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WEST BENGAL SPECIAL

Tiger Hill

- The National Green Tribunal (NGT) issued notices to several government departments and the district administration of Darjeeling for unplanned activities that have severely deteriorated the environmental status of Tiger Hill.
- Tiger Hill is part of the Senchal Wildlife Sanctuary and was declared a Protected Area in 2017.
- **Tiger Hill, located in Darjeeling, West Bengal**, offers a panoramic view of Mount Everest and Mount Kanchenjunga.
- Tiger Hill is home to several tea estates.

National Green Tribunal (NGT)

- Established in 2010 under the National Green Tribunal Act to handle environmental protection cases.
- The Tribunal has a mandate to dispose of applications and petitions within six months.
- The Tribunal's composition includes a chairperson, ten Judicial Members, and ten Expert Members.
- The tribunal has the power to decide on questions for implementing laws and be heard on all civil cases dealing with environmental issues.
- The tribunal handles all violations related to these laws or any Government decision or order covered under these laws.
- An order can be reviewed as per Rule 22 of the National Green Tribunal Rules or challenged within 90 days before the Supreme Court.
- The principal NGT bench is located in Delhi, with other benches in Bhopal, Pune, Kolkata, and Chennai.
- The tribunal is **governed by principles of natural justice and is not bound by the Indian Evidence** Act.

Climate Budget

- West Bengal's State Finance Department proposes a **separate climate budget at a key inter-departmental workshop.**
- The World Bank to assist in developing the budget.
- West Bengal, known for its vulnerability to climate change, spans across seven agro-climatic zones.
- The finance department emphasizes the importance of comprehensive carbon pricing. Carbon pricing captures external costs of greenhouse gas emissions, such as crop damage, healthcare costs, and property loss.
- All departmental proposals will be incorporated into the final plan and submitted to the State Level Steering Committee for approval.
- West Bengal Pollution Control Board chairman, highlights significant climate changes and the warmest year on record since 1901.

NATIONAL

India's Renewable Energy Sector Growth in FY 23-24

- Renewable energy (RE) contributed 71% of the 26 GW of new power generation capacity added in FY 23-24.
- RE's share in India's total installed energy capacity increased to approximately 33%, surpassing coal for the first time.
- The share of coal in India's total installed capacity has dipped below 50% for the first time, indicating a shift towards cleaner energy sources.
- Government initiatives, declining costs, and growing awareness of the need for clean energy are contributing to the growth of the RE sector.

National Crisis Management Committee (NCMC)

- The National Crisis Management Committee (NCMC) met to discuss the cyclone in the Bay of Bengal.
- The Indian government has established the National Crisis Management Committee (NCMC) to coordinate relief efforts during natural disasters.
- The committee, chaired by the Cabinet Secretary, includes key members such as the Secretary to the Prime Minister, the Secretary of

Cabinet Secretary

- The Cabinet Secretary is the highest-ranking civil servant and executive official in the Indian government, overseeing the Civil Services Board, Cabinet Secretariat, and all Civil Services of India.
- They are chosen by the Prime Minister and serve a maximum of four years.
- Their functions include heading the Cabinet Secretariat, coordinating the central government, chairing the Civil Services Board, Committee of Secretaries on Administration, and Conference of Chief Secretaries of States.

Home Affairs, and the Secretary of Agriculture and Cooperation.

• It also includes the Director of the Intelligence Bureau, the Secretary of the Research and Analysis Wing, and a co-opted member from the Cabinet Secretariat.

Veeranam Lake

- Veeranam Lake, one of Chennai's primary water sources, has run dry.
- It is a water reservoir located in the Cuddalore district of Tamil Nadu.
- The lake was **built in the 10th century by Rajaditya Chola** and his soldiers during a war against Pallava kings.
- The lake receives water from the Vadavaru River and remains dry for most of the year.

Vasuki indicus

- The fossils of a giant predator snake "Vasuki indicus" estimated to be as large as the longest snake ever discovered were found in Gujarat.
- Vasuki indicus, named after the mythical serpent associated with Lord Shiva, belonged to the now-extinct Madtsoiidae snake family.



Internet Shutdowns

- **India recorded the highest number of internet shutdowns globally in 2023**, marking the sixth consecutive year it has held this record.
- The Keep It On coalition reported 116 internet disruptions in India last year, impacting communication, access to information, and economic activities.



• These shutdowns are often implemented by authorities for reasons such as maintaining public order during protests or preventing misinformation during sensitive periods. However, they also draw criticism for curbing freedom of expression and disrupting daily life and business operations.

India's Human Rights Accreditation under Review by UN Body

- The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) of India faces scrutiny from a Geneva-based UNrelated body regarding its accreditation status.
- The Global Alliance of National **Rights** Human Institutions (GANHRI), affiliated with the United Nations, is scheduled to review India's NHRC accreditation. This process happens every five years to ensure compliance with the UN-mandated Paris Principles, which outline the key characteristics of effective national human rights institutions.
- The outcome of the review will determine whether the NHRC retains its "A status" or is downgraded to a "B status." An "A status" allows India to vote at the UN Human Rights Council and other UN bodies, while a "B status" restricts such participation.

