).







Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project

- The Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project has been accepted for inclusion in the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (PMKSY-AIBP) by the Indian government.
- The Jamrani Dam Multipurpose Project calls for the construction of a dam at Jamrani village over the river Gola, a tributary of the Ram Ganga in Uttarakhand's Nainital district.
- The project's irrigation benefits would flow primarily to the neighboring state of Uttar Pradesh.
- This is the ninth project to be added to the PMKSY-AIBP list.

Cyclonic Storm Hamoon

- According to current sources, the cyclonic storm "Hamoon" that emerged over the Bay of Bengal has rapidly intensified into a severe cyclonic storm.
- Over the Bay of Bengal, Cyclone Hamoon is building near India.
- Rain is expected to pour in southern India this week.
- Cyclones Tej and Hamoon are twin cyclones that formed over the north Indian Ocean.

Montreux Convention

- The Turkish Ministry of National Defense has indicated that, in accordance with the Montreux Convention, it will impose limits on the transit of warships from countries that do not border the Black Sea.
- The Montreux Convention governs the Dardanelles and Bosporus Straits, sometimes known as the Turkish Straits or the Black Sea Straits.
- The Turkish Straits are the only sea route connecting the Black Sea with the Mediterranean Sea.
- Turkey controls the Turkish Straits by the 1936 Montreux Convention Regarding the Regime of the Straits, also known as the Montreux Convention.

Regional Rapid Transit System

- The first leg of India's Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS), the country's first mass rapid transit system dedicated to regional connectivity, will be inaugurated by India's Prime Minister.
- The Regional Rapid Transportation System (RRTS) is an integrated mass transportation network with semi-highspeed rail connectivity at its core.
- It intends to promote "balanced and sustainable urban development" throughout the National Capital Region (NCR) by improving connectivity and access.
- The National Capital Region Transport Corporation (NCRTC), a joint venture of the Central government and the governments of Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh, is building it.

Atlas of the Siena Galaxy

- The Siena Galaxy map is a magnificent map of 400,000 galaxies in the Milky Way's cosmic neighborhood made by astronomers.
- The Siena Galaxy Atlas is a digital atlas that was built to help people learn more about our universe by exploring various known galaxies.
- It was constructed using data from three astronomical surveys conducted at Cerro Tololo Inter-American Observatory (CTIO) and Kitt Peak National Observatory (KPNO) between 2014 and 2017. These surveys are referred to together as the DESI Legacy Surveys.
- Unlike previous atlases, which depended on archaic equipment and photographic plates, it is based on cuttingedge digital photographs obtained by modern technology.

Mount Vesuvius

Using artificial intelligence, researchers decoded an ancient document buried in the ashes of Mount Vesuvius.

- Mt. Vesuvius is an active volcano in southern Italy that rises above the Bay of Naples on the Campania plain.
- It is the only active volcano on the European continent.
- Because its eruptions often include explosive eruptions as well as pyroclastic flows, the volcano is classed as a complex stratovolcano.
- A pyroclastic flow is a dense mixture of hot lava, pumice, ash, and volcanic gas.

Palk Strait: Ferry Service

- India and Sri Lanka recently launched a ferry service across the Palk Strait under a new roadmap for greater connectivity.
- Palk Strait is a strait that lies between the Tamil Nadu state of India and the island nation of Sri Lanka.
- The strait is named after Robert Palk, who was a governor of Madras Presidency (1755-1763) during the British Raj period.
- It is bounded on the south by Pamban Island (India), Adam's (Rama's) Bridge (a chain of shoals), the Gulf of Mannar, and Mannar Island (Sri Lanka).
- It connects the Bay of Bengal in the northeast with the Gulf of Mannar in the southwest.
- The southwestern portion of the strait is also called Palk Bay.

