

WEST BENGAL SPECIAL

Appointment of vice-chancellors

- The Supreme Court has appointed former Chief Justice of India, <u>Uday Umesh Lalit</u>, as the chairman of the search and selection committee for appointing vice-chancellors in West Bengal's state-run universities.
- The appointment was made following a special leave petition filed by the West Bengal government under Article 138 of the constitution.
- The six-member committee will prepare a panel of three names in alphabetical order for each vice-chancellor position, with recommended names presented to the Chief Minister.
- The Chief Minister can reject unsuitable names and suggest alternatives to the Chancellor (state Governor). If the Chancellor agrees with a name, the appointment must be made within one week. In case of disagreement between the Chancellor and Chief Minister, the Supreme Court will be the final authority.

Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee

- Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee, former Chief Minister of West Bengal and CPI (M) leader, passed away at the age of 80.
- Bhattacharjee served as the Chief Minister of West Bengal from 2000 to 2011.
- He was the second and last CPI (M) leader to serve as the CM of West Bengal.
- In the 2011 assembly polls, Bhattacharjee-led CPI (M) lost to Mamata Banerjee-led TMC, ending a 34-year communist rule in West Bengal.

UNICEF and West Bengal Partner to Engage Fathers in Breastfeeding

- The West Bengal government has launched a new initiative in collaboration with UNICEF to actively involve fathers in promoting and supporting breastfeeding.
- This effort aims to improve breastfeeding rates and enhance family support for new mothers, thereby contributing to better infant health outcomes.
- Awareness Campaign:
 - Method: Anganwadi workers are educating fathers and other family members about the benefits of breastfeeding.
 - <u>Focus:</u> The campaign emphasizes starting discussions about breastfeeding from conception to build a supportive environment for new mothers.
- Dr. Basab Mukherjee, president of the Bengal Obstetric and Gynaecological Society, refers to breast milk
 as the baby's "first vaccine." It is rich in essential nutrients, and antibodies, and provides crucial early
 protection against diseases.
- UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund) is a prominent global organization dedicated to improving the lives of children and mothers worldwide.
- UNICEF was <u>established in December 1946</u>, by the <u>United Nations</u> Relief and Rehabilitation Administration to address the immediate needs of children and mothers affected by World War II.

Smriti Biswas

- Veteran **actor Smriti Biswas died** on July 3 at the age of 100.
- She was born into a Christian family as Smritirekha Biswas and worked in many Hindi, Marathi, and Bengali movies. She debuted in the film world as a child artist with the Bengali movie Sandhya in 1930.



• Biswas made her acting debut with the 1930 Bengali film Sandhya and appeared last in the 1960 movie Modern Girl (1961).





NATIONAL

eSankhyiki Portal

- The <u>Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) launched the eSankhyiki Portal</u> to enhance user experience and data accessibility.
- This initiative seeks to align India's national statistical system with global standards and practices by leveraging advanced technologies.
- The <u>eSankhyiki Portal is designed to provide real-time data for planners, policy-makers, researchers, and the public</u>. It facilitates a comprehensive data management and sharing system for official statistics.
- The portal aims to improve data accessibility, streamline data management processes, and support decision-making with up-to-date information.

Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY)

- The Union Ministers of State for Health and Family Welfare, Shri Prataprao Ganpatrao Jadhav and Smt. Anupriya Singh Patel unveiled three key initiatives at the Ayushman Bharat Quality Health event.
- The Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY) is a national public health insurance scheme in India that provides free health insurance coverage to low-income earners.
- The scheme, which is part of the Indian government's National Health Policy, was means-tested and launched in September 2018 by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
- <u>The program offers services to 50 crore people</u>, making it the world's largest government-sponsored healthcare program.

Mutual Evaluation Report of India

- India has been recognized for its successful performance in the Mutual Evaluation conducted by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) during 2023-24.
- The evaluation report, adopted during the FATF plenary in Singapore, places India in the 'regular follow-up' category.
- This achievement highlights India's significant progress in combating money laundering (ML) and terrorist financing (TF), marking a key milestone in the country's efforts to enhance its financial integrity.
- <u>About FATF:</u> Founded in 1989, it serves as an international watchdog against money laundering, terrorist financing, and related threats. India has been a member since 2010.

Sampoornata Abhiyan Campaign

- The Sampoornata Abhiyan campaign launched by the NITI Aayog aims to achieve comprehensive coverage of key performance indicators (KPIs) in 112 Aspirational Districts and 500 Aspirational Blocks across India.
- The campaign operates under the Aspirational Districts Programme (ADP) and the Aspirational Blocks Programme (ABP), focusing on improving various developmental indicators in targeted areas.
- Aspirational Districts and Blocks:
 - Aspirational Districts: These are districts identified as lagging in socio-economic development. They require focused attention to improve performance in various developmental parameters.
 - Aspirational Blocks: Similarly, these blocks are selected for their developmental needs, and efforts will be made to uplift their status in alignment with national goals.
- The campaign will run for approximately three months, during which intensive efforts will be made to achieve the desired outcomes across the targeted regions.
- National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog) was established on January 1, 2015, to
 replace the Planning Commission. It serves as the apex body for formulating and monitoring policies
 and programs of the Government of India.



NITI Aayog

- The Union Government has reconstituted NITI Aayog, the think tank of the Union government, reflecting recent changes in the council of ministers.
- <u>Prime Minister Narendra Modi</u> remains the chairperson of NITI Aayog.
- <u>Suman K Bery</u>, an economist, continues in his role as vice-chairperson.
- <u>Full-Time Members:</u> The reconstituted NITI Aayog includes <u>four full-time members</u>.
- There are **15 Union Ministers** who are part of the reconstituted body.
- The NITI Aayog (National Institution for Transforming India) is a policy think tank of the Government of India established to promote cooperative federalism and sustainable development. It was formed on January 1, 2015, replacing the Planning Commission.

Smart Cities Mission

- The <u>Smart Cities Mission (SCM) has been extended until March 31, 2025</u>, marking its third extension. Originally scheduled to end on June 30, 2024, this extension aims to provide additional time for completing and refining urban development projects under the mission.
- It was launched in June 2015, under the Ministry of Urban Development, to enhance urban infrastructure and service delivery through smart technology and innovative solutions.
- <u>Cities across India competed to be selected among the 100 smart cities</u>. This competitive process aimed to incentivize cities to develop and implement innovative solutions to urban challenges.
- Projects under the Smart Cities Mission were chosen based on extensive stakeholder input, ensuring that the needs and preferences of local communities were addressed.

GPAI Ministerial Council

- The 6th meeting of the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI) Ministerial Council was held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. The meeting was conducted in a hybrid format, combining both physical and virtual participation.
- The GPAI aims to support and guide the responsible development and use of artificial intelligence (AI) globally. The organization fosters international cooperation on AI policy and research.

Cabinet Committees

- The Indian Union government has reconstituted its eight key Cabinet committees.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA)</u>: Deals with matters related to the economy, including policy formulation and economic strategies.
 - Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC): Responsible for making senior appointments to various posts, including those in government departments and public sector enterprises.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS):</u> Focuses on matters related to national security, defence, and internal security issues.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Accommodation:</u> Handles issues related to the accommodation needs of ministers, senior officials, and other government employees.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs:</u> Manages parliamentary affairs, including the scheduling of parliamentary sessions and handling of legislative matters.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Political Affairs:</u> Addresses political issues and strategies, including policy and electoral matters.
 - o <u>Cabinet Committee on Investment and Growth:</u> Focuses on promoting investment and economic growth, and addressing related issues.
 - <u>Cabinet Committee on Skill, Employment, and Livelihood:</u> Deals with matters related to skill development, employment generation, and livelihood opportunities.
- The <u>Prime Minister chairs six of the eight committees</u>, reflecting the importance of economic, security, and political matters in the administration's focus.
- The Cabinet Committee on Accommodation and the Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs are exceptions, with their leadership assigned to other senior ministers.



SIGHT Programme

- The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) has issued new scheme guidelines for the implementation of the Green Hydrogen initiative under the Strategic Interventions for Green Hydrogen Transition (SIGHT) Programme.
- The scheme aims to incentivize and boost the production of green hydrogen, which is produced using renewable energy sources, such as solar or wind power, rather than fossil fuels.
- By providing financial support and incentives, the scheme is designed to encourage investments in green hydrogen technology, facilitate research and development, and support infrastructure development for green hydrogen production.

NABARD Foundation Day


- July 12, 2024, marked the 43rd Foundation Day of NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development).
- NABARD was established on July 12, 1982.
- The creation of NABARD was based <u>on the recommendations of the B. Sivaraman Committee</u>, which was formed in 1979 to review and improve rural credit systems.
- NABARD aims to promote sustainable development in agriculture and rural areas through:
 - <u>Financial Support:</u> Providing loans and financial assistance to rural development projects and agricultural activities.
 - <u>Innovative Solutions:</u> Implementing innovative programs and solutions to address the challenges faced in rural development.

Project Swasthya Nagaram

- <u>Telangana launched Project Swasthya Nagaram</u>, an ambitious initiative <u>aimed at creating TB-free</u> <u>municipalities.</u>
- The main goal of Project Swasthya Nagaram is to eliminate tuberculosis in select urban municipalities.
 The project aims to reduce TB incidence by one-third and decrease TB-related mortality within three years.
- The project will utilize a digital app for active TB screening. This modern approach aims to streamline the process of identifying individuals at risk.

Bhoj Wetland

- Bhoj Wetland in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, is at risk of being removed from the Ramsar Convention's list of Wetlands of International Importance.
- Local citizens and environmental groups have voiced their worries about how the road project could harm the wetland's ecological balance and biodiversity.
- The Ramsar Convention
 Secretariat, based in Switzerland,
 has sought clarification from the Indian government regarding the proposed activities and their potential impact on Bhoj Wetland.
- Ramsar Convention is designed to protect wetlands around the world, recognizing their vital role in





maintaining biodiversity, supporting livelihoods, and regulating the environment. <u>The convention was signed in Ramsar, Iran, in 1971.</u>

• As of August 2024, India has designated 85 Ramsar Sites, which are wetlands recognized for their international significance under the Ramsar Convention. These sites are crucial for biodiversity conservation, ecosystem services, and supporting local communities.

Operation Nanhe Farishtey

- Operation Nanhe Farishtey is an <u>initiative launched by the Railway Protection Force (RPF) to rescue</u> <u>children who are at risk while travelling or staying at railway stations across India.</u>
- The primary goal is to identify and rescue children who are in dangerous or vulnerable situations at railway stations and on trains.
- This initiative aims to protect children who may be runaways, missing, left behind, or otherwise in distress, ensuring their safety and providing them with appropriate care.
- After the rescue, children are handed over to the District Child Welfare Committee, which works to reunite them with their families.

Hydropower Stations in Arunachal Pradesh

- India is investing \$1 billion to accelerate the construction of 12 hydropower stations in Arunachal Pradesh.
- The investment aims to boost the region's energy infrastructure and harness the hydroelectric potential of the northeastern Himalayan state.
- The federal finance ministry, led by Nirmala Sitharaman, has approved financial support of up to ₹7.5 billion for each hydropower project.