BHISHM Portable Hospital

- The Indian Air Force (IAF) conducted its first test of the BHISHM Portable Hospital in Agra, designed to be airdropped from
- aircraft to provide rapid medical response in emergencies.The hospital can accommodate up to 200 casualties and is part of a broader initiative.
- The hospitals are durable, waterproof, and lightweight, allowing quick setup during large-scale accidents.

Outlook Planet Sustainability Summit

- National Human Rights Commission (NHRC)
- The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) was established in 1993 under the Protection of Human Rights Act (PHRA), the NHRC is a statutory body, not a constitutional one.
- Its primary mandate is to protect and promote human rights: "Rights Relating To Life, liberty, equality and dignity of the individual guaranteed by the constitution or embodied in the international covenants and enforceable by courts in India."
 - Functions of the NHRC:
 - The NHRC can investigate human rights violations on its initiative or based on complaints filed by individuals or organizations.
 - Following investigations, the NHRC can recommend appropriate action to the government or relevant authorities, including compensation for victims.
 - The NHRC plays a vital role in educating the public about their human rights through campaigns, workshops, and publications.
 - The NHRC reviews laws and policies to ensure they are consistent with human rights principles and recommends changes where necessary.
 - The NHRC actively monitors the human rights situation in India and issues recommendations to improve it.
 - The **NHRC consists of a Chairperson and eight other members**, selected through a rigorous process by a committee headed by the Prime Minister.



- The inaugural Outlook Planet Sustainability Summit & Awards 2024 recently took place in Goa, organized by the Outlook Media Group and supported by BDO India and IIT Goa.
- The event aimed to recognize the sustainability efforts of government-owned companies.
- Several categories were acknowledged, including Sustainable Governance Champion, Corporate Responsibility Champion, Circularity Champion, and Climate Action Champion.



• Winners included Coal India Limited for Sustainable Governance, NHPC Limited for non-fossil fuel initiatives, GAIL (India) Limited for Corporate Responsibility, Power Finance Corporation Limited for non-fossil fuel sub-category, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited for Circularity, NTPC Limited for Climate Action, and Bharat Electronics Limited for non-fossil fuel award.



INTERNATIONAL

Hokkaido

- Hokkaido, Japan's second-largest island, is experiencing warming due to climate change.
- Sapporo, the main city of Hokkaido, recorded

a temperature of 26 degrees Celsius on April 15, 2024. Hokkaido's climate is subarctic, w



subarctic, with an annual average temperature of 8°C.

- Hokkaido, once considered the "Garden of the Gods," may no longer maintain its wilderness due to warming temperatures.
- The Ainu people, Hokkaido's indigenous population, are likely to be disproportionately affected by climate change.

Fastest-warming Continent

- According to a report by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), Europe experienced an alarming rate of warming in 2023, making it the fastestwarming continent.
- Europe warmed at double the global average rate, marking it as the fastest-warming continent in 2023.
- Some parts of Eastern Europe experienced temperature increases up to 2.6°C above preindustrial levels.
- Europe saw an increased number of days with 'extreme heat stress,' defined by the WMO as when the 'feel like' temperature exceeds 46°C.
- The Alps lost 10% of their glacier volume over the last two years.

Sustainable Finance for Tiger Landscapes Conference

- The Sustainable Finance for Tiger Landscapes Conference held in Bhutan focused on mobilizing financial resources and technical expertise for tiger conservation efforts.
- Attendees included Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, India, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Nepal, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- The countries have pledged \$1 billion over the next decade towards protecting and expanding vital tiger habitats.

World Bank-IMF Spring Meetings 2024

- The World Bank and International Monetary Fund (IMF) held spring meetings in Washington DC, USA.
- Eleven wealthy countries pledged \$11 billion to fund the World Bank's three new financing tools: The Liveable Planet Fund, a portfolio guarantee platform, and a hybrid capital instrument.
- Japan committed to making the first contribution to the Liveable Planet Fund. A coalition of ten multilateral development banks launched a co-financing platform to pull in concessional resources.

Akhal-Teke

- The Akhal-Teke breed is known for its great variety and gradation of colours, particularly golden.





• The art of breeding the Akhal-Teke horse and the traditions of horse decoration were included in the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity last year.

World Press Freedom Index 2024

- The World Press Freedom Index 2024, is published annually by Reporters Without Borders (RSF).
- The index **evaluates 180 countries** based on the freedom and independence journalists have to work and report.
- India ranks 159th out of 180 countries in the World Press Freedom Index 2024, indicating significant challenges faced by journalists.
- No Asian country made it to the Index's top 15 this year, indicating a pervasive challenge to press freedom in the region.
- Norway dominated the World Press Freedom Index, followed by Denmark in second place and Sweden in third place.