Earthquake in Afghanistan

- A 6.3 magnitude earthquake rocked Afghanistan lately, around 40 kilometers west of Herat.
- The death toll from severe earthquakes in Afghanistan has grown to almost 2,400, with search and rescue efforts continuing amid fears that some people may be trapped beneath collapsed structures.
- An earthquake is a tremor or shaking of the earth's surface.
- It is created by seismic waves or earthquake waves produced by a quick movement (sudden release of energy) in the earth's crust (shallow-focus earthquakes) or upper mantle (some shallow-focus, all intermediate and deep-focus earthquakes).

Mont Blanc Shrinks: New research

- New research has revealed that Mont Blanc, France's highest mountain has witnessed a reduction in its height over the past two years.
- Mont Blanc is the highest peak (4,807 meters) in Europe.
- It is located in the Alps and lies along the French-Italian border and reaches into Switzerland.
- It is nicknamed "the roof of Europe".
- Its name comes from the perennial snow cap that covers it, meaning literally "the white mountain".
- The mountain stands in a range called the Graian Alps, between the regions of Aosta Valley, Italy, and Savoie and Haute-Savoie, France.

Ichamati River: West Bengal

• The dredging work at National Waterways 44, Ichamati River in West Bengal, was inaugurated by the Minister of State for Ports, Shipping, and Waterways.













- The Ichamati River is a trans-boundary river that runs through both India and Bangladesh.
- It serves as a border between the two countries.
- It is presently divided into three segments.
- The longer section originates in the Mathabhanga River, a tributary of the Padma, and flows for 208 kilometers before joining the Kalindi River near Hasnabad in North 24 Parganas and Debhata in Satkhira District.
- The Ichhamati River and its tributaries form a massive oxbow lake complex near Bangaon in the North 24-Paraganas district.

Phase-IX of the Sagar Parikrama

- The ninth phase of the 'Sagar Parikrama' initiative will begin on October 7, 2023, according to the Indian government. 'Sagar Parikrama' seeks to resolve the concerns of fishermen and other stakeholders.
- The program's ninth phase will encompass coastal areas in Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.
- Pudukkottai, Thanjavur, Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai, Cuddalore, Viluppuram, Chengalpattu, Chennai, Karaikal, and Puducherry are among the cities covered.
- The tour will begin in Thondi, Tamil Nadu's Ramnad district, and will end in Chennai, traversing through other districts including Puducherry.
- The first eight phases of the 'Sagar Parikrama' encompassed 4,115 kilometers in eight coastal states and union territories, including Gujarat, Diu and Daman, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Kerala, Puducherry, and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Flooding in Sikkim

- The South Lhonak Lake in Sikkim burst, causing significant floods in downstream districts. This resulted in casualties and displacements throughout the state.
- Large volumes of water generated in front of, on top of, or beneath melting glaciers are known as glacial lakes.
- As they expand, they can become increasingly dangerous, as they are frequently dammed by unstable ice or sediment made of loose rock and debris.
- Rising global temperatures have caused glaciers in the Sikkim Himalayas to melt quickly, resulting in the formation and extension of glacial lakes.

Project Sela Tunnel

- According to BRO authorities, over 96 percent of the work on the strategically important Sela Tunnel has been completed, and it is expected to be inaugurated by the end of the year.
- The Sela Tunnel Project is located in Arunachal Pradesh's West Kameng district.
- When finished, the Sela tunnel will be the world's longest bilane tunnel at an elevation of more than 13,000 feet.
- It will provide all-weather communication between Assam's Guwahati and Arunachal Pradesh's Tawang.

Toto Shabda Sangraha

A dictionary titled "Toto Shabda Sangraha" is set to be released with the aim of preserving the Toto language, which is spoken by a mere 1,600 people in parts of West Bengal bordering Bhutan.

- The Toto language, a Sino-Tibetan language, is primarily spoken orally and is currently written in the Bengali script.
- While a script for Toto was developed in 2015 by Dhaniram Toto, a prominent community member, most Toto speakers still use the Bengali script or write in Bengali.
- The trilingual dictionary will translate Toto words into Bengali and English, making it accessible to a wider audience, as the Toto script is still in its early stages of development, and the tribe is more familiar with the Bengali script.