Ladla Bhai Yojana

- The <u>Ladla Bhai Yojana</u> is a new initiative by the Maharashtra government, announced by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, designed to support young men in the state.
- Benefits of Ladla Bhai Yojana: Monthly Stipend
 - o <u>12th Grade Pass Students</u>: ₹6,000 per month.
 - o <u>Diploma Holders:</u> ₹8,000 per month.
 - o Graduates: ₹10,000 per month.
- Beneficiaries will have the chance to undertake a one-year apprenticeship in a factory. This experience is aimed at enhancing their employability by providing practical work experience.
- The scheme aims to prepare a skilled workforce by offering financial support while the youth gain hands-on experience.

One India-One Ticket Initiative

- Indian Railways, <u>Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC)</u>, and the Centre for Railway Information <u>System (CRIS)</u> have partnered to launch the initiative.
- The One India-One Ticket initiative aims to simplify travel by integrating ticketing systems for both mainline rail and metro services.
- The initiative is designed to enhance convenience for travellers moving between trains and metros, particularly in the Delhi/NCR area.

Haryana Announces Job Quota for Agniveers

- The <u>Haryana government announced that Agniveers will receive a 10% reservation in government</u> **posts** for constables, mining guards, forest guards, jail wardens, and special police officers.
- Industrial units hiring Agniveers at a salary of ₹30,000 per month will receive an annual subsidy of ₹60,000.



- <u>Agnipath Scheme was</u> launched in June 2022, it recruits personnel below the rank of officers for a fouryear tenure in the Indian armed forces. After four years, up to 25% of Agniveers, may be offered a permanent commission based on merit.
 - o Agniveers receive a lump sum of approximately ₹11.71 lakhs (with interest) from the Seva Nidhi upon completion of their tenure.
 - o In case of death on duty, families receive ₹1 crore (including Seva Nidhi) and full pay for the unserved period.

GAINS 2024

- On July 10, 2024, Raksha Rajya Mantri Shri Sanjay Seth inaugurated the GRSE Accelerated Innovation Nurturing Scheme (GAINS 2024) at Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Limited (GRSE) in Kolkata.
- This initiative is a significant step towards fostering technological solutions for shipyard challenges and promoting innovation through Indian start-ups.
- GAINS 2024 aims to encourage Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and start-ups to develop innovative solutions that enhance technological capabilities in ship design and construction.
- The scheme aligns with the broader national objectives of 'Make in India' and 'Start-up India,' leveraging the entrepreneurial ecosystem to address both current and future challenges within the shipbuilding industry.

National Time Release Study (NTRS) 2024

- The <u>Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC)</u> has released the <u>National Time Release</u> <u>Study (NTRS) 2024</u>, highlighting improvements and performance metrics related to the cargo clearance process in India.
- This study is an essential tool for assessing how efficiently cargo is processed through customs and aligns with global standards set by the World Trade Organization (WTO) and the World Customs Organization (WCO).
- A Time Release Study (TRS) measures the time taken for cargo clearance in international trade. It evaluates the efficiency of the cargo release process from the moment the cargo arrives at a customs station until it is officially released for import or export.

Kashmir City Receives World Craft City Certificate

- Kashmir City was awarded the prestigious Certificate of World Craft City by the World Crafts Council International.
- This honour, presented in a grand ceremony attended by notable figures such as Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and Sa'ad Hani Al-Qaddumi, President of the World Crafts Council, marks a significant achievement for the region.
- <u>Kashmir City's new status as a World Craft City positions it as the fourth Indian city to receive this honour</u>. The other Indian cities recognized are Jaipur, Mamallapuram, and Mysore.

Charaideo Maidam

- Charaideo Maidam, a complex of over 90 royal burial mounds in Assam, has been officially recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, marking a significant milestone for the region.
- <u>It is often referred to as the "Pyramids of Assam,"</u> these majestic structures are the final resting places of Ahom kings and nobles who ruled the region for nearly six centuries.
- The Ahom dynasty, which flourished from the 13th to the 18th century, left a legacy in Assam. Their unique burial practices, exemplified by the Charaideo Maidam, provide invaluable insights into their culture, religion, and social structure.
- These mounds, constructed with meticulous care, are not mere burial sites but are revered as sacred places by the Ahom people.





• As of July 2024, there are 43 UNESCO World Heritage Sites in India with the recent inclusion of "Moidams – the Mound-Burial System of the Ahom Dynasty from Assam.


Japan

- Japan is set to introduce new banknotes featuring advanced holography, marking the first redesign in two decades.
- Japan was the first country to use holography that creates a 3D rotating effect on the portraits, significantly elevating the notes' security features. These features are part of Japan's ongoing efforts to combat counterfeiting.
- The currency of Japan is the <u>Japanese yen</u>. It is represented by the symbol ¥.
- Holography is a technique used to create a three-dimensional image of an object, known as a hologram. It relies on the principles of interference and diffraction of light to record and reconstruct the light field reflected off the object.

Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO)

- The 24th Meeting of the Council of Heads of State of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) was held on July 4, 2024, in Astana, Kazakhstan.
- This meeting was an important gathering where leaders from various countries came together to discuss issues related to regional cooperation and security.
- The summit was attended by several key world leaders, including:
 - o Russian President Vladimir Putin
 - o Chinese President Xi Jinping
 - o Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif
 - <u>UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres</u>
 - o <u>India's Representative:</u> Dr S Jaishankar (India's External Affairs Minister), as Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi did not attend the summit.
- Belarus was admitted as the 10th full member of the SCO during this summit. Previously, Belarus had been an observer in the organization.
- <u>The SCO, initially established in 2001 with five member countries,</u> has now expanded to include 10 full members.
- <u>India and Pakistan joined in 2017</u>, Iran became the 9th member in 2023, and Belarus was the latest addition in 2024.







Asian Development Bank (ADB)


- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has signed a \$60 million financing agreement with Aadhar Housing Finance Limited (AHFL) to enhance housing affordability for women in India.
 - o This initiative targets low-income and affordable housing sectors, aiming to address financing gaps and promote home ownership among economically disadvantaged groups.
- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is a regional development bank established in 1966 and headquartered in Manila, Philippines. The bank has grown from 31 to 68 members.
- It is modelled on the World Bank and has a weighted voting system. Japan and the United States hold the largest proportion of shares at 15.571%.

NATO Summit

- The NATO summit, hosted by US President Joe Biden in Washington, DC from July 9 to 11, 2024, marks a historic event for the alliance.
- The summit is notable for <u>Sweden's inclusion as a new member</u> and aims to reinforce NATO's commitment to supporting Ukraine amidst ongoing global challenges.
- The summit also commemorates NATO's 75th anniversary, emphasizing the alliance's continued relevance in Euro-Atlantic security.
- The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), also known as the North Atlantic Alliance, is an intergovernmental military alliance <u>consisting of 32 member states</u>, including 30 European and 2 North American countries.
- NATO was established after World War II, NATO implemented the North Atlantic Treaty, signed in 1949.
 As a collective security system, its member states agree to defend each other against third-party attacks.

World Network of Biosphere Reserves

- The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has recently approved the designation of 11 new Biosphere Reserves across 11 countries.
- This expansion brings the total number of sites in the World Network of Biosphere Reserves to 759, spanning 136 countries.

- The <u>World Health Organization (WHO) has launched the</u> <u>Medical Devices Information System</u> (<u>MeDevIS</u>), an innovative online platform designed to provide comprehensive, standardized information on medical devices.
- This initiative represents a significant advancement in global health technology management, offering a centralized resource for governments, regulators, healthcare providers, and users.
- The platform includes information on <u>2,301 types of medical devices</u>, addressing various health conditions such as reproductive, maternal, newborn, and child health, noncommunicable diseases (e.g., cancer, cardiovascular diseases, diabetes), and infectious diseases (e.g., COVID-19).

United Nations' World Population Prospects 2024 report

- According to the United Nations' World Population Prospects 2024 report, <u>India's population stands at approximately 1.45 billion.</u>
 - o It is expected to increase to 1.69 billion by 2054 and peak at around 1.7 billion in the early 2060s.
 - After peaking, India's population is projected to decline by about 12%, reaching around 1.5 billion by 2100.
- China's population, currently 1.41 billion, is projected to decrease to 1.21 billion by 2054 and further decline to 633 million by 2100 due to its low fertility rate.
- The global population is anticipated to peak at 10.3 billion in the mid-2080s before slightly declining to 10.2 billion by 2100.
- The United States, currently the third most populous country, is expected to be overtaken by Pakistan by 2054.
- By the late 2070s, the number of people aged 65 and older will surpass the number of children under 18.



Loss and Damage Fund

- The Philippines has been chosen to host the board of the Loss and Damage fund, established through U.N. climate negotiations.
- This fund aims to offer financial assistance to countries struggling to cope with the adverse effects of climate change, including extreme weather events like typhoons and floods.
- The Philippines, an archipelago of over 7,600 islands, is particularly vulnerable to climate change-related disasters. The country frequently experiences severe typhoons and other climateinduced events, highlighting the importance of the fund in supporting its resilience and recovery
- The establishment of the fund at COP27 in Egypt in 2022 was a step forward, but detailed mechanisms for its implementation are still being discussed.

What is "loss and damage"?

The phrase refers to costs already being incurred from climatefuelled weather extremes or impacts, like rising sea levels

- Climate funding so far has focused on cutting CO2 emissions, while a third of it went towards helping communities adapt to future impacts
- Loss and damage funding is expected to cover the cost of damage that countries cannot avoid or adapt to
- A report by 55 vulnerable countries estimated that their combined climate-linked losses in the last two decades totalled



\$525 billion, or 20% of their collective GDP. This could go upto \$580 billion per year by 2030

Vulnerable countries and campaigners argue that rich countries that caused the bulk of climate change with their historical greenhouse gas emissions should pay

World's First 3D-Printed Electric Abra

- Dubai's Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) has launched the world's first electric abra manufactured using 3D technology.
- This innovative abra, designed to preserve the traditional abra identity while incorporating modern technology, is currently undergoing trial
- The electric abra supports RTA's environmental sustainability strategy by introducing a cleaner, more efficient mode of transport.



Global Conference on Space Research

- The 45th Scientific Assembly of the Committee on Space Research (COSPAR) took place in Busan, South Korea, marking the first time the country has hosted this prestigious global space research conference.
- The event gathered 3,000 scientists and industry leaders from 60 nations, highlighting South Korea's increasing prominence in the space research community.

Henley Passport Index 2024

- The Henley Passport Index ranks passports based on how many countries their holders can visit without needing a visa.
- In 2024, Singapore holds the top spot for the most powerful passport, providing visa-free or visa-onarrival access to 195 destinations.
- <u>India ranks 82nd, allowing visa-free entry to 58 countries</u>. This ranking reflects India's moderate level of global mobility compared to other countries.
- Afghanistan remains at the bottom of the index, with visa-free access to only 26 countries, indicating limited global mobility.

Travel and Tourism Development Index

- In the 2024, Travel and Tourism Development Index (TTDI) released by the World Economic Forum (WEF), India has been ranked 39th out of 119 countries.
- In 2021, India was ranked 54th, so moving up to 39th place is a significant improvement. This jump of 15 places in three years indicates progress in various aspects of the tourism sector.



- Globally, there were 975 million international tourist arrivals in 2022. India welcomed 14.3 million of these tourists, holding a 1.47% share of the global market. In the Asia & Pacific region, India's share was 15.66% in 2022.
- The World Economic Forum (WEF) is an international non-governmental organization based in Cologny, Geneva, Switzerland. Founded by German engineer Klaus Schwab on January 24, 1971.