India's Participation in Arabian Travel Mart 2024

- The Indian Ministry of Tourism participated in the **Arabian Travel Mart 2024 in Dubai**.
- This participation is a significant step towards boosting India's visibility in the Middle East, a key tourist source region.
- The Ministry launched the "Cool Summers of India" campaign, aiming to break the stereotype of India as a hot destination.
- The campaign focuses on India's diverse summer tourism offerings, particularly the refreshing hill stations and the majestic Himalayas.

Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting (ATCM)

- India hosted and participated in the 46th ATCM in Kochi, Kerala from May 20th to May 30th, 2024.
- The Ministry of Earth Sciences, through the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), served as the primary organizer, demonstrating India's growing role as a responsible stakeholder in Antarctic affairs.

- Over 400 delegates from 56 member nations of the Antarctic Treaty participated in the meeting, facilitating international dialogue and collaboration on vital issues concerning Antarctica.
- India's Antarctic program has a longstanding history dating back to 1981.
- India has established three permanent research stations: Dakshin Gangotri (1983), Maitri (1989), and Bharati (2012).
- The announcement of the upcoming Maitri II station, projected to be operational by 2029, highlights India's interest in expanding its research capabilities in Antarctica.

World-First Laws on Smart Gadget Security

- The UK government has implemented regulations to enhance the security of internet-connected smart devices.
- The laws target both manufacturers and consumers to create a more secure smart device ecosystem.
- Key points include:
- Focus on Minimum Security Standards: All internet-connected smart devices must adhere to established minimum security standards.
- Ban on Weak Passwords: Manufacturers are prohibited from using weak and easily guessable default passwords.
- Prompt for Password Changes: Users will be prompted to change common passwords during the initial setup process.
- The expected benefits include reducing successful cyberattacks, protecting consumer privacy and data, and minimizing potential financial losses from cybercrime.
- The regulations set a precedent for other countries and raise the bar for smart device security globally.

Spain Joins the International Solar Alliance

- Spain's entry to the International Solar Alliance (ISA) as the 99th member marks a significant milestone in the global push for renewable energy adoption.
- The ISA, a member-driven initiative, aims to boost solar energy deployment, expand



energy access, enhance energy security, and facilitate energy transition.

• Currently, 119 countries have signed the framework agreement, and 99 countries have

Moldova

- India and Moldova signed a visa waiver agreement specifically for holders of diplomatic and official passports.
- Once the agreement comes into effect, diplomatic and official passport holders from both countries can travel visa-free to the other nation.
- This move is expected to further strengthen the already friendly relations between India and Moldova.
- The agreement was signed on May 10, 2024, by Shri Pavan Kapoor (India) and H.E. Mrs Ana Taban (Moldova)

- UNESCO has inscribed the Ramcharitmanas, Panchatantra, and Sahṛdayāloka-Locana in the Memory of the World Asia-Pacific Regional Register.
- These works are recognized for their historical, literary, and cultural significance.
- The Ramcharitmanas, composed by Tulsidas in the 16th century, is a foundational text of Hinduism and a cornerstone of Indian literature.
- The Panchatantra, attributed to Pt. Vishnu

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)

- The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) is a specialized agency of the United Nations (UN) that promotes global peace and security through international cooperation in education, arts, sciences, and culture.
- 194 member states and 12 associate members, UNESCO also collaborates with various partners in the non-governmental, intergovernmental, and private sectors. Headquartered in Paris, France.
- Established in 1945 as the successor to the League of Nations' International Committee on Intellectual Cooperation, UNESCO's constitution outlines its goals, governing structure, and operating framework.
- UNESCO supports projects that enhance literacy, provide technical training and education, advance science, protect independent media and press freedom, preserve cultural history, and promote cultural diversity.

<u>Moldova</u>

- Moldova, a landlocked country in Eastern Europe, is bordered by Romania to the west and Ukraine to the north, east, and south.
- It is a unitary parliamentary representative democratic republic with its capital in Chişinău.
 - Moldova is the second poorest country in Europe by GDP per official capita after Ukraine, with much of its GDP dominated by the service sector.
 - It has one of the lowest Human Development Indexes in Europe.





ECONOMICS

Government Expands RoDTEP Scheme

- The Indian government is taking a big step to support e-commerce exports by extending the benefits of the **Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) scheme**.
- This policy aims to make Indian exports more competitive globally. Here's a breakdown of the announcement:
- The RoDTEP scheme will now cover products shipped internationally through courier or ecommerce channels. This includes goods from key sectors like gems & jewellery, pharmaceuticals, leather, textiles, and handicrafts.
- This move is particularly helpful for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). The government estimates it could increase MSME exports by USD 1-2 billion annually. MSMEs often rely on e-commerce and courier services for international sales.

Kutch Ajrakh

- Kutch Ajrakh, a traditional textile craft from Gujarat, has received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- The GI certification was awarded by the Controller General of Patents, Designs, and Trademarks (CGPDTM).
- The GI tag acknowledges the unique characteristics and production methods of Kutch Ajrakh, safeguarding its distinct identity and origin.
- The GI tag recognizes the unique production methods and characteristics of Kutch Ajrakh, but also acknowledges the broader history and presence of the Ajrakh craft.
- The GI tag empowers traditional artisans, protects their craft from imitations, and potentially paves the way for better market access and economic benefits.