ENVIRONMENT

Leopard Toby Puffer Fish

- The Leopard Toby Puffer Fish, which lives in the deep depths, has been spotted off the coast of Australia.
- Leopard Toby Puffer Fish is a deepwater reef fish that inhabits in caves and coral slopes at depths ranging from 50 to 100 meters.
- Canthigaster leoparda is the scientific name for this species.
- It is distinguished by clusters of black spots along its pale body's flanks.
- It is also referred to as blowfish.

Tamil Nadu's First Tiger Rewilding Program

- A committee examined the Anamalai Tiger Reserve's first tiger rewilding initiative in Tamil Nadu.
- The tiger is cared for by Forest Department employees who limit interaction with the animal and watch it with cameras.
- The Anamalai Tiger Reserve was created from the Tamil Nadu portion of the Anamalais and is located in the Western Ghats south of the Palakkad gap.
- Surrounded by many wildlife reserves and forests, including the Parambikulum Tiger Reserve to the east and the Chinnar Wildlife Sanctuary and Eravikulum National Park to the south.

River Dolphins: A Global Declaration

- In a groundbreaking move, 11 Asian and South American countries have signed the "Global Declaration for River Dolphins," which aims to protect the world's six remaining river dolphin species.
- The Global Declaration for River Dolphins is intended to guide 14 river dolphin-inhabited nations, with a focus on responsible freshwater dolphin conservation.
- It aims to reverse the loss of all river dolphin species while also increasing the most vulnerable populations.
- The declaration will strengthen cooperation efforts to protect the remaining river dolphin species.

Ghatiana sanguinolenta: Fresh Water Crab Species

- Freshwater crab species 'Ghatiana sanguinolenta' was recently identified in the Balekoppa hamlet in Sirsi district in northern Karnataka by researchers.
- Ghatiana sanguinolenta is a recently discovered freshwater crab species.
- The crab's name comes from the Latin word "sanguinolenta," which means "red" or "blood-colored."
- The blood-red color of the crab and the outwards curled article of the initial section of the male 'gonopod' (genetalia) separate it from other Ghatiana subgenus species.
- It is currently only known from the type locality, which is located in India's Central Western Ghats.

Green Energy Corridor (GEC) Phase-II

- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, has approved the Green Energy Corridor (GEC) Phase-II – Inter-State Transmission System (ISTS) for a 13 GW Renewable Energy Project in Ladakh.
- Green Energy Corridor (GEC) is an initiative aimed at integrating and evacuating renewable energy into India's power grid, promoting sustainable growth, and enhancing energy security. It has two phases.
- Power Grid Corporation of India Limited (POWERGRID) is Implementing Agency
- GEC-1 Implementation Already underway in Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Himachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Rajasthan, aiming to integrate and evacuate 24GW of Renewable Energy (RE).
- GEC-2 Implementation Planned for seven states: Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh.
- Targeting grid integration and power evacuation of around 20 GW of RE projects over five years (FY 2021-22 to 2025-26).
- Objective is to Synchronize renewable energy (wind and solar) with conventional power sources.

- The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change is organizing a Country-Led Initiative (CLI) event as part of the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF) from 26-28 October 2023 at the Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun, Uttarakhand.
- United Nations Forum on Forests promotes the management, conservation, and sustainable development of all types of forests.
- It was established in 2000 by the UN Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC).
- The Forum meets annually at the UN Headquarters in New York, bringing together representatives of all member states and forest-related agencies for high-level dialogue on technical matters in odd years and policy matters in even years.
- The forum has universal membership and is composed of all Member States of the United Nations and specialized agencies.
- India is a founding member of UNFF.

Country-Led Initiative (CLI)

- Its primary goal is to contribute to the discussions of UNFF regarding the implementation of Sustainable Forest Management and the UN Strategic Plan for Forests.
- It also aims to facilitate the sharing of best practices among UNFF Member States for the implementation of SFM and UNSPF.