Project Nexus

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), the Bank for International Settlements (BIS), and the central banks of Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand are collaborating on Project Nexus. An agreement was signed in Basel, Switzerland.
- The platform is <u>expected to go live by 2026 and will interlink domestic fast payment systems (FPS) of Malaysia</u>, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and India.
- Project Nexus aims to make retail cross-border payments more efficient, faster, and cost-effective.

MSME Sahaj Portal

- State Bank of India (SBI) has launched the MSME Sahaj portal, a 15-minute online loan solution for MSMEs.
- The platform allows MSMEs to secure up to ₹1 lakh against GST invoices within 15 minutes, using automated processing and data-driven credit assessments.
- The platform is available through SBI's digital platform Yono, targeting existing micro SME units and facilitating instant cash flow enhancements.

Cleanest Country

- The <u>Environmental Performance Index (EPI)</u> measures the effectiveness of a country's environmental policies by evaluating various environmental outcomes.
- <u>Developed by Yale and Columbia Universities in collaboration with global institutions</u>, the EPI provides a comprehensive assessment of national sustainability efforts.

• In response to the increasing incidents of cyber fraud, <u>Punjab National Bank (PNB) has launched the</u> 'Safety Ring' security feature.



- This optional mechanism provides an added layer of protection against unauthorized access, specifically designed to minimize potential financial losses for users of PNB's internet and mobile banking services.
- The 'Safety Ring' feature allows customers to set a daily transaction limit for their term deposits (TDs), specifically focusing on online closure or overdraft facilities.

AgriSURE

- The Government of India is set to launch a new initiative, the 'Agri Fund for Start-Ups & Rural Enterprises' (AgriSURE), aimed at boosting innovation and sustainability in India's agricultural sector.
- This initiative is designed to support start-ups and agripreneurs through a mix of sector-specific and sector-agnostic investments in Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs), along with direct equity support for start-ups in agriculture and allied sectors.
- The fund will have an initial value of ₹750 crore, with contributions from NABARD, the Ministry of Agriculture, and other institutions, each providing ₹250 crore.
- As part of the initiative, AgriSURE Greenathon 2024 was launched to promote innovation by addressing key challenges in agriculture through a hackathon.

SDG India Index 2023-24

- The <u>SDG India Index 2023-24</u> released by <u>NITI Aayog</u> highlights significant progress in India's efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- The overall score for India has improved to <u>71</u>, up from <u>66 in 2020-21</u> and <u>57 in 2018</u>. Key advancements were observed in areas such as poverty alleviation, health, water, and sanitation
- State-wise Progress:
 - o 32 States and Union Territories (UTs) have achieved scores between 65 and 99.
 - o <u>Uttar Pradesh</u>, <u>Jammu & Kashmir</u>, <u>and West Bengal</u> were notable for their significant improvements, positioning them as front runners in the SDG performance index.
- The score for Climate Action increased from <u>54 to 67</u>, reflecting enhanced disaster preparedness and greater adoption of renewable energy sources.
- The SDG India Index remains a crucial tool for evaluating progress and guiding policy decisions towards achieving the <u>2030 Agenda</u>. The continued focus will be on <u>inclusive growth</u> and environmental sustainability.
- Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):
 - o The SDGs comprise <u>17 goals</u> established by the United Nations.
 - o The SDGs include <u>169 targets</u> across all goals to guide national and global efforts towards sustainable development.
 - o The SDGs aim to address global challenges, including **poverty**, **inequality**, **climate change**, **environmental degradation**, **peace**, **and justice**.
 - The SDGs were adopted by all UN member states in <u>2015</u> as part of the <u>2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development</u>.

Summary of Economic Survey 2023-24

- The Economic Survey for 2023-24, tabled by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on July 22, 2024, provides a comprehensive look at India's economic performance and future outlook.
- The Economic Survey is a comprehensive report that provides an overview of the Indian economy's performance over the past financial year. It is presented in Parliament every year just before the Union Budget.



• The Survey is <u>prepared under the guidance of the Chief Economic Adviser of India and presented by the Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance</u>. It is submitted to both Houses of Parliament during the Budget Session.

Background

- **Initial Presentation**: The first Economic Survey was presented in the financial year 1950-51, initially as part of the Union Budget.
- Separation from Budget: In 1964, the Economic Survey was separated from the Union Budget. Since then, it has been presented each year during the Budget Session, before the presentation of the budget.
- **Non-Binding Nature**: While the Economic Survey is a significant document, it is non-binding. This means that its recommendations and analyses do not have to be followed by the government, but it is constructed and presented each year due to their substantial value in economic planning and policy-making.

State of the Economy

- <u>GDP Growth Projection:</u> The Economic Survey projects a real GDP growth of 6.5–7% for the upcoming period. This projection is conservative compared to higher market expectations, suggesting a cautious but positive outlook.
- Momentum Maintenance: India's economy has maintained its growth momentum from FY23 into FY24.
 This stability is attributed to macroeconomic stability, which has minimized the impact of external challenges.
- **Real GDP Growth:** In FY24, India's real GDP grew by 8.2%, surpassing the 8% mark in three out of four quarters. This performance indicates a robust economic expansion.
- Gross Value Added (GVA): GVA, a measure of the value of goods and services produced in the economy, grew by 7.2% (at 2011-12 prices). Net taxes, adjusted for constant prices, saw a significant increase of 19.1%, highlighting effective fiscal measures.
- <u>Inflation Management:</u> Retail inflation decreased from 6.7% in FY23 to 5.4% in FY24. This reduction was achieved through effective administrative and monetary policies, indicating successful inflation control measures.
- <u>Current Account Deficit (CAD):</u> CAD improved to 0.7% of GDP in FY24 from 2.0% in FY23. This improvement reflects better external sector performance and effective management of trade and capital flows.
- <u>Post-Pandemic Recovery:</u> The real GDP in FY24 was 20% higher than in FY20, showcasing a significant recovery from the pandemic's economic impact, which few major economies have matched.
- <u>Tax Collection:</u> Tax collection was evenly split between direct taxes (55%) and indirect taxes (45%). This balanced tax structure reflects a diverse revenue base for the government.
- <u>Welfare Programs:</u> The government provided free food grains to 81.4 crore people and increased capital expenditure progressively, demonstrating a commitment to social welfare and infrastructure development.

Monetary Management and Financial Intermediation

- <u>Banking Sector Performance:</u> India's banking and financial sectors performed exceptionally well in FY24, reflecting strong financial health and stability.
- <u>Policy Rate:</u> The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) kept the policy repo rate steady at 6.5%, maintaining stability in monetary policy.
- <u>Credit Growth:</u> Credit disbursal by Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) reached ₹164.3 lakh crore, growing by 20.2% by March 2024. This indicates credit expansion and financial sector dynamism.
- **Broad Money (M3) Growth:** M3, a measure of the money supply, grew by 11.2% year-over-year as of March 22, 2024, excluding the HDFC merger. This growth reflects increased liquidity in the economy.
- Non-Performing Assets (NPA): Both gross and net NPAs reached multi-year lows, indicating improved asset quality and risk management in the banking sector.



- **Agriculture Credit:** Agriculture and allied activities saw a double-digit credit growth, highlighting support for the agricultural sector.
- <u>Industrial Credit:</u> Industrial credit growth was 8.5%, up from 5.2% the previous year, indicating increased investment in the industrial sector.
- <u>Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC):</u> 31,394 corporate debtors involving ₹13.9 lakh crore were resolved by March 2024, demonstrating the effectiveness of the IBC in addressing corporate insolvencies.
- <u>Capital Markets:</u> Primary capital markets facilitated capital formation of ₹10.9 lakh crore in FY24, reflecting active market participation and investment.
- <u>Market Capitalisation:</u> India's stock market capitalisation to GDP ratio is the fifth largest globally, indicating significant market depth and investor confidence.
- <u>Financial Inclusion</u>: Digital Financial Inclusion (DFI) is identified as a key challenge for sustainable economic growth, emphasizing the need for broadening access to financial services.

Prices and Inflation

- <u>Retail Inflation:</u> Retail inflation was maintained at 5.4% in FY24, the lowest since the pandemic. Effective policy interventions contributed to this control.
- <u>Fuel Prices:</u> The central government reduced LPG cylinder prices by ₹200 in August 2023 and cut petrol and diesel prices by ₹2 per litre, helping to keep fuel inflation low.
- <u>LPG and Fuel Inflation:</u> Price reductions in LPG and fuels contributed to controlling inflation in these sectors.
- <u>Core Inflation:</u> Core services inflation eased to a nine-year low, and core goods inflation declined to a four-year low, reflecting reduced price pressures in non-food sectors.
- <u>Food Inflation</u>: Food inflation increased from 6.6% in FY23 to 7.5% in FY24 due to extreme weather events affecting farm output, indicating challenges in food price stability.
- <u>Inflation Management:</u> Measures such as dynamic stock management, open market operations, and subsidized food items helped mitigate the impact of rising food inflation.
- <u>State Inflation:</u> 29 states and UTs recorded inflation below 6% in FY24, reflecting regional variations in inflation control.

External Sector

- <u>Geopolitical Challenges:</u> Despite geopolitical headwinds, India's external sector remained robust, indicating resilience in international economic relations.
- <u>Logistics Performance Index:</u> India improved its Logistics Performance Index rank from 44th in 2018 to 38th in 2023 out of 139 countries, reflecting better logistics and supply chain management.
- <u>Current Account Deficit:</u> CAD improved to 0.7% of GDP in FY24 due to moderated imports and rising services exports, demonstrating effective external sector management.
- Global Export Share: India's share in global goods exports was 1.8% in FY24, reflecting a significant but moderate presence in international markets.
- <u>Services Exports:</u> Services exports grew by 4.9% to USD 341.1 billion, driven by IT/software services and other business services, highlighting strength in the services sector.
- <u>Remittances:</u> India is the top global remittance recipient, with USD 120 billion in 2023, underscoring the importance of remittances in the economy.
- External Debt: The external debt to GDP ratio was 18.7% at the end of March 2024, indicating manageable external debt levels.

Medium-Term Outlook

- <u>Policy Focus Areas:</u> Key areas include job and skill creation, leveraging agricultural potential, addressing MSME challenges, transitioning to green growth, managing China relations, expanding the corporate bond market, tackling inequality, and improving youth health.
- <u>Amrit Kaal Strategy:</u> The strategy focuses on six areas: boosting private investment, expanding MSMEs, utilizing agriculture as a growth engine, financing the green transition, bridging the education-employment gap, and enhancing state capacity.



• <u>Growth Compact:</u> To achieve 7%+ growth, a tripartite compact between the Union Government, State Governments, and the private sector is essential. This collaborative approach aims to sustain high growth rates and address economic challenges.

Climate Change and Energy Transition

- <u>Climate Action Recognition:</u> India is notable for aligning with the global target of limiting warming to 2°C above pre-industrial levels, a commitment that underscores its leadership in climate action among G20 nations.
- Renewable Energy: As of May 31, 2024, non-fossil sources of energy constituted 45.4% of India's installed electricity generation capacity. This indicates significant progress in transitioning towards cleaner energy sources.
- <u>Emission Reduction:</u> India achieved a 33% reduction in the emission intensity of GDP from 2005 levels by 2019. This metric reflects the country's commitment to reducing emissions relative to economic output.
- <u>Energy Savings:</u> India saved 51 million tonnes of oil equivalent annually, translating to cost savings of ₹1,94,320 crore. This reflects the effectiveness of energy efficiency measures and conservation efforts.
- Green Bonds: India issued green bonds amounting to ₹16,000 crore in January-February 2023 and ₹20,000 crore in October-December 2023. These bonds support environmentally sustainable projects and investments.