DEFENCE & SECURITY

RUDRAM-II MISSILE

- The Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully flight-tested the RudraM-II missile
- It is an indigenously developed solidpropelled air-launched



missile system designed for air-to-surface neutralization of enemy assets.

- It is developed as next-generation antiradiation missiles (NGARMs), targeting and destroying enemy surveillance, communication systems, radars, and command and control centres on the ground.
- The RudraM-I missile has a range of 150 km.

Exercise Tarkash

- India and the US have concluded a joint exercise to counter urban terrorism contingencies, known as "Tarkash" in Kolkata.
- The exercise aimed to build functional relations and enhance interoperability between the two special forces in conducting coordinated counter-terror operations in urban counter-terrorism contingencies.
- The exercise also aimed to improve bilateral cooperation between India and the US in combating terrorism in all its forms and manifestations.
- The exercise involved intense training and mock drills in urban counter-terrorism scenarios, as well as sharing best practices, tactics, techniques, and procedures across a wide spectrum of counter-terror operations in urban environments.



Igla-S Air Defence Systems

- The Indian Army is set to receive **the Russian Igla-S Very Short Range Air Defense (VSHORAD) systems**, a technology transfer agreement between Adani Defence Systems and Technologies Limited (ADSTL) and Russia's Rosoboron export.
- The Igla-S VSHORAD system is a portable missile system designed to counter low-



altitude aerial threats.

- The partial assembly of the Igla-S systems in India signifies progress towards indigenous production capabilities, aligning with the government's vision for Make in India initiatives.
- The delivery of the Igla-S systems follows the resolution of a prolonged payment dispute between India and Russia, expected to streamline future collaborations.

'Red Flag 24' Exercise

- The Indian Air Force (IAF) has joined a 16day multi-nation mega military exercise in Alaska, United States.
- The exercise, known as 'Red Flag 24', aims to provide realistic training to participating forces in a simulated combat environment.
- The IAF has deployed its advanced Rafale fighter jets for the exercise, expected to enhance training experience and interoperability.
- The US Pacific Air Forces reports approximately 3,100 service members are expected to participate, with over 100 aircraft being flown, maintained, and supported.



• The exercise aims to improve interoperability among service members from different nations and enhance combat readiness.



SCIENCE

World's First 3D Printed Space Rocket Engine

- Chennai-based startup Agnikul Cosmos successfully launched the world's first space rocket with a single-piece 3D printed engine.
- The rocket, named Agnibaan, was designed and manufactured entirely in India, marking India's first semi-cryogenic engine-powered rocket.
- Inconel material, known for its oxidation-corrosion resistance, was used in the 3D-printed rocket.
- Agnikul Cosmos became the second Indian private company to launch its rocket into space, following Skyroot Aerospace's launch of the Vikram-S rocket.
- The Agnibaan rocket is a customizable two-stage rocket with a payload capacity of up to 300 kg to low Earth orbits.
- The company was founded in 2017 and specializes in building small launch vehicles for commercial space missions.
- Agnikul designed India's first privately built rocket launchpad, 'Dhanush,' at ISRO's Satish Dhawan Space Center-SHAR.

Gaia BH3

- The discovery of the largest stellar black hole in the Milky Way "Gaia BH3".
- Gaia BH3 is a stellar black hole with a mass 33 times that of the Sun, making it the largest known black hole of stellar origin in the Milky Way.





• It is also the second closest black hole to Earth, located just 2,000 light years away.

WHO Prequalifies Second Dengue Vaccine

- World Health Organization (WHO) has prequalified TAK-003, a second vaccine developed by Takeda Pharmaceuticals, to combat dengue fever.
- The vaccine is a liveattenuated design, containing weakened versions of all four dengue virus serotypes.
- It is recommended for children aged 6 to 16 years due to their higher risk of dengue infection and potentially severe illness.
- The recommended vaccination schedule involves two doses administered three months apart.
 Prior to TAK-003, the only

Dengue Fever

- A mosquito-borne disease caused by the dengue virus, prevalent in tropical and subtropical areas.
- Symptoms appear 3 to 14 days after infection, including high fever, headache, vomiting, muscle and joint pains, and skin itching and rash.
- Recovery usually takes two to seven days. In a small proportion of cases, the disease can develop into severe dengue, causing bleeding, low blood platelets, blood plasma leakage, and dangerously low blood pressure.
- Dengue virus has four confirmed serotypes, with one type providing lifelong immunity, while the others provide short-term immunity.
- Dengue is spread by several species of female mosquitoes of the Aedes genus, principally Aedes aegypti.
- Dengue is endemic in over one hundred countries and is spreading from tropical and subtropical regions to the Iberian Peninsula and the southern states of the US.
- In 2023, over 5 million infections were reported, with over 5,000 dengue-related deaths.

WHO-prequalified dengue vaccine was CYD-TDV, developed by Sanofi Pasteur.