Lorrainosaurus: Fossils Found

- The remains of the 170-million-year-old ancient sea reptile known as 'Lorrainosaurus' from the Age of Dinosaurs have just been recognized as the oldest-known mega-predatory pliosaur.
- The fossils of this marine monster were discovered by scientists in 1983.
- Researchers re-examined the remains and discovered that the predator belonged to a previously undiscovered genus (group) of species and was the earliest "mega predatory" pliosaur ever discovered.
- The fossils were discovered in the old Lorraine region (now part of Grand Est) in northeastern France.

For the first time, A Paintbrush Swift Butterfly has been documented

- For the first time, the paintbrush swift butterfly has been photographed and documented in Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district.
- The Hesperiidae family includes the Paintbrush Swift Butterfly.

- Since its discovery in 1878, the species has never been photographed in Himachal Pradesh.
- We are photographing and documenting it for the first time.
- It was described more than 145 years ago by lepidopterist Frederic Moore.

Curcuma kakchingense: A New Flowering Plant

- Researchers in Manipur have identified and named a new flowering plant species, Curcuma kakchingense.
- Curcuma kakchingense is a newly discovered flowering plant species from Manipur.
- It belongs to the angiospermic Zingiberaceae family, which contains well-known plants such as Curcuma (turmeric), gingers, and cardamom.
- It is a strong plant that can grow up to eight feet tall and has a huge terminal inflorescence.
- It was discovered thriving along the banks of the Sekmai River in Manipur's Kakching District.

Buff-breasted Sandpiper: Rare Bird Sighted

- A rare bird from the arctic tundra, Buff-breasted sandpiper, was sighted in Kannur, Kerala.
- Buff-breasted Sandpiper is one of the most delicately beautiful of the shorebirds.
- It breeds in the open arctic tundra of North America and usually in winter in South America.
- It is a champion long-distance migrant, leaving high-Arctic dry tundra nesting grounds and migrating thousands of miles to winter on the grasslands of Brazil, Argentina, Uruguay, and Paraguay.
- Conservation status:
- IUCN: Near Threatened

2023 Global Survey on Persons With Disabilities And Disasters

- The UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR) conducted the 2023 Global Survey on Persons with Disabilities and Disasters, following up on the 2013 survey.
- The report was released ahead of International Day for DRR
- Its theme "Fighting inequality for a resilient future" is aligned with the Sendai Framework.
- It is aimed to assess the preparedness of persons with disabilities for disasters, accessibility of early warning and risk information, awareness of disaster risk reduction (DRR) plans, and their participation in DRR decision-making.
- Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) refers to the practices and strategies aimed at minimizing the

risks and vulnerabilities associated with natural and human-made disasters.

Bufoides bhupathyi: New Toad Species

- A new species of toad, called Bufoides bhupathyi, has been discovered in the Dampa tiger reserve of Mizoram, India.
- This marks the third species in a genus found in the north-eastern region of India.
- The previous two species, Bufoides meghalayanus and Bufoides kempi, were found in Meghalaya.

Draft Green Credit Programme: Implementation Rules

- The Central Government recently proposed Draft Green Credit Programme Implementation Rules.
- GCP aims to promote a sustainable lifestyle through a market-based mechanism.
- As per the scheme, individuals, industries, farmers producer's organisations (FPOs), urban local bodies (ULB), gram panchayats, and the private sector, among a host of other entities, will be able to earn green credit for undertaking environment-friendly actions.
- Green credits generated through such actions can be traded on a domestic market platform.
- These Green Credits will be over and above the current discourse of carbon credits. Any activity generating green credits under the GCP will also receive carbon credits under the Carbon Credit Trading Scheme if it leads to the reduction or removal of carbon emissions.
- The green credits generated or procured by industries, companies and other entities to fulfil any legal obligation cannot be traded.
- Implementing Agency: The Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), an autonomous organisation under the MoEFCC, is responsible for effectively implementing the Green Credit programme, including its management and operation.