Social Sector

- <u>Welfare Impact:</u> Digitization has enhanced the effectiveness of spending on healthcare, education, and governance, ensuring more efficient use of resources.
- Welfare Expenditure Growth: From FY18 to FY24, welfare expenditure grew at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 12.8%, outpacing the nominal GDP growth of 9.5% CAGR, indicating a substantial increase in investment in social welfare.
- <u>Inequality Reduction:</u> The Gini coefficient, a measure of income inequality, decreased both in rural (from 0.283 to 0.266) and urban (from 0.363 to 0.314) areas, showing progress in reducing inequality.
- **Ayushman Bharat:** The Ayushman Bharat scheme has generated 34.7 crore cards and facilitated 7.37 crore hospital admissions, providing significant health coverage.
- <u>Mental Health Coverage:</u> The scheme covers 22 mental disorders under Ayushman Bharat PMJAY, enhancing mental health support.
- <u>Early Childhood Education:</u> The 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi' program aims to create a large, high-quality preschool network at Anganwadi Centres, improving early childhood education.
- <u>Vidyanjali Initiative:</u> This initiative has enhanced educational experiences for 1.44 crore students through community engagement, promoting better learning environments.
- <u>Higher Education Enrolment:</u> Enrollment growth among underprivileged sections (SC, ST, OBC) increased by 31.6% since FY15, indicating improved access to higher education.
- <u>R&D Progress:</u> Nearly one lakh patents were granted in FY24, up from less than 25,000 in FY20, reflecting increased innovation and research activity.
- <u>Housing and Roads:</u> Under PM-AWAS-Gramin, 2.63 crore houses were constructed, and 15.14 lakh km of roads were completed under the Gram Sadak Yojana since 2014-15, enhancing infrastructure and housing.

Employment and Skill Development

- <u>Labour Market Improvement:</u> The unemployment rate declined to 3.2% in 2022-23, indicating improvements in job availability.
- <u>Urban Unemployment:</u> Urban unemployment fell to 6.7% for the quarter ending March 2024, reflecting better job prospects in cities.
- <u>Workforce Distribution:</u> As of the latest data, 45% of the workforce is in agriculture, 11.4% in manufacturing, 28.9% in services, and 13% in construction.



- <u>Youth Unemployment:</u> Youth unemployment decreased from 17.8% in 2017-18 to 10% in 2022-23, showing progress in job creation for younger demographics.
- <u>EPFO Payroll:</u> Significant growth in new EPFO (Employees' Provident Fund Organisation) subscribers, particularly in the 18-28 age group, indicates a rise in formal employment.
- <u>Female Labour Force Participation:</u> Female labour force participation has been rising steadily for six years, suggesting improved gender inclusion in the workforce.
- <u>Manufacturing Sector Recovery:</u> Employment in the organized manufacturing sector has surpassed pre-pandemic levels, signalling recovery and growth in this industry.
- <u>Wages Growth:</u> Rural wages grew at a CAGR of 6.9%, and urban wages grew at 6.1% CAGR, reflecting positive wage trends.
- <u>Factories Growth:</u> The number of factories employing over 100 workers increased by 11.8% from FY18 to FY22, indicating growth in large-scale industrial operations.
- <u>EPFO Membership:</u> EPFO membership grew at an 8.4% CAGR between FY15 and FY24, reflecting an expansion in the formal employment sector.
- <u>Job Generation Requirement:</u> An estimated 78.5 lakh jobs are needed annually in the non-farm sector until 2030 to meet employment demands.

Agriculture and Food Management

- **Agriculture Growth:** Agriculture has grown at an average annual rate of 4.18% over the past five years, reflecting steady progress in the sector.
- <u>Agricultural Credit:</u> Total credit disbursed to agriculture amounted to ₹22.84 lakh crore as of January 31, 2024, showing substantial financial support for the sector.
- <u>Kisan Credit Cards:</u> 7.5 crore Kisan Credit Cards (KCCs) have been issued, with a credit limit of ₹9.4 lakh crore, enhancing access to finance for farmers.
- <u>Micro Irrigation:</u> The 'Per drop more crop' initiative covered 90 lakh hectares from 2015-16 to 2023-24, promoting efficient water use in agriculture.

Industry

- <u>Industrial Growth:</u> The industrial sector grew by 9.5%, supporting overall economic growth of 8.2% in FY24, indicating strong industrial performance.
- <u>Manufacturing Sector:</u> The manufacturing sector achieved an average annual growth rate of 5.2% over the last decade, reflecting consistent growth.
- <u>Coal Production:</u> Accelerated coal production has reduced import dependence, enhancing energy security.
- <u>Pharmaceutical Market:</u> India is the third largest pharmaceutical market by volume, valued at USD 50 billion, highlighting its global prominence in pharmaceuticals.
- <u>Clothing Manufacturing:</u> India is the second-largest clothing manufacturer globally and among the top five exporters, demonstrating its significant role in the global apparel market.
- <u>Electronics Manufacturing:</u> Electronics manufacturing accounts for 3.7% of the global market share as of FY22, indicating growth in this sector.
- <u>PLI Schemes:</u> Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes attracted over ₹1.28 lakh crore of investment until May 2024, leading to production/sales of ₹10.8 lakh crore and creating over 8.5 lakh jobs.

Services

- <u>Services Sector Contribution:</u> The services sector contributed 55% of the overall Gross Value Added (GVA), returning to pre-pandemic levels and showing resilience.
- <u>Active Companies:</u> 65% of the highest number of active companies are in the services sector, reflecting its dominance in the corporate landscape.
- <u>Global Services Exports:</u> India's share of global commercial services exports was 4.4% in 2022, indicating its significant role in international services trade.



- <u>Computer and Business Services Exports:</u> Computer and business services exports constituted 73% of India's services exports, with a 9.6% year-over-year growth, highlighting strength in IT and business services.
- **Aviation Sector Growth:** The aviation sector saw a 15% year-over-year increase in total air passengers handled, reflecting a recovery and growth in travel.
- <u>Services Sector Credit:</u> Credit to the services sector reached ₹45.9 lakh crore in March 2024, with a 22.9% year-over-year growth, supporting sectoral expansion.

Infrastructure

- <u>Public Sector Investment:</u> The public sector plays a crucial role in funding large-scale infrastructure projects, and driving economic development.
- National Highway Construction: The pace of national highway construction increased to around 34 km per day by FY24, improving road infrastructure.
- Railway Capital Expenditure: Railway capital expenditure increased by 77% over the past five years, reflecting significant investment in railway infrastructure.
- <u>Airport Infrastructure:</u> New terminal buildings at 21 airports have expanded passenger handling capacity by 62 million per annum, enhancing air travel infrastructure.
- Clean Energy Investment: ₹8.5 lakh crore (USD 102.4 billion) was invested in clean energy between 2014 and 2023, supporting the transition to sustainable energy sources.



Climate Change and India

- <u>Global Climate Strategies:</u> The chapter critiques global climate strategies as flawed and not universally applicable, noting that overconsumption is not adequately addressed.
- <u>India's Ethos:</u> India emphasizes a harmonious relationship with nature, contrasting with overconsumption cultures prevalent in other parts of the world.
- <u>Sustainable Housing:</u> There is a shift towards traditional multi-generational households, reflecting a focus on sustainable living practices.
- <u>Mission LiFE:</u> The Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment) initiative promotes mindful consumption and a harmonious relationship with nature, aiming to address global climate change through behavioural changes.

Union Budget 2024-2025

- On July 23, 2024, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Union Budget for the fiscal year 2024-25. This marked her seventh consecutive Budget presentation, surpassing former Prime Minister Morarji Desai's record.
- <u>The budget focuses on five key areas:</u> Employment, Skilling, MSMEs (Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises), and Middle Class.
- **Inflation Target:** Aiming for inflation to move towards a 4% target.
- <u>Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY):</u> Extension of PMGKAY for five more years, benefiting over 80 crore people.



- According to Article 112 of the Indian Constitution, the budget is referred to as the <u>Annual Financial Statement</u> of the government. This term encompasses the government's planned expenditures and projected revenues for a financial year.
- <u>Department of Economic Affairs</u>, Ministry of Finance, is responsible for preparing the budget. The <u>Budget Division</u> of this department creates the budget based on detailed estimates of expenditures and receipts from various departments and ministries.

Types of Budgets:

Revenue Budget:

- o Includes all revenue receipts (tax and non-tax) and revenue expenditure (spending on day-to-day operations).
- o **Tax Revenue**: Income from taxes such as income tax, GST, etc.
- Non-Tax Revenue: Income from sources other than taxes like fees, fines, and dividends from government-owned enterprises.

• Capital Budget:

- o Comprises capital receipts (funds received from borrowing, disinvestment, etc.) and capital expenditure (spending on infrastructure projects, long-term investments).
- o Capital Receipts: Include borrowings and loans.
- o Capital Expenditure: Includes spending on projects that create assets or reduce liabilities.

Major Budget Documents:

- <u>Annual Financial Statement</u>: Under Article 112, it outlines the government's planned receipts and expenditures.
- <u>Demands for Grants</u>: Under Article 113, these are requests from various government departments for budgetary allocations.
- Finance Bill: Under Article 110, it contains proposals for changes in taxation.

Key Figures

• Total Receipts (excluding borrowings): ₹32.07 lakh crore

This is the total revenue the government expects to receive, excluding any borrowing. It includes tax revenues, non-tax revenues, and other receipts.

• Total Expenditure: ₹48.21 lakh crore

This represents the total amount the government plans to spend. It includes both capital and revenue expenditure.

• Net Tax Receipt: ₹25.83 lakh crore

This is the total amount the government expects to collect in taxes after adjusting for refunds and other tax-related adjustments.

• Fiscal Deficit: 4.9% of GDP

- o The fiscal deficit is the difference between the government's total expenditure and total receipts (excluding borrowings). It reflects the extent to which the government is borrowing to meet its expenditure. The fiscal deficit is expected to be reduced to below 4.5% of GDP in the next fiscal year.
- <u>Inflation Rate:</u> Low and stable, targeting 4%, with core inflation at 3.1%
 - o Inflation is currently stable and moving towards the target rate of 4%. Core inflation, which excludes food and fuel prices, is at 3.1%, indicating stable price levels for essential goods and services.

Focus Areas

The budget highlights four key areas for development:

- Employment
- Skilling
- MSMEs (Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises)
- Middle Class

Prime Minister's Package of 5 Schemes



These schemes aim to enhance employment opportunities and skill development for 4.1 crore youth over five years:

- <u>Scheme A First Timers:</u> Provides a one-time payment of up to ₹15,000, distributed in three instalments, to first-time employees registered with the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO). This aims to ease the initial financial burden on new employees.
- Scheme B Job Creation in Manufacturing: Offers incentives to both employees and employers based on EPFO contributions for the first four years of employment. This scheme encourages job creation in the manufacturing sector.
- Scheme C Support to Employers: Reimburses up to ₹3,000 per month for two years towards EPFO contributions for each additional employee hired. This reduces the financial burden on employers and encourages hiring.
- New Skilling Scheme: Aims to skill 20 lakh youth over five years and upgrade 1,000 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs). The ITIs will be upgraded using a hub-and-spoke model, which involves a central ITI (hub) supported by several smaller ITIs (spokes).
- <u>Internship Scheme:</u> Provides internship opportunities for 1 crore youth in 500 top companies over five years. This helps bridge the gap between education and employment by providing practical experience.