First Lunar Railway System

- NASA plans to construct the first lunar railway system, FLOAT (Flexible Levitation on a Track), to revolutionize payload transport on the Moon.
- The system uses unpowered magnetic robots that levitate over a 3-layer flexible film track, minimizing lunar dust abrasion and wear.
- Key features of FLOAT include Magnetic Levitation Technology, a payload capacity of approximately 1.61 kilometres per hour, and targeted applications for areas where astronauts are active.
- FLOAT is a robotic transport system designed to support daily operations on the lunar surface, transporting materials and facilitating equipment movement.
- The system uses magnetic levitation technology similar to high-speed rail systems, allowing for efficient and reliable transport of payloads across the lunar surface.


- Sunil Chhetri, India's most famous footballer announces his retirement from international football.

Charles Leclerc

- Charles Leclerc, a Ferrari driver, has become the first Monegasque driver to win the Monaco Grand Prix since Louis Chiron in 1931, ending a 92-year drought.
- Leclerc's victory, his first since the 2022 Austrian Grand Prix, came after a chaotic race with two standing starts and several first-lap collisions.
- McLaren's Oscar Piastri finished second, trailing Leclerc by 7.1 seconds, while Ferrari's Carlos Sainz secured third place.

Dipa Karmakar

- Dipa Karmakar, an Indian gymnast, became the first-ever Indian to secure a gold medal in any Asian Championships.
- She won the gold medal in the women's vault individual final at the Asian Women's Artistic Gymnastics Championships 2024 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.
- Karmakar scored an average of 13.566 points, securing the gold medal.
- Karmakar is one of India's most renowned and inspiring women gymnasts.
- She was the first Indian woman gymnast to qualify for the Summer Olympics in 2016.
- In 2018, she won the first gold medal at a global gymnastics event at the FIG World Cup in Mersin, Turkiye.
- She was bestowed with India's highest sports honour, the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award, in 2016.

Sultan Azlan Shah Hockey Trophy

- Japan won the Sultan Azlan Shah Hockey Trophy for the first time, defeating Pakistan 4-1 in a penalty shootout.
- The tournament final was held in Ipoh, Malaysia, on 11 May 2024.
- Six teams participated, including Japan, Pakistan, Canada, South Korea, New Zealand, and Malaysia.
- Japan emerged as the champions, with Pakistan securing the runner-up position.
- Malaysia finished third, followed by New Zealand, South Korea, and Canada.
- India, a regular participant and five-time winner, skipped the tournament to focus on the 2024 Paris Olympics.

Deepthi Jeevanji

- Deepthi Jeevanji, an Indian para-athlete, won the gold medal in the women's T20 400m event at the World Para Athletics Championships 2024.
- Jeevanji's performance set a new world record time of 55.07 seconds, India's first at the event.
- Jeevanji qualified for the finals by setting an Asian record with an impressive time of 56.18 seconds.





Colin Munro

- Colin Munro, a top-order batsman from New Zealand, announces his retirement from international cricket after being overlooked for the upcoming T20 World Cup.
- Munro's career stats include 3,010 runs in 1 Test, 57 ODIs, and 65 T20Is, with an impressive strike rate of 156.44 in T20Is.
- He has scored 10,961 runs from 428 T20s at an average of 30.44 and a strike rate of 141.25.
- His records include the fastest T20I fifty by a New Zealand batsman and the fourth-fastest T20I fifty by a New Zealand batsman.
- He became the first player to score three T20I centuries, cementing his status as one of the most prolific batters in the shortest format of the game.

Thailand Open

- Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, the world's third-ranked Indian badminton pair, won the coveted Thailand Open 2024 men's doubles title. The match took place on May 19, 2024, at the Nimibutr Stadium in Bangkok.
- The 2024 Thailand Open final was the fifth BWF Super 500 final for the Indian pair, showcasing their consistent dominance.
- The victory earned them 9200 ranking points, propelling them closer to the world number one ranking in the men's doubles category.
- The title marked the eighth BWF World Tour title for the Indian pair, following victories at the Swiss Open, Indonesia Open, and Korea Open.

World Football Day

- The United Nations General Assembly unanimously declared May 25 as World Football Day.
- The decision coincides with the 100th anniversary of the first international football tournament with representation from all regions the 1924 Summer Olympic Games in Paris.
- The resolution, introduced by Taher M. El-Sonni, Permanent Representative of the State of Libya to the United Nations, emphasizes the power of football to promote peace, development, and unity.
- The day aims to celebrate diversity and inclusivity, reminding everyone of the sport's universality
- The selection of May 25 as World Football Day holds historical significance, commemorating the first international football tournament with representation from all regions.

Alok Shukla

- Alok Shukla, convenor of the Chhattisgarh Bachao Andolan and founding member of the Hasdeo Aranya Bachao Sangharsh Samiti, has been awarded the 2024 Goldman Prize from Asia for his efforts to save the forests of Hasdeo Aranya in Chhattisgarh.
- The campaign saved 445,000 acres of biodiversity-rich forests from 21 planned coal mines in the central Indian state of Chhattisgarh.
- In July 2022, the government cancelled the 21 proposed coal mines in Hasdeo Aranya, whose pristine forests are one of the largest intact forest areas in India.