Increase of Aerosols in the Hindu Kush-Himalaya-Tibet Plateau Region

- According to a new study conducted by the Indian Space Research Organization's (ISRO) Physical Research Laboratory, the Hindu Kush-Himalaya-Tibetan Plateau region has been experiencing an alarming increase in aerosol levels.
- Aerosols are microscopic solid or liquid particles that are suspended in air or as a gas.
- Aerosols can be natural, such as fog or gas emitted by volcanic eruptions, or manmade, such as smoke produced by the combustion of fossil fuels.

- Aerosol particles are either discharged directly into the atmosphere (primary aerosols) or formed in the atmosphere (secondary aerosols).
- Aerosol particles are tiny but abundant, and they frequently contain a variety of inorganic and organic compounds.
- True aerosol particles have diameters ranging from a few milli micrometres to roughly 1 micrometre (equivalent).

Project Nilgiri Tahr

- Tamil Nadu Chief Minister recently launched 'The Nilgiri Tahr' project for the conservation of Tamil Nadu's state animal.
- Nilgiri Tahr is an endangered mountain ungulate endemic to the southern part of the Western Ghats.
- Scientific Name: Nilgiritragus hylocrius
- Locally, the animal is called 'Varayaadu'.
- They are known for their gravity-defying skills in climbing steep cliffs, earning them the nickname Mountain Monarch.
- It is the state animal of Tamil Nadu.
- Their present distribution is limited to approximately 5% of the Western Ghats in southern India (Kerala and Tamil Nadu).
- Eravikulam National Park in Kerala has the highest density and largest surviving population of Nilgiri tahr.

Breakthrough in Coral Reef Conservation: The International Coral Reef Initiative

- In collaboration with the Global Fund for Coral Reefs (GFCR) and the High-Level Climate Champions (HLCC), the International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI) has created the Coral Reef Breakthrough.
- The Initiative was established in 2023 at the 37th ICRI General Meeting.
- The Coral Reef Breakthrough program is a sciencebased initiative with clear goals for state and nonstate actors to work together to conserve, protect, and restore coral reefs, ensuring their critical contributions to humanity's future.
- With investments of at least USD 12 billion, the Coral Reef Breakthrough intends to safeguard the future of at least 125,000 km2 of shallow-water tropical coral reefs by 2030, thereby supporting the resilience of more than half a billion people worldwide.

Kachchhap (Operation Kachchhap)

• The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) successfully rescued nearly a thousand live young Gangetic turtles in a recent operation dubbed





"Kachchhap," shedding light on the ongoing war against illegal wildlife trade and the protection of these rare creatures.

- The Ganga River system in India is home to 13 different species of turtles, all of which are threatened by habitat loss, overexploitation, and pollution.
- The operation resulted in the recovery of live baby turtles of various species, including the Indian Tent Turtle, Indian Flapshell Turtle, Black Spotted/Pond Turtle, and Brown Roofed Turtle, all of which are listed as vulnerable or nearthreatened on the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List and are protected under the Wildlife (Protection) Act of 1972.

Travel for LiFE Initiative

- The Ministry of Tourism in India will establish a PATA desk to enhance engagement with PATA regarding Travel for LiFE and other tourism-related cooperation.
- Travel for LiFE is a sectoral program launched by the Ministry of Tourism in India in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, the United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO), and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)
- The initiative aims to bring about behavioural changes in both tourists and tourism businesses, focusing on environmental protection and socio-cultural sustainability.
- The program also encourages tourism businesses to adopt sustainable practices and earn certification levels.

FAO Report on Methane Emissions from Livestock and Rice Systems

- A recent FAO paper, "Methane Emissions in Livestock and Rice Systems," emphasizes the considerable climate impact of methane emissions from livestock and rice fields.
- The report, which will be released during the FAO's inaugural 'Global Conference on Sustainable Livestock Transformation' in September 2023, emphasizes the importance of reducing methane emissions in meeting the Paris Agreement's goals, as stated in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's Sixth Assessment Report.