Nine Budget Priorities for 'Viksit Bharat':

Priority 1: Productivity and Resilience in Agriculture

- Allocation: ₹1.52 lakh crore
- <u>High-Yield Varieties:</u> Introduction of 109 new high-yielding and climate-resilient crop varieties to improve agricultural productivity and resilience.
- <u>Natural Farming:</u> Initiation of 1 crore farmers into natural farming practices, including certification and branding. This promotes sustainable agriculture.
- Bio-Input Centres: Establishment of 10,000 centres to provide bio-inputs for natural farming.
- <u>Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI)</u>: Development of DPI for agriculture to help farmers manage their lands and access resources more effectively over three years.

Priority 2: Employment & Skilling

• Employment Schemes: Implementation of the three schemes outlined in the Prime Minister's package.

Women Workforce:

- Hostels and Crèches: Establishment of hostels and crèches for working women to support their participation in the workforce.
- Women-Specific Skilling Programs: Targeted skilling programs for women to enhance their employability.
- Market Access for SHG Enterprises: Promoting market access for women-led Self-Help Group (SHG) enterprises to increase their economic participation.

• Skill Development:

- o <u>Centrally Sponsored Skilling Scheme:</u> For skilling 20 lakh youth over five years.
- o Revised Model Skill Loan Scheme: Facilitates loans up to ₹7.5 lakh for skill development.
- <u>Higher Education Loans:</u> Financial support for loans up to ₹10 lakh for domestic higher education for youth not benefiting from other government schemes.

Priority 3: Inclusive Human Resource Development and Social Justice

- <u>Purvodaya:</u> Development of an industrial node at Gaya and a new 2400 MW power plant at Pirpainti as part of the Amritsar-Kolkata Industrial Corridor.
- <u>Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act:</u> Special financial support of ₹15,000 crore for industrial nodes and power projects in Andhra Pradesh.
- Women-led Development: Over ₹3 lakh crore allocated for schemes benefiting women and girls.

- <u>Street Markets:</u> Development of 100 weekly 'haats' or street food hubs annually for five years to support local vendors and markets.

- Energy Transition Pathways: Policy to balance employment, growth, and environmental sustainability.
- <u>Pumped Storage Policy:</u> Promotion of pumped storage projects for electricity storage.
- <u>Small Modular Reactors:</u> R&D and partnership for Bharat Small Modular Reactors.
- <u>Advanced Ultra Super Critical Thermal Power Plants:</u> Joint venture to set up a commercial plant using advanced technology.
- <u>Hard-to-Abate Industries:</u> Transition from 'Perform, Achieve, and Trade' mode to an Indian Carbon Market for difficult-to-abate industries.

Priority 7: Infrastructure

- Capital Expenditure: ₹11,11,111 crore allocated for central infrastructure projects.
- <u>State Governments' Support:</u> ₹1.5 lakh crore in long-term interest-free loans for state infrastructure investments.
- <u>PMGSY Phase IV:</u> Connectivity for 25,000 rural habitations through the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana.
- <u>Irrigation and Flood Mitigation:</u> Financial support for major irrigation and flood mitigation projects, including assistance for flood-affected areas.

Priority 8: Innovation, Research & Development

- Anusandhan National Research Fund: Funding for basic research and prototype development.
- <u>Financing Pool:</u> ₹1 lakh crore for private sector-driven research and innovation.
- **Space Economy:** ₹1,000 crore venture capital fund to expand the space economy.

Priority 9: Next Generation Reforms

- <u>Rural Land-Related Actions:</u> Introduction of Unique Land Parcel Identification Number (ULPIN), digitization of land records, and establishment of a land registry.
- <u>Urban Land Records:</u> Digitization of urban land records with GIS mapping.
- <u>Labour Services:</u> Integration of the e-shram portal with other systems for a one-stop solution and development of open architecture databases for the labour market.



• <u>NPS Vatsalya:</u> Plan for contributions by parents and guardians for minors under the National Pension System (NPS).

PART B

Indirect Taxes

- Goods and Services Tax (GST): The government aims to simplify the GST structure further, expanding its coverage to the remaining sectors. This move is expected to streamline tax compliance and broaden the tax base.
- Sector-Specific Customs Duty Proposals:
 - <u>Cancer Drugs:</u> Trastuzumab-Deruxtecan, Osimertinib, and Durvalumab are now fully exempt from customs duties, making cancer treatment more affordable.
 - Medical Equipment: Basic Customs Duty (BCD) on x-ray tubes and flat panel detectors used in medical x-ray machines is adjusted as part of the Phased Manufacturing Programme, which aims to boost domestic manufacturing in this sector.
- <u>Mobile Phones and Related Parts:</u> The BCD on mobile phones, mobile Printed Circuit Board Assemblies (PCBA), and mobile chargers has been reduced to 15%. This reduction is intended to lower the cost of mobile phones and encourage domestic manufacturing.
- <u>Precious Metals:</u> Customs duties on gold and silver have been reduced to 6%, while the duty on platinum is reduced to 6.4%. This change is likely to affect the cost of these metals for both consumers and industries.

• Other Metals:

- Ferro Nickel and Blister Copper: BCD on these metals is removed to encourage their use in domestic industries.
- <u>Ferrous Scrap and Nickel Cathode:</u> Duties on these materials are also removed, which should lower costs for industries reliant on these inputs.
- o <u>Copper Scrap:</u> A concessional BCD of 2.5% is introduced to support the recycling industry.
- <u>Electronics</u>: BCD on oxygen-free copper used in manufacturing resistors is removed under specific conditions to support electronics manufacturing.
- <u>Chemicals and Petrochemicals:</u> BCD increased from 7.5% to 10% to adjust for market conditions and promote domestic production of fertilizers.
- Plastics: BCD increased from 10% to 25% to curb imports and promote local production.
- <u>Telecommunication Equipment:</u> BCD increased from 10% to 15% to support domestic telecom equipment manufacturing.
- <u>Trade Facilitation:</u> For promoting domestic aviation and boat/ship MRO (Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul), the period for exporting goods imported for repairs is extended from six months to one year. Similarly, the time limit for re-importing goods for repairs under warranty is extended from three to five years.
- <u>Critical Minerals</u>: 25 critical minerals are fully exempt from customs duties, supporting industries
 reliant on these resources. Additionally, BCD on two critical minerals has been reduced to facilitate their
 use in key sectors.
- <u>Solar Energy:</u> Capital goods used in the manufacture of solar cells and panels are exempt from customs duty to promote the solar energy sector.
- Marine Products: BCD on certain broodstock, polychaete worms, shrimp, and fish feed is reduced to 5%. Various inputs for shrimp and fish feed are also exempted from customs duty to support the aquaculture industry.

• Leather and Textiles:

- o <u>Down Filling Material:</u> BCD reduced on real downfilling material from duck or goose.
- MDI for Spandex Yarn: BCD on methylene diphenyl diisocyanate (MDI) used for spandex yarn manufacture is reduced from 7.5% to 5%.


- <u>Simplification and Rationalization:</u> Efforts to simplify the tax regime, improve taxpayer services, and reduce litigation are ongoing. In FY23, 58% of corporate tax was collected under the simplified tax regime, and more than two-thirds of personal income taxpayers opted for the simplified tax regime in FY24
- Simplification for Charities and Tax Deducted at Source (TDS):
 - <u>Charity Exemptions</u>: Two tax exemption regimes for charities are merged into one to simplify compliance.
 - o <u>TDS Rate Changes:</u> The TDS rate on various payments is streamlined. The rate on many payments is reduced from 5% to 2%, while the 20% TDS rate on mutual fund repurchases is withdrawn. The TDS rate for e-commerce operators is reduced from 1% to 0.1%.
 - o <u>TDS Payment Delays</u>: Delays in TDS payments up to the due date of filing the statement are decriminalized to reduce penal consequences for minor delays.
- <u>Simplification of Reassessment:</u> Assessments can be reopened up to five years from the end of the assessment year if the escaped income is ₹50 lakh or more. In search cases, the time limit is reduced from ten to six years before the search year.
- Simplification and Rationalization of Capital Gains:
 - Short-Term Gains: Short-term capital gains on certain financial assets will now attract a tax rate of 20%.
 - Long-Term Gains: Long-term capital gains on all financial and non-financial assets will attract a tax rate of 12.5%.
 - Exemption Limit: The exemption limit for capital gains on certain financial assets is increased to ₹1.25 lakh per year.
- <u>Taxpayer Services:</u> All remaining services of Customs and Income Tax, including rectifications and
 - orders giving effect to appellate orders, will be digitalized over the next two years to improve efficiency.

• Litigation and Appeals:

- Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme, 2024: A scheme for resolving income tax disputes pending in appeal.
- o Increased Appeal Limits: Monetary limits for filing appeals in Tax Tribunals, High Courts, and Supreme Court are increased to ₹60 lakh, ₹2 crore, and ₹5 crore, respectively.
- Safe Harbour Rules: Expanded to reduce litigation and provide certainty in international taxation.

• Employment and Investment:

- Angel Tax: Abolished for all classes of investors to support the start-up ecosystem.
- Foreign Shipping Companies: A simpler tax regime is introduced for foreign shipping companies operating domestic cruises to promote cruise tourism.
- Foreign Mining Companies: Safe harbour rates for foreign mining companies selling raw diamonds in India are introduced.





o Corporate Tax Rate: Reduced for foreign companies from 40% to 35%.

• Social Security Benefits:

- NPS Deduction: Deduction for employers contributing to the National Pension System (NPS) increased from 10% to 14% of the employee's salary.
- o **Foreign Assets:** Non-reporting of small movable foreign assets up to ₹20 lakh is de-penalized.

Other Major Proposals in Finance Bill:

- o **Equalization Levy:** The 2% equalization levy on digital transactions is withdrawn.
- o <u>Personal Income Tax:</u> Standard deduction for salaried employees increased from ₹50,000 to ₹75,000. Deduction on family pension for pensioners enhanced from ₹15,000 to ₹25,000.



DEFENCE & SECURITY

SEBEX 2

- India has developed <u>SEBEX 2</u>, a powerful new explosive that is twice as lethal as the standard Trinitrotoluene (TNT), making it one of the most powerful non-nuclear explosives globally.
- The explosive was developed by Economic Explosives Ltd (EEL), a subsidiary of Nagpur-based Solar Industries, under the Defence Export Promotion Scheme of the Indian Navy.
- The development of SEBEX 2 falls under the Make in India initiative, highlighting India's commitment to advancing its defence capabilities with indigenous technologies.



Exercise 'Nomadic Elephant'

- The <u>Joint Military Exercise 'Nomadic Elephant' between India</u> and <u>Mongolia is an annual training event that aims to enhance</u> interoperability between the two armies.
- The 16th edition of the exercise was conducted in Meghalaya's Umroi from July 3-16, 2024.
- The exercise aims to improve the ability of both armies to conduct semi-conventional operations in semi-urban and mountainous terrain.