- Barman's project focuses on community-driven conservation and empowering local women as conservation advocates.
- The Whitley Awards provide winners with GBP 50,000 in project funding over one year, enhanced visibility, networking opportunities, and training.

Radhika Sen

- Indian Peacekeeper Major Radhika Sen Receives Military Gender Advocate Award.
- Major Radhika Sen, an Indian peacekeeper, received the Military Gender Advocate Award for her exceptional contributions during her deployment with the United Nations Mission in Congo (MONUSCO).
- UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres praised Sen as a role model for her dedication and service.

Sen served as the commander of the Indian battalion in the eastern part of the Republic of Congo from March 2023 to April 2024.

• India ranks 11th in contributions of female military peacekeepers in UN peacekeeping efforts.

Sanjaya Kumar Mishra

• Sanjaya Kumar Mishra, a former Chief Justice, has been appointed as the President of the GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) for a four-year term.

- Eligibility criteria include serving as a Judge of a High Court in India, a retired District Judge or Additional District Judge with a minimum of ten years of combined experience, and a lawyer with ten years of experience specializing in indirect tax litigation.
- The GSTAT is a crucial body established to address disputes arising from the Goods and Services Tax (GST) implemented in India. It functions as the appellate authority, handling appeals against orders passed by the first appellate authority under the Central GST Act and respective State GST Acts.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

- GST is a successor to VAT in India, a destination-based tax collected at the point of consumption.
- It is a multi-stage tax, imposed at every stage of production except the final consumer.
- Goods and services are divided into **five tax slabs:** 0%, 5%, 12%, 18%, and 28%.
- Petroleum products, alcoholic beverages, and electricity are not taxed under GST but are taxed separately by individual state governments.
- The GST Council governs the tax rates, rules, and regulations.
- The Central Goods and Services Tax Bill 2017 (CGST Bill), the Integrated Goods and Services Tax Bill 2017 (IGST Bill), the Union Territory Goods and Services Tax Bill 2017 (UTGST Bill), and the Goods and Services Tax (Compensation to the States) Bill 2017 were passed by the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha respectively.
- The Goods and Services Tax was **launched nationwide on 1 July 2017**.

Jeremiah Manele

- Jeremiah Manele, the new Prime Minister of the Solomon Islands, has been elected after serving as the Foreign Minister for the country.
- Manele, a native of Isabel Province, has a strong background in diplomacy and international relations.
- The election was conducted by the Members of Parliament in a secret ballot, with Manele receiving 31 votes, securing his position as the first Prime Minister from that region. This victory follows the resignation of Manasseh Sogavare, who served as Prime Minister for multiple terms from 2000 to 2024.

Lawrence Wong

- Singapore's new Prime Minister, Lawrence Wong, has been sworn in after two decades of Lee Hsien Loong's tenure.
- Wong took his oath of office at the Istana government office, becoming the second person outside the Lee family to lead the nation.
- Wong, the 4th prime minister in Singapore's history, must lead the PAP to the next general elections, which are not due until November 2025 but could be called as early as this year (2024).

Kapil Sibal

- Senior advocate Kapil Sibal has been elected as the president of the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), marking his fourth term in the position.
- Sibal's previous terms were from 1995-96, 1997-98, and 2001.
- The election was held with 2,330 advocates out of 2,850 members in the voter list. Sibal received 1,066 votes, followed by Pradeep Rai with 689 votes, and the current president, Adish Agarwala, with 307 votes.

Supreme Court of India

- The Supreme Court of India is the highest court in India, responsible for the final appeal of all civil and criminal cases. It has extensive powers in original, appellate, and advisory jurisdictions.
- Under judicial review, the court invalidates both normal laws and constitutional amendments that violate the Basic structure doctrine.
- It is required to safeguard citizens' fundamental rights and settle legal disputes between the central government and state governments.
- The **Supreme Court's decisions are binding on other Indian courts, union, and state governments**. It replaced the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council as the highest court of appeal since January 28, 1950, two days after India was declared a republic.

Klaus Schwab

- Klaus Schwab, the founder and Executive Chairman of the World Economic Forum (WEF), will step down from his day-to-day executive role by January 2025.
- Schwab will take up the role of Chairman of the Board of Trustees, a non-executive role, ensuring he won't be involved in the day-to-day operations of the WEF.
- The transition is part of a planned "governance evolution" aimed at transitioning the WEF from a founderled structure to one where a president and managing board hold full executive responsibility.