Watermeal: World's Smallest Flowering Plant

• Scientists are conducting research into the potential of watermeal, the world's smallest

flowering plant, as a source of nutrition and oxygen for astronauts.

- Watermeal is an aquatic plant in the Araceae family.
- It is the smallest flowering plant in the world and appears as small green seeds.
- It is often referred to as "duckweed" because it is a favorite food of ducks.
- It flourishes in temperate, sub-tropical, and tropical locations.
- They grow on the surface of lakes, ponds, and marshes.
- It is a very tiny (less than 1 millimeter) light green, free-floating, rootless plant.
- It is branchless and also has no leaves.
- It consists of a single, oval, or spherical frond that floats on the surface of still or slow-moving water bodies.
- It also produces the world's smallest fruit, called a utricle.
- It is a nutritional powerhouse.
- It is a complete protein, meaning that it contains all nine essential amino acids.

International Coral Reef Initiative

- The International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI) said it would secure public and private investment to help conserve and restore coral ecosystems.
- The International Coral Reef Initiative was launched in 1994 by Australia, France, Japan, Jamaica, the Philippines, Sweden, Britain and the United States.
- Its members now include 45 countries that represent three-quarters of the world's coral reefs.
- India is also a member country of this initiative.
- It is a global partnership between Nations and organizations that strives to preserve coral reefs and related ecosystems around the world.
- Its decisions are not binding on its members.
- The work of ICRI is regularly acknowledged in United Nations documents, highlighting the Initiative's important cooperation, collaboration, and advocacy role within the international arena.

Hirakund Wetland: Cancer-Causing Heavy Metals Detected

- A study has revealed high levels of cancer-causing heavy metals, including lead and chromium, in eight wetlands in Odisha, with Hirakud being one of them.
- These heavy metals, which result from human activities such as urbanization, industrialization, and agriculture, can enter crops through the soil and subsequently be consumed by humans.





- The study also noted that the surrounding community indirectly consumes water from these wetlands by consuming foods like fish, rice, vegetables, and spinach grown in them.
- Hirakud Reservoir (Ramsar Site) is the largest earthen dam in Odisha and started operating in 1957.
- Out of the known 54 species of fish from the reservoir, one has been classed as being endangered, six near threatened and 21 fish species of economic importance.
- It also provides important hydrological services by moderating floods in the Mahanadi Delta, the ecological and socio-economic hub of the east coast of India.

Staghorn Coral: Endangered

- A genome-wide survey of highly endangered staghorn coral in the Caribbean has identified 10 genomic regions associated with resilience against white band disease.
- Staghorn coral is one of the most important corals in the Caribbean.
- It, along with elkhorn coral and star corals built Caribbean coral reefs over the last 5,000 years.
- Staghorn coral can form dense groups called "thickets" in very shallow water.
- These provide important habitat for other reef animals, especially fish.
- Staghorn coral colonies are golden tan or pale brown with white tips and they get their color from the algae that live within their tissue.
- These corals have antler-like branches and typically stem out from a central trunk and angle upward.

Ek Tareekh Ek Ghanta Ek Saath Initiative

- The "Ek Tareekh Ek Ghanta Ek Saath" initiative is a massive voluntary effort for cleanliness in India, endorsed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- The initiative encourages citizens to engage in one hour of "shramdaan" (voluntary labour) for cleanliness at 10 am on October 1st as a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi.

DEFENCE AND SECURITY

IAF Deploys Three S-400 Missile Units along China & Pakistan Borders

• The Indian Air Force (IAF) has deployed three S-400 air defense missile squadrons near India's borders with China and Pakistan, a significant upgrade to the country's security system.

- Various groups and organizations, including Resident Welfare Associations, village communities, NGOs, market associations, faith groups, and the private sector, have come forward to participate in shramdaan at different locations.
- Swachhata Pakhwada 2023, with the theme "Garbage Free India," is organized alongside this initiative and has seen the participation of over 31 crore citizens across the nation in various cleanliness-related activities.