Maitree Exercise


- The Maitree Exercise is a joint military exercise between the Indian Army and the Royal Thai Army, held in Tak Province, Thailand.
- The exercise has been conducted annually since 2006.
- The exercise aims to boost military cooperation, improve skills in counter-insurgency and counter-terrorism operations, enhance joint planning and tactical drills, and promote physical fitness among troops.
- In addition to the Maitree Exercise, <u>India and Thailand</u> conduct other joint military exercises, such as Ex-Ayutthaya (naval exercise) and Ex-SIAM BHARAT (air force exercise).





Tank 'Zorawar'

- India unveils <u>'Zorawar' light tank, developed in</u> collaboration with DRDO and Larsen & Toubro.
- Designed for high-altitude operations, featuring advanced weaponry and protection systems.
- Named after General Zorawar Singh, the tank is slated for extensive trials before potential deployment in Ladakh, Sikkim, or Kashmir.
- Developed in response to the strategic needs identified during the Galwan Valley standoff, the 'Zorawar' aims to strengthen India's military presence in high-altitude areas like Ladakh, Sikkim, and Kashmir.



Exercise Pitch Black

- The <u>Indian Air Force (IAF) participated in Exercise Pitch Black 2024, an international military exercise</u> hosted by the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) at Base Darwin, Australia.
- This biennial, multinational exercise, held from July 12 to August 2, 2024, serves as a critical platform for enhancing global military cooperation and showcasing advanced air combat capabilities.
- The exercise supports the deployment of forces over large distances and strengthens aviation associations within the Indo-Pacific region, a strategically important area.

Exercise KHAAN QUEST

- The <u>Indian Army contingent participated in the prestigious multinational military exercise, KHAAN</u> <u>QUEST 2024</u>, in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.
- This event, which runs from July 27 to August 9, 2024, provides a valuable platform for military forces worldwide to collaborate and enhance their peacekeeping capabilities.
- KHAAN QUEST began in 2003 as a bilateral exercise between the United States and Mongolia. By 2006, it evolved into a Multinational Peacekeeping Exercise, reflecting its growing scope and importance.

Astra Mark 1 Missile

- The Indian Air Force (IAF) has recently <u>approved</u> the <u>production of 200 Astra Mark 1 air-to-air</u> missiles.
- The clearance was granted to the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL).
- The <u>Astra Mark 1 is a state-of-the-art air-to-air</u> missile developed by <u>DRDO</u>. It is designed to enhance the air combat capabilities of Indian fighter aircraft, including the Su-30 and LCA Tejas.
- The missile is equipped with a combination of active radar seekers and infrared homing systems for precise targeting and effective interception of enemy aircraft.







SCIENCE

Xenophrys Apatani

- The <u>discovery of a new species of horned frog</u> in Arunachal Pradesh by a team of researchers from the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI).
- The newly discovered species is named **Xenophrys apatani**.
- The frog was found in the <u>Talle Wildlife Sanctuary in the</u> Lower Subansiri district of Arunachal Pradesh.
- The species is named after the Apatani community, which is known for its conservation efforts.



R21/Matrix-M

- The Serum Institute of India, in collaboration with the University of Oxford, has launched a new high-efficacy malaria vaccine, R21/Matrix-M, in Africa.
- The R21/Matrix-M vaccine is now officially being administered in Africa, with Côte d'Ivoire becoming the first country in West Africa to start the rollout.
- The vaccine has been approved by the World Health Organization (WHO) following rigorous regulatory and clinical evaluations.
- The R21/Matrix-M vaccine is highly effective and affordable. It is produced at a low cost and can be scaled up quickly, which is crucial for addressing malaria in large populations.
- Malaria is a deadly, mosquito-borne infectious disease caused by protozoan parasites of the Plasmodium genus. <u>It spreads through the bite of an infected female Anopheles mosquito.</u>

Asia's First Pre-Clinical Network Facility

- Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh inaugurated <u>Asia's first "Pre-Clinical Network Facility" at the Translational Health Science & Technology Institute (THSTI) in Faridabad, Haryana.</u>
- The facility is equipped to handle Biosafety Level 3 (BSL3) pathogens, which require stringent safety measures due to their potential to cause serious or potentially lethal diseases.
- It has one of the largest small animal housing capacities in India, enabling research on immunecompromised mice and various other species.

NASA Sends Missy Elliott's "The Rain" to Venus

- On July 12, 2024, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) achieved a historic milestone by transmitting Missy Elliott's song "The Rain (Supa Dupa Fly)" to Venus.
- This event marks the first time a hip-hop song has been sent into deep space, showcasing a unique blend of art and science.
- NASA's Venus exploration efforts involve international collaborations, including partnerships with the European Space Agency (ESA). These collaborative efforts reflect a new era in planetary exploration and emphasize global scientific cooperation.
- NASA is a federal agency responsible for the civil space program, aeronautics research, and space research. Established in 1958, it focuses on peaceful applications in space science and has led most of America's space exploration programs, including Project Mercury, Project Gemini, Apollo Moon landing missions, Skylab space station, and Space Shuttle.



Venus

- Venus, the **second planet from the Sun**, is a terrestrial planet known for its extreme atmospheric and surface conditions.
- It orbits the Sun at an average distance of 108 million kilometres, making it the closest terrestrial planet to Earth in terms of size and mass.
- Venus's atmosphere is dense, mostly composed of carbon dioxide (CO₂), with thick clouds of sulfuric acid (H₂SO₄) covering the planet. This dense atmosphere traps heat through the greenhouse effect, leading to extreme surface temperatures.
- The mean surface temperature of Venus is approximately 464 °C, making it the hottest planet in the Solar System.
- Venus has a rocky surface with mountains, valleys, and volcanic plains, with active volcanism contributing to surface resurfacing rather than plate tectonics.
- Venus rotates slowly on its axis, taking about 243 Earth days to complete one rotation.
- Venus is one of the brightest objects in the night sky, **often visible as either a "morning star" or** "evening star," due to its thick atmosphere reflecting sunlight brightly.

Chandipura Virus Infection

- Gujarat has reported its first confirmed death due to Chandipura virus infection, affecting a four-yearold child.
- Chandipura virus (CHPV) <u>transmitted by sandflies (Phlebotomus papatasi) and mosquitoes (Aedes aegypti).</u>
- The virus resides in the salivary glands of these insects and is transmitted through their bites, leading to central nervous system infections and encephalitis.

Key points

- o <u>Initial Symptoms:</u> Acute fever, body ache, and headache.
- o <u>Progressive Symptoms:</u> Rapid progression to altered sensorium, seizures, and encephalitis. Other symptoms may include respiratory distress, bleeding tendencies, or anaemia.
- o <u>Mortality:</u> The infection can lead to death within 24-48 hours of hospitalization due to its rapid progression.
- o <u>Current Treatments:</u> No specific antiretroviral therapy or vaccine is available.

Discovery of Six New Exoplanets

- NASA recently announced the <u>discovery of six new exoplanets</u>, further expanding our knowledge of planets beyond our solar system.
- This latest discovery brings the total number of confirmed exoplanets to 5,502, showcasing significant progress in the search for extraterrestrial life and the understanding of planetary systems.

• Newly Identified Exoplanets:

- o <u>HD 36384 b:</u> A super Jupiter, an enormous gas giant orbiting an M giant star nearly 40 times the size of our Sun.
- TOI-198 b: A potentially rocky exoplanet located on the inner edge of its star's habitable zone, where conditions might allow liquid water to exist.
- o <u>TOI-2095 b and TOI-2095 c:</u> Two hot super-Earths orbiting an M dwarf star, offering insights into the formation and characteristics of Earth-like planets.
- o <u>TOI-4860 b:</u> A rare "hot Jupiter," which completes an orbit around its host star in just 1.52 days, is a phenomenon seen around M dwarf stars.
- MWC 758 c: A giant protoplanet orbiting a young star with a protoplanetary disk, providing valuable data on early planetary formation.
- Exoplanets are planets that exist outside of our solar system, orbiting stars other than our Sun.


Ravindra Jadeja

- Ravindra Jadeja, a star India all-rounder, announced his retirement from T20 internationals following India's T20 World Cup 2024 victory.
- Jadeja's T20 World Cup 2024 campaign was marked by highs and lows, with a mix of highs and lows.
- Career highlights include his T20I debut against Sri Lanka in February 2009, appearances in 74 T20I matches, and scoring 515 runs at an average of 21.45.
- Taken 54 wickets from 71 innings at an average of 29.85 and an economy rate of 7.13.



Viswanathan Anand

 Viswanathan Anand, a former world chess champion from India, has won the Leon Masters chess championship for the 10th time, defeating Jaime Santos Latasa of Spain in the final.



- He became the National Sub-Junior Chess Champion at age 14.
- <u>Key Achievements:</u> India's first chess Grandmaster in 1988, a Five-time World Chess Champion, won the FIDE World Chess Championship in 2000 and became the undisputed World Champion in 2007.
- He received the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award (now Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award) in 1991-92, and Padma Vibhushan in 2007.

Asian Championships

- The Indian U23 wrestling team dominated the Asian Championships in Jordan, securing a total of 19 medals across women's wrestling, Greco-Roman, and freestyle categories.
- In women's wrestling; Meenakshi, Pushpa Yadav, and Priya Malik won three gold medals.
- The freestyle wrestling category saw India top the rankings with four gold, two silver, and two bronze medals.

Abhinav Bindra

- Abhinav Bindra, India's first individual Olympic gold medallist, has been honoured with the prestigious Olympic Order by the International Olympic Committee (IOC).
- The Olympic Order is the IOC's highest award, recognizing distinguished contributions to the Olympic Movement. It acknowledges individuals who have demonstrated exceptional merit in sports or provided significant service to the Olympic cause.



- Bindra won the gold medal in the men's 10-meter air rifle event at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, marking India's first individual Olympic gold.
- Since 2018, Bindra has served as a member of the IOC Athlete Commission.

Wimbledon 2024 Final

- Carlos Alcaraz defended his Wimbledon title, becoming the youngest player in open-era history to win men's singles at Wimbledon and Roland Garros in the same year.
- Barbora Krejcikova defeated Jasmine Paolini in the Women's Category at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club in London.

James Anderson

 James Anderson, the legendary English fast bowler, has officially announced his retirement from Test cricket, marking the conclusion of an extraordinary 21-year career.



- Anderson, widely regarded as one of the greatest fast bowlers in cricket history, played his final Test match at the iconic Lord's Cricket Ground, where his journey in international cricket began.
- He played his last Test match against the West Indies, where England secured a commanding victory by an innings and 114 runs on July 12th, 2024.
- Anderson retires as the leading wicket-taker among fast bowlers in Test cricket, with 704 wickets.
- Anderson took 32 five-wicket hauls in Test matches, ranking sixth on the all-time list.
- With 188 Test appearances, Anderson stands second only to Sachin Tendulkar's 200 Tests.

Copa America Title

- Argentina secured its second consecutive Copa America championship, by defeating Colombia 1-0 in a match that extended into extra time.
- The match remained goalless until the 112th minute, when Lautaro Martínez, who had been substituted in the 97th minute, scored the crucial goal.
- With this victory, Argentina has won its 16th Copa America title, extending its record as the most successful team in the tournament's history.
- The win also ended Colombia's impressive 28-game unbeaten streak, which had been ongoing since a loss to Argentina in February 2022.