World Economic Forum (WEF)

- The World Economic Forum (WEF) is an international non-governmental organization and think tank based in Geneva, Switzerland.
- Founded in 1971 by Klaus Schwab, its mission is to improve the state of the world by engaging leaders from various sectors.
- It is primarily funded by its 1,000 multinational member companies. The WEF is best known for its annual meeting in Davos, Switzerland, which brings together around 3,000 participants including investors, business leaders, politicians, economists, and celebrities to discuss global issues.
- In addition to Davos, the WEF organizes regional conferences and produces reports on various topics. It also facilitates collaboration among stakeholders and promotes sector-specific initiatives.
- Payal Kapadia's film 'All We Imagine as Light' won the prestigious Grand Prix award at the 77th Cannes Film Festival.
- The film, a poignant exploration of two nurses' experiences, was nominated for the Palme d'Or, the highest award at Cannes.
- The film was granted official Indo-French co-production status by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- The festival also celebrated the work of Indian director Shyam Benegal, with his iconic film 'Manthan' showcased in the classic section.
- The Bharat Pavilion, set up by the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC), facilitated over 500 B2B meetings and hosted the inaugural Bharat Parv in Cannes.

Arti

- Arti, an 18-year-old woman from Uttar Pradesh, has been awarded the prestigious Amal Clooney Women's Empowerment Award by King Charles III of the United Kingdom.
- The award ceremony took place at Buckingham Palace in London, England, and celebrated Arti's journey as an e-rickshaw driver.
- Arti was honoured for her role in empowering other young women in her community through the government's Pink E-Rickshaw initiative.
- The Pink E-Rickshaw scheme provides women with e-rickshaws at a low-interest rate loan and a subsidy of Rs. 49,500.



Srinivas R. Kulkarni

- Srinivas R. Kulkarni, an Indian-origin U.S. scientist and brother of renowned author Sudha Murty, has been awarded the Shaw Prize in Astronomy for 2024.
- Kulkarni's groundbreaking work in astronomy includes work on millisecond pulsars, gamma-ray bursts, supernovae, and other transient astronomical phenomena.
- Kulkarni's career spans decades of pioneering research and leadership roles in astronomy.
- The Shaw Prize, established by the late Hong Kong philanthropist Run Run Shaw, consists of three annual awards in Astronomy, Life Science and Medicine, and Mathematical Sciences.
- The 21st edition of the Shaw Prize is scheduled for November 12, 2024, in Hong Kong,



- The United Nations General Assembly first observed the day in 1994 and is celebrating its 30th anniversary.

World Metrology Day

International Day for Biological Diversity

- The International Day for Biological Diversity, observed annually on May 22nd.
- This day raises awareness about the vast array of life on Earth, also known as biological diversity.
- Theme for 2024: "Be Part of the Plan", the year's theme emphasizes the importance of individual and collective action in conserving biodiversity.
- International Day for Biological Diversity serves as a reminder of our responsibility to protect the planet's rich tapestry of life and find solutions to address biodiversity loss.

International Day of UN Peacekeepers

- The International Day of UN Peacekeepers observed annually on May 29th.
- The United Nations General Assembly officially established the day in 2002.

- UN's Department of Peace Operations is responsible for peacekeeping, a tool developed to help countries in conflict create lasting peace conditions. UN peacekeepers can include soldiers, police officers, and civilian personnel.

World No Tobacco Day

- World No Tobacco Day, a global campaign led by the World Health Organization, is celebrated on May 31st.
- The theme for 2024 is "Protecting Children from Tobacco Industry Interference", highlighting the industry's tactics to attract young people.
- The day's roots date back to 1987 when the World Health Assembly called for a global day to highlight the tobacco epidemic.

- <u>Rakesh Ranjan as SSC Chairman</u>: Rakesh Ranjan, a 1992 batch IAS officer from Manipur Cadre, has been appointed as the Chairman of the Staff Selection Commission (SSC). This appointment underscores his

administrative experience and leadership in overseeing recruitment processes.

- <u>Dr. Emmanuelle Soubeyran</u>: France's Dr. Emmanuelle Soubeyran has been elected as the new Director General of the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) for the term 2024-2029. Her election highlights global confidence in her leadership to address animal health challenges worldwide.

- <u>Changes in CoWIN Certificates</u>: The Union health ministry has removed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's image from CoWIN vaccination certificates, replacing it with a quote symbolizing India's collective resolve in combating the COVID-19 pandemic.

- <u>Inauguration of Constitution Park in Pune</u>: The Indian Army and Punit Balan Group inaugurated Pune's first Constitution Park, symbolizing unity and honouring India's founding leaders. Lt Gen Ajai Kumar Singh presided over the inauguration ceremony.
- <u>Renewable Energy Sector in India</u>: India's renewable energy sector contributed significantly to new power generation, accounting for 71% of the new capacity in FY 2023-24. This marks a notable shift with renewable energy surpassing coal's share, reflecting India's commitment to sustainable energy sources.
- <u>'Cool Summers of India' Campaign</u>: Launched at the Arabian Travel Mart 2024, this campaign challenges the perception of India as too hot for summer travel. It promotes hill resorts and other destinations known for their cooler climates, aiming to attract tourists during the summer months.
- <u>Kutch Ajrakh Geographical Indication (GI)</u> <u>Tag</u>: Kutch Ajrakh, a traditional textile craft from Gujarat, has received a Geographical Indication (GI) tag. This recognition highlights its cultural significance and unique craftsmanship in regions like Sindh, Barmer, and Kutch.
- India's Contribution to UN Counter-<u>Terrorism Trust Fund</u>: India has pledged \$500,000 to the UN Counter-Terrorism Trust Fund, reaffirming its commitment to international efforts in combating terrorism. Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj announced this contribution at the United Nations, underscoring India's support for multilateral initiatives against terrorism.
- <u>Hanooman: India's Multilingual GenAI</u> <u>Platform</u>: Launched by 3AI Holding Limited and SML India, Hanooman is an AI platform capable of operating in 98 global languages, including 12 Indian languages. It aims to build a robust GenAI ecosystem in India, leveraging the country's linguistic diversity.