UN Bonn Summit

- This framework, known as the Global Framework on Chemicals, includes 28 targets designed to enhance responsible management of chemicals and waste throughout their lifecycle.
- The Bonn Declaration was adopted at the summit, aiming to prevent exposure to harmful chemicals, phase out the most dangerous ones when appropriate, and enhance the safe management of such chemicals where necessary.
- The declaration also encourages countries to support the transition to circular economies and develop substitutes for harmful chemicals to safeguard health, and the environment, reduce waste, and promote recycling efforts.

Kaimur Wildlife Sanctuary: Bihar Second Tiger Reserve

- Bihar is set to get a second tiger reserve in Kaimur district (Kaimur Wildlife Sanctuary) by the end of the year or early 2024.
- Kaimur Wildlife Sanctuary is the largest sanctuarylocated in the Kaimur District of Bihar.
- It is nestled in the Vindhayachal hill ranges.
- The sanctuary forms a very important catchment for theKav, Sone, and Durgawati river systems, with important tributaries.
- It is connected with Chandraprabha Wildlife Sanctuary of UP, which again has links with Sanjay Dubri Tiger Reserve and Panna landscape in Madhya Pradesh through stepping stone forests of Marihan, Sukrit, Chunar ranges and wildlife sanctuaries of Ranipur (UP).



• The Indian Air Force (IAF) has made important efforts to strengthen its air defence capabilities along its borders with China and Pakistan by deploying three of the five S-400 air defense missile squadrons that were agreed upon.





• The delivery plan for the remaining two squadrons, however, has been impacted by the Russia-Ukraine war, and officials from both countries are due to meet soon to resolve the timeframe.

Exercise KAZIND-2023

- A force of 120 personnel from the Indian Army and Air Force left on a mission to Kazakhstan today, in a significant development.
- Their goal is to take part in the seventh iteration of the Joint Military 'Exercise KAZIND-2023.'
- This collaborative effort will take held in Otar, Kazakhstan, from October 30th to November 11th, 2023.

Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) and Safran will collaborate to manufacture aircraft engine parts

- Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) and Safran Aircraft Engines, a leading French aero engine design, development, and manufacturing firm, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) aimed at fostering industrial cooperation and collaboration.
- This strategic cooperation spans several major areas of the aviation industry and marks a watershed moment in India's aerospace landscape.

EU and India Conduct Maiden Joint Naval Exercise in the Gulf of Guinea

- In a landmark demonstration of international collaboration, India and the European Union (EU) recently conducted their first combined naval exercise in the Gulf of Guinea, with the goal of boosting regional maritime security.
- This exercise was a watershed moment in their maritime security collaboration, coming on the heels of the EU-India Maritime Security Dialogue in Brussels.
- On October 24, 2023, the Indian Navy's INS Sumedha, an Offshore Patrol Vessel, joined forces in the Gulf of Guinea alongside ships from three EU member nations.
- The Italian Navy Ship ITS Foscari, the French Navy Ship FS Ventôse, and the Spanish Navy Ship Tornado were among the EU ships that took part.

Exercise Harimau Shakti 2023

• The Indian and Malaysian army have launched "Exercise Harimau Shakti 2023," demonstrating their continued defense cooperation.

- This combined bilateral training exercise, staged at Umroi Cantonment in India, aims to boost military capabilities and improve mutual coordination.
- "Exercise Harimau Shakti 2023" not only enhances military capabilities but also symbolizes India and Malaysia's long-standing relationship, underlining their commitment to regional security and stability.

Defence Minister Inaugurated Indian Military Heritage Festival in New Delhi

- The Indian Military Heritage Festival takes center stage in New Delhi's Manekshaw Centre.
- Defence Minister Rajnath Singh officiated at the occasion, which was also attended by Chief of Army Staff General Manoj Pande.
- The annual 'Indian Military Heritage Festival' was held by the United Service Institution of India (USI), India's oldest tri-service think tank, which has been in operation since 1870.
- This great occasion paid honor to India's rich military past and attempted to encourage the nation's youth.