Manu Bhaker

- Manu Bhaker made history at the Paris Olympics 2024 by winning a bronze medal in the women's 10m air pistol event.
- This achievement marks a significant milestone for Indian sports, as Bhaker is the first Indian woman to secure a shooting medal at the Olympic Games.



- Manu Bhaker's bronze medal ends a 12-year wait for an Olympic medal in shooting for India. The previous successes were at the London Olympics 2012:
 - o Vijay Kumar: Silver in rapid-fire pistol
 - o **Gagan Narang**: Bronze in 10m air rifle
- At the 2018 Youth Olympics, Manu won gold in the women's 10m air pistol event, becoming the first Indian shooter and female athlete to achieve this.

Paris Olympic Games 2024

- The 2024 Olympic Games in Paris, officially known as the XXXIII Olympiad, were held from July 26 to August 11. This edition was the largest event ever organized in France.
- More than 10,500 from over 200 National Olympic Committees (NOCs) and the IOC Refugee Olympic Team participated.
- The Paris Olympics 2024 included a variety of new sports, returning sports, dropped sports, format changes, and environmental sustainability measures.

Challa Sreenivasulu Setty

• The Financial Services Institution Bureau (FSIB) has approved Challa Sreenivasulu Setty as the next chairman of the State Bank of India (SBI).



- Setty will succeed Dinesh Khara, who will turn 63 in August 2024.
- Setty has worked at the bank for 35 years and has held key roles such as Chief General Manager, and General Manager in the Corporate Accounts Group.

Ravi Agrawal

 Ravi Agrawal, a 1988-batch IRS officer, has been appointed as the new chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), succeeding Nitin Gupta.



- His appointment extends until June 2025, with a reappointment on a contract basis to ensure continuity in CBDT's policy framework.

- Ernst coded an optional mode using artificial intelligence to detect faces and move the snake head towards the person looking at you.




Dick Schoof

- Towne's most famous work is the 1974 film "Chinatown," for which he won an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay.

- Keir Starmer to become Britain's next Prime Minister, is known for his background in human rights law and his leadership within the Labour Party.
- Before entering politics, Starmer had a distinguished career as a human rights lawyer. His work included defending civil liberties and championing social justice.
- From 2008 to 2013, he served as the Director of Public Prosecutions, where he was noted for his handling of high-profile cases involving MPs and journalists.
- Starmer entered politics relatively late, becoming a Member of Parliament (MP) in 2015, representing the Labour Party.

Kamala Pujari

- Kamala Pujari, a celebrated Padma Shri awardee and famous organic farmer, has passed away at the age of 74 due to kidney-related complications.
- Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced that Pujari's funeral would be held with full state honours and expressed his grief over her loss.

- "Avatar: The Way of Water" (2022): The sequel to "Avatar" continued the legacy of innovation and success, further establishing Landau and Cameron's collaboration as one of the most successful in film history.

Masoud Pezeshkian

- Masoud Pezeshkian, a reformist lawmaker and prominent cardiac surgeon, has been elected as Iran's president
- Under Pezeshkian, India's investment in the strategic Chabahar Port is likely to be reinforced. This port is crucial for enhancing trade with Afghanistan and Central Asia, bypassing Pakistan.














- Played 40 matches, accumulating 1985 runs with a highest score of 201 against Pakistan in Jalandhar in 1982-83. He set the record for the slowest double-hundred in Test cricket, taking 671 minutes to achieve it.

Dr Soumya Swaminathan

- Dr Soumya Swaminathan has been appointed as the Principal Adviser for the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme at the Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.
- Dr Swaminathan's background includes her previous positions as Chief Scientist of the World Health Organization (WHO) and Director General of the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).

- The NBDA is the largest association of news broadcasters in India, it was founded in 2007.
- The NBDA plays a crucial role in shaping news broadcasting standards, advocating for members' interests, and promoting ethical journalism practices.



Shekhar Kapur

- Veteran filmmaker Shekhar Kapur has been appointed as the festival director for the International Film Festival of India (IFFI).
- Kapur began his filmmaking journey with the family drama Masoom in 1983. He gained widespread acclaim with the 1987 hit Mr. India.

- Venezuela's National Electoral Council (CNE) announced that Nicolás Maduro has won the presidential election, securing his third term as President of Venezuela. He will govern from 2025 to 2031.
- Nicolás Maduro began his career as a bus driver before becoming a trade union leader.
 He was elected to Venezuela's National Assembly in 2000 and held several significant roles under President Hugo Chávez, including President of the National Assembly (2005-2006), Minister of Foreign Affairs (2006-2013), and Vice President (2012-2013).
- Following Chávez's death in March 2013, Maduro assumed the presidency.
- Maduro received 5,150,092 valid votes, amounting to 51.2% of the counted votes, with a voter turnout of 59%.

Professor K. Chockalingam

- A retired professor K. Chockalingam from Tamil Nadu, has been awarded the Hans von Hentig award.
- The award recognition highlights his significant contributions to the field of victimology, bringing global attention to Indian scholarship in the study of crime victims and their experiences within the criminal justice system.

- The award recognizes outstanding contributions to victimology, including innovative research, theoretical advancements, and a significant impact on policy and practice related to victims' rights and support.






Paul Kagame


- Paul Kagame won re-election for his fourth consecutive term as President of Rwanda with 99.15% of the vote.

- Rwanda is a landlocked country in East Central Africa, known as the "land of a thousand hills."




Roberta Metsola

- The UPSC is established under Articles 315-323, Part XIV, Chapter II of the Indian Constitution, ensuring its autonomy.

Gulbenkian Prize for Humanity 2024

- The <u>Andhra Pradesh Community Managed Natural Farming (APCNF)</u> program, initiated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, has earned global recognition by winning the prestigious <u>Gulbenkian</u> <u>Prize for Humanity 2024</u>.
- The announcement was made by <u>Dr Angela Merkel</u>, former Federal Chancellor of Germany and chair of the jury, during a ceremony held on <u>July 11th</u> in <u>Lisbon</u>, <u>Portugal</u>.
- The APCNF shares the <u>EURO 1 million</u> prize with <u>Dr Rattan Lal</u>, a renowned soil scientist from the USA, and <u>SEKEM</u>, an Egyptian network promoting biodynamic farming.
- The APCNF program was launched in <u>2016</u> by the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The program aims to transition smallholder farmers from chemically intensive agriculture to natural farming practices.



K. Saraswathi Amma Award

- P. Geetha, a writer, critic, and feminist activist, has been awarded the first K. Saraswathi Amma Award.
- The award, instituted by WINGS (Women's Integration and Growth Through Sports) Kerala, recognizes feminist contributions to literature and social discourse.
- The award is named after K. Saraswathi Amma, a feminist writer, who began her literary journey in 1938 with her first published short story.

Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur

- Roshni Nadar Malhotra, the Chairperson of HCLTech, has been honoured with the "Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur" (Knight of the Legion of Honour), which is France's highest civilian award.
- This award was established in 1802 by Napoleon Bonaparte, and recognizes individuals for exceptional service to France, regardless of their nationality.



• The ceremony took place at the residence of France in Delhi and was presented by H.E. Mr Thierry Mathou, Ambassador of France to India, on behalf of the President of the French Republic.

PM SVANidhi Scheme

- The recognition of <u>Madhya Pradesh as the 'Best Performing State' under the Prime Minister SVANidhi (PM SVANidhi) scheme highlights the state's exemplary efforts in supporting urban street vendors.</u>
- The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) launched the Prime Minister Street Vendor's Atma Nirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi) Scheme on June 1, 2020, to provide collateral-free working capital loans to street vendors to restart their businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The scheme aims to facilitate loans up to ₹10,000 with enhanced loans of ₹20,000 and ₹50,000 in the second and third tranches, incentivize regular repayment through a 7% per annum interest subsidy, and reward digital transactions with cashback of up to ₹1,200 per year.



IMPORTANT DAYS

GST Day

- Goods and Services Tax (GST) Day is celebrated on July 1 each year, 2024is the seventh anniversary of the GST system in India.
- The <u>concept of GST was introduced in the early 2000s by the Kelkar Task Force</u> to replace the existing framework hindering economic growth.
- The Constitution (101st Amendment) Act was enacted in August 2016, allowing the central government to charge and collect GST.
- Bollywood actor Amitabh Bachchan serves as the brand ambassador for GST in India.
- The Indian GST system has five tax slabs: 0%, 5%, 12%, 18%, and 28%.
- Former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee is often referred to as the father of GST in India.

National Chartered Accountant (CA) Day

- CA Day 2024 marked the 76th anniversary of the founding of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).
- The theme for 2024 is "Innovating For A Sustainable Future".
- The day celebrates the establishment of the ICAI in 1949.
- The ICAI is now the world's second-largest professional organization for chartered accountants, highlighting the growth and importance of the accounting profession in India.
- The ICAI's headquarters are located in New Delhi.

National Doctor's Day

- National Doctor's Day 2024 is an annual celebration, observed on July 1st every year.
- The theme for 2024 is "Healing Hands, Caring Hearts."
- The day was established to honour Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, a renowned physician and the second Chief Minister of West Bengal.



• Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy was born on July 1, 1882; he was a pioneering figure in Indian medicine and politics.

World UFO Day

- World UFO Day is celebrated on July 2, to raise awareness about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) and the possibility of life beyond Earth.
- UFOs are anything flying in the sky that we can't easily explain, and they can be anything from weather balloons to satellites, unusual aircraft, or natural events in the sky.
- The date of World UFO Day was chosen on June 24, 1947, after a famous UFO sighting by Kenneth Arnold in 1947. The date was later changed to July 2, marking the anniversary of the Roswell incident in 1947.

International Plastic Bag Free Day

- <u>International Plastic Bag Free Day is celebrated on July 3</u>
 <u>every year</u> to raise awareness about the harmful effects of plastic bags on our environment.
- Plastic bags are convenient but cause serious problems for our planet, take up to 500 years to break down in nature, harm wildlife and marine animals, clog drainage systems, pollute oceans, rivers, and soil, and disrupt recycling processes.



World Zoonoses Day

- Every year on July 6th, World Zoonoses Day is observed to mark the anniversary of a significant milestone in the fight against zoonotic diseases.
- The day marks the anniversary of the first successful administration of a rabies vaccine by French biologist Louis Pasteur.
- The theme of the 2024 World Zoonoses Day is "One World, One Health: Prevent Zoonoses"
- It aims to increase public awareness about zoonotic diseases—diseases that can be transmitted from animals to humans. These include well-known diseases such as rabies, swine flu, bird flu, and foodborne infections.
- Approximately 60% of all known diseases are zoonotic, and about 70% of emerging infections originate from animals.

World Kiswahili Language Day

- World Kiswahili Language Day is celebrated annually on the 7th of July, to recognize and promote Kiswahili, an important African language.
- The 2024 celebration marks the third observance of this day, focusing on Kiswahili's role in education and peace.
- Theme for 2024: "Kiswahili: Education and Culture of Peace"
- Kiswahili is one of the most widely spoken languages in Africa.
- In 2021, UNESCO's General Conference adopted a resolution to recognize Kiswahili's contributions to cultural diversity and dialogue. This resolution led to the establishment of World Kiswahili Language Day on July 7 each year.