- Unified Portal for Digital Public Goods (DPGs): The Indian government plans to create a unified portal listing all Digital Public Goods (DPGs) such as Aadhaar, Unified Payments Interface (UPI), and Open Network for Digital Commerce. This initiative aims to facilitate easier access to essential digital infrastructure across ministries.
- <u>NTPC Talcher Thermal's "Girl</u> <u>Empowerment Mission 2024"</u>: NTPC Talcher Thermal has launched a mission to support 40 young girls across government schools in four Gram Panchayats. The initiative focuses on providing quality education, health services, life skills training, and mentorship to empower girls in rural areas.
- <u>Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA)</u> <u>Implementation</u>: 14 Indian citizens have been granted citizenship certificates under the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, reducing the qualification period for persecuted non-Muslim migrants from Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Bangladesh from 11 to 5 years.

- <u>BHISHM Portable Hospital Testing by</u> <u>Indian Air Force</u>: The Indian Air Force tested the BHISHM Portable Hospital in Agra, enhancing its emergency medical response capabilities. This portable hospital is designed to provide critical medical care during emergencies and disaster relief operations.
- <u>IndiaAI Mission Approval by Cabinet</u>: India's Cabinet has approved the IndiaAI Mission with an investment of Rs. 10,371.92 crore. This initiative aims to democratize and catalyze India's AI innovation ecosystem, ensuring the global competitiveness of Indian AI startups and researchers.

- <u>Marrakesh Agreement</u>: The World Trade Organization (WTO) celebrated the 30th anniversary of the Marrakesh Agreement, a landmark in global trade history. The agreement aimed to promote sustainable development through trade, raise living standards, and increase employment worldwide.
- <u>G7 Agreement to Phase Out Coal-Fired</u> <u>Power Plants</u>: The Group of Seven (G7) nations have agreed to phase out their coalfired power plants by 2035. This decision aligns with the objectives of the COP28 United Nations climate summit, emphasizing a global transition away from fossil fuels.

- <u>UAE's 10-Year Blue Residence Visa</u>: The UAE Cabinet approved a 10-year Blue Residence visa for individuals who have made substantial environmental contributions. This initiative aligns with the UAE's sustainability goals and promotes environmental protection practices.
- <u>Dengue Vaccine TAK-003</u>: The World Health Organization (WHO) has prequalified TAK-003, the second dengue vaccine developed by

Takeda Pharmaceuticals. It targets children aged 6-16 and consists of weakened forms of four dengue virus serotypes.

- <u>Ibu Volcano Eruption</u>: Indonesia's Ibu volcano on Halmahera Island erupted, prompting evacuations due to the highest alert level. The volcano emitted ash and smoke up to 5,000 meters into the sky, affecting local communities.
- <u>Patanjali Ayurved Products</u>: The Uttarakhand State Licensing Authority suspended manufacturing licenses for 14 products of Patanjali Ayurved Limited and Divya Pharmacy. This action follows repeated violations of the Drugs and Cosmetic Rules, aiming to ensure compliance with regulatory standards.
- <u>GI Tag for Ambaji Marble</u>: Ambaji Marble from Gujarat has been awarded a GI tag by the Central Government, recognizing its unique characteristics and geographical origin. The GI tag is valid for 10 years and highlights the craftsmanship associated with Ambaji Marble.
- <u>Uttarakhand's 'Pirul Lao-Paise Pao'</u> <u>Campaign</u>: The Uttarakhand government launched the 'Pirul Lao-Paise Pao' campaign to address forest fires by incentivizing the collection and utilization of pine needles (Pirul). The campaign involves cooperatives and local organizations, aiming to reduce forest fire risks.

- <u>Hindi Sahitya Bharati Award for Krishna</u> <u>Prakash</u>: Mumbai Police's Krishna Prakash, awarded the Hindi Sahitya Bharati Award, was recognized for his leadership in Force One, the elite counterterrorism unit. He has also organized a festival highlighting the story of Lord Ram through various cultural forms.
- <u>ADB Loan for Sikkim's Electricity</u> <u>Modernization</u>: The Asian Development Bank (ADB) approved a \$148 million loan to modernize Sikkim's electricity supply, supporting the Power for All initiative. The project aims to upgrade power distribution systems, install street lighting, and promote energy conservation.
- <u>India's Potential 3rd Unicorn Porter</u>: Porter, a logistics services platform, is poised to become India's 3rd unicorn with a valuation exceeding \$1 billion in 2024.