Mid-Planning Conference for Multilateral Naval Exercise (MILAN) - 24

- From the 19th to the 27th of February 2024, the Indian Navy will organize the Mid-Planning Conference for MILAN 24 (Multilateral Naval Exercise- 2024) in Visakhapatnam.
- This event continues India's long tradition of hosting the MILAN exercise, demonstrating the country's commitment to strengthening international maritime cooperation.
- MILAN, a biennial multilateral naval exercise, was founded in 1995 by the Indian Navy.
- It was initially connected with India's 'Look East Policy.' However, as India's international involvement expanded with Hon'ble PM Narendra Modi's 'Act East policy' and the 'Security And Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR)' program, MILAN opened its doors to participation from Friendly Foreign Countries (FFCs).

In 2023, the Indian Army will be awarded a gold medal. Military Exercise Cambrian Patrol Held in the United Kingdom

• The Indian Army demonstrated its great military skill on the international scene in 2023, when it won a gold medal in the famous Cambrian Patrol





Competition. An elite team from the 3/5 Gorkha Rifles (Frontier Force) participated in the tournament, which was held in Wales, UK, marking a great milestone for the Indian Army.

- The Cambrian Patrol Competition 2023 is renowned as a grueling test of endurance and teamwork, often referred to as the "Olympics of Military Patrolling."
- The Indian Army team competed against a total of 111 teams, including 38 international teams representing special forces and esteemed regiments from across the globe.

Imphal is the Indian Navy's third guided missile destroyer

- Yard 12706 (Imphal), a state-of-the-art stealthguided missile destroyer, was officially given to the Indian Navy on October 20, 2023, in a momentous development for the Indian Navy.
- This historic occasion marks a significant milestone in India's indigenous shipbuilding capabilities, bolstering the country's naval strength in the Indian Ocean region.
- Imphal is the third vessel built by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL) as part of Project 15B.
- The Project is a continuation of the Kolkata class (Project 15A) destroyers that were commissioned in the previous decade.
- Imphal followed the commissioning of Indian Naval Ships Visakhapatnam and Mormugao in the previous two years.

Project 'Udbhav' To Promote "Indianisation"

- The Indian Army recently began 'Project Udbhav,' with the goal of rediscovering India's vast tradition of statecraft and strategic ideas inherited from ancient Indian writings.
- The military-led Project Udbhav intends to derive ideas on statecraft, strategy, diplomacy, and warfare from ancient Indian treatises such as Chanakya's Arthashastra, Kamandaka's Nitisara, and the Thirukkural of Tamil poet-saint Thiruvalluvar.

Iron Sting Weapon Israel

- In a significant development, Israeli military forces have demonstrated the cutting-edge "Iron Sting" technology, designed to remove rocket launchers with extreme precision, for the first time.
- The Magellan team, in collaboration with the Air Force, has effectively stopped a large number of insurgents from using various weapons, including the modern and incredibly accurate mortar shell known as "Steel Sting."

 This deployment is expected to alter land-based warfare by providing military units with their own efficient weapons while reducing accidental impact and civilian harm.

First Vertical Wind Tunnel

- The Vertical Wind Tunnel (VWT) at the Special Forces Training School (SFTS) in Himachal Pradesh was virtually launched by Indian Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande.
- The Indian Army's advanced wind tunnel is the first of its type, and it promises to transform military training procedures.

Indian Navy Launches 25T Bollard Pull Tug 'MAHABALI' in Gujarat

- On the 28th of October 2023, Commodore Sunil Kaushik launched the outstanding vessel, the 25T Bollard Pull Tug dubbed 'Mahabali,' at M/s Shoft Shipyard Pvt Ltd in Bharuch, Gujarat.

Nokia has opened a 6G lab

- For the first time, the HiRISE (High-Resolution Imaging Science Experiment) data was used to provide the most detailed view of the ice's edge as close to the equator as possible.
- The first phase of the SWIM project, completed in 2019, focused on the northern hemisphere.
- The second phase, completed in 2020, includes the southern hemisphere.