National Fish Farmers Day

- On July 10th, India celebrates National Fish Farmers Day to honour the contributions of fish farmers, aquaculture professionals, and stakeholders in the fisheries sector.
- On this day in 1957, Professor Dr. Hiralal Chaudhury and his colleague Dr. K. H. Alikunhi successfully demonstrated the induced breeding of Indian Major Carps using the hypophysation technique.
- Fish farmers are integral to India's economy, meeting the growing demand for fish protein, generating employment, and contributing to food security.



World Population Day

- World Population Day was established by the United Nations in 1989, marking the day on July 11, 1987, when the global population reached 5 billion.
- Dr. KC Zachariah proposed the idea of this observance to address growing population challenges.
- World Population Day has evolved into a powerful tool for advocacy on issues such as reproductive health, family planning, gender equality, and sustainable development, influencing policies and public opinion.
- The theme for World Population Day 2024,
 "Leave no one behind, count everyone,"
 highlights the importance of inclusive data collection to ensure all communities are represented in population statistics and policymaking.



World Malala Day 2024

- World Malala Day is observed on the 12th of July to honour Malala Yousafzai, a prominent advocate for girls' education and women's rights.
- The day focuses on raising awareness about education for girls and the broader issues of women's and children's rights globally.
- Malala Yousafzai was born on July 12, 1997, in Mingora, Pakistan.
- The United Nations declared July 12 as World Malala Day to commemorate Malala's birthday and her courageous efforts in advocating for education despite facing severe challenges.

World Youth Skills Day 2024

- World Youth Skills Day is celebrated on 15th July to emphasize the importance of skill development among young people.
- The day aims to recognize and promote the role of skills in empowering youth and enhancing their future prospects.
- <u>Theme for 2024: "Youth Skills for Peace and Development"</u> This theme highlights the role of skills development in contributing to peaceful societies and sustainable development.

World Day for International Justice

- World Day for International Justice, also known as International Justice Day, is <u>celebrated annually on</u> <u>17th July.</u>
- This day celebrates the establishment of the International Criminal Court (ICC) and its mission to combat impunity for the perpetrators of the most serious offences, including genocide, war crimes, and crimes against humanity.

Nelson Mandela International Day

International Moon Day 2024

- <u>International Moon Day is celebrated annually on July 20th</u> to mark the historic Apollo 11 mission, during which Neil Armstrong became the first human to set foot on the Moon.
- On July 20, 1969, Apollo 11's Lunar Module landed on the Moon, and Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on its surface, marking a significant achievement in space exploration.
- The first global celebration of International Moon Day took place on July 20, 2022.

World Chess Day 2024

- World Chess Day is celebrated globally on July 20th to mark the establishment of the International Chess Federation (FIDE) and to promote chess as an accessible and inclusive game for all.
- The International Chess Federation (FIDE) was founded on July 20, 1924, in Paris, France, by chess organizations from Argentina, Czechoslovakia, France, Poland, Romania, Spain, Switzerland, and Yugoslavia.
- The day aims to highlight the cultural and educational value of chess and its role in promoting intellectual development and international friendship.

World Brain Day

- World Brain Day is observed annually on July 22nd to raise awareness about brain health, prevent brain-related disabilities, and improve treatment and rehabilitation methods.
- The World Federation of Neurology (WFN) established World Brain Day as a global event to focus on neurological health and the prevention of brain diseases.
- <u>The theme for 2024: "Brain Health and Prevention"</u> emphasizes the importance of maintaining brain health and preventing neurological disorders.
- The World Federation of Neurology was founded on July 22, 1957, in Belgium, and the establishment of World Brain Day aligns with this significant anniversary.

National Broadcasting Day

- National Broadcasting Day is celebrated in India on July 23rd to commemorate the first-ever radio broadcast in the country, marking the beginning of broadcasting services in India.
- On July 23, 1927, India's first radio broadcast was conducted, marking the inception of radio broadcasting in the country.
- The Indian Broadcasting Company (IBC) was established in 1927 to manage broadcasting services but faced financial difficulties and was shut down in 1930.
- The Government of India took over the broadcasting service, leading to the creation of the Indian State Broadcasting Service (ISBS) in 1930, which later evolved into All India Radio (AIR).

National Flag Day 2024

- National Flag Day in India is observed annually on July 22 to honour the adoption of the Indian tricolour flag and the Ashoka Chakra, which represent the nation's freedom, unity, and sovereignty.
- On July 22, 1947, the Constituent Assembly of India officially adopted the national flag.
- It was introduced to symbolize the ideals of self-reliance and resistance, proposed by Badr-ud-Din Tyabji and supported by Mahatma Gandhi.
- In 2002, the Flag Code of India was amended to allow the national flag to be displayed on any day of the year, not just national holidays while maintaining respect and dignity as prescribed in the guidelines.

Income Tax Day 2024

• <u>Income Tax Day, or Rashtriya Aaykar Divas, is observed annually in India on July 24th</u> to emphasize the importance of taxation in nation-building and responsible financial citizenship.



- The day marks the introduction of India's first Income Tax Act in 1860, introduced by Sir James Wilson. This marked the beginning of formal taxation in the country.
- The day aims to spread awareness about the taxation system in India and highlight its role in supporting government functions and public services.

Samvidhaan Hatya Diva

- <u>June 25 has been officially declared "Samvidhaan Hatya Divas"</u> (Constitution Murder Day) by the central government.
- The day is designated to commemorate the victims of the Emergency period imposed on June 25, 1975, and to acknowledge the hardships faced by individuals who were imprisoned and suffered during this time.
- The Emergency in India, declared by then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, lasted from June 25, 1975, to March 21, 1977. It was a period marked by significant political repression, suspension of civil liberties, and widespread human rights abuses.

Kargil Vijay Diwas

- <u>Kargil Vijay Diwas is observed annually on July 26</u> to honour and remember the soldiers who sacrificed their lives during the Kargil War and to celebrate the victory of the Indian Armed Forces in this conflict.
- The Kargil War occurred between May and July 1999 in the Kargil district of Jammu and Kashmir. It was an armed conflict between India and Pakistan, initiated when Pakistani troops infiltrated into Indian territory.
- The day marks the successful operation by the Indian military to reclaim the territory and defeat the Pakistani forces, marking a significant moment in India's military history.

World Nature Conservation Day

- <u>World Nature Conservation Day is observed on July 28</u> to raise awareness about the importance of conserving nature and promoting sustainable practices.
- The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), established on October 5, 1948, in

Fontainebleau, France, plays a key role in global conservation efforts.

International Tiger Day

- <u>International Tiger Day is</u> <u>celebrated annually on July</u> 29 to raise awareness about the conservation of tigers and their habitats.
- Project Tiger (1973) was launched by India, to protect and revive the tiger population, which had been dwindling due to poaching and habitat loss.

World Day Against Trafficking in Persons

World Day Against
 Trafficking in Persons is
 observed on July 30 to raise
 awareness about the plight of





human trafficking victims and to advocate for their rights and protection.

- <u>The theme for 2024:</u> "Leave No Child Behind in the Fight Against Human Trafficking" focuses on the specific challenges faced by children in trafficking situations.
- The day aims to educate the public about human trafficking, promote preventive measures, and support victims by improving policies and practices globally.

World Breastfeeding Week

- World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is a global initiative observed every year from August 1st to 7th.
- This week-long event is dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of breastfeeding and advocating for the rights of mothers to breastfeed anywhere, anytime.
- The theme for World Breastfeeding Week 2024 is "Closing the Gap: Breastfeeding Support for All."
- Breast milk is made up of 87% water, 7% carbohydrates, 4% fats, and 1% protein, vitamins, and minerals. This unique blend provides all the necessary nutrients an infant needs in the first months of life.
- Breastfeeding reduces the risk of illnesses such as respiratory problems, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), diarrhoea, and ear infections. It also lowers the likelihood of obesity and type 1 diabetes later in life.

World Lung Cancer Day

- World Lung Cancer Day is observed annually on August 1st.
- The theme for World Lung Cancer Day 2024 is "Close the Care Gap: Everyone Deserves Access to Cancer Care."
- World Lung Cancer Day was established in 2012 by the Forum of International Respiratory Societies (FIRS) and the International Association for the Study of Lung Cancer (IASLC).
- The day was created to draw attention to the devastating impact of lung cancer and to promote awareness, education, and preventive measures to combat the disease.
- In India, lung cancer incidence is particularly high due to a combination of widespread tobacco use and exposure to polluted air. Urban areas, with their high levels of industrial and vehicular emissions, are especially vulnerable.

World Breastfeeding Week O1-07 August

World Breastfeeding Week is a global healthcare event celebrated annually in the first week of August (01st to 07th), promoting the importance of breastfeeding benefits to newborns and mothers. It also promotes, defends, and supports women's rights to breastfeed their babies anytime and anywhere.

Hiroshima Day

- <u>Hiroshima Day, observed annually on August 6th,</u> 2024 marks the 79th anniversary of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima during World War II.
- Historical Background
- The Manhattan Project: During World War II, the United States initiated the Manhattan Project, a secret program aimed at developing the first nuclear weapons. This led to the creation of two atomic bombs, codenamed "Little Boy" and "Fat Man."
- August 6, 1945: On this date, the American B-29 bomber Enola Gay dropped the atomic bomb "Little Boy" over Hiroshima at 8:15 AM local time. This event marked the first use of nuclear weapons in warfare.
- The explosion resulted in immediate and massive destruction. An estimated 39% of Hiroshima's population was killed instantly, with the total death toll ranging from 90,000 to 140,000. The bomb's blast, heat, and radiation caused widespread devastation, levelling the city and leaving deep physical and emotional scars.

National Handloom Day

• <u>National Handloom Day is observed annually on August 7th</u> to honour India's rich handloom heritage.



- This year marks the 10th anniversary of National Handloom Day, which has been celebrated since 2015.
- The choice of August 7 as National Handloom Day is symbolic of India's struggle for independence. This date commemorates the launch of the Swadeshi Movement in Kolkata in 1905.
- Handlooms were a powerful symbol of resistance against colonial rule, promoting Indian crafts and empowering local artisans. The establishment of National Handloom Day in 2015 was a tribute to this historical significance, marking the centenary of the Swadeshi Movement.

National Javelin Day 2024

- <u>August 7 marks National Javelin Day.</u> Established to commemorate Neeraj Chopra's monumental achievement, this day honours his Olympic gold medal win and celebrates the sport of javelin throwing.
- On August 7, 2021, Neeraj Chopra won India's first-ever Olympic gold medal in track and field with a
 javelin throw of 87.58 meters. This historic win made him the second Indian to secure an individual
 Olympic gold, following Abhinav Bindra.
- The Athletics Federation of India (AFI) declared August 7 as National Javelin Day to honour Chopra's achievement and celebrate javelin throwing's contribution to Indian athletics.

International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples

- <u>The International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples, observed annually on August 9th</u>, highlights the cultures, challenges, and contributions of indigenous communities worldwide.
- The 2024 celebration emphasizes "Protecting the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in Voluntary Isolation and Initial Contact," focusing on safeguarding the rights and well-being of Indigenous groups with limited or no contact with the outside world.
- Theme: "Protecting the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in Voluntary Isolation and Initial Contact"

Nagasaki Day

- Nagasaki Day is an annual observance held on August 9th to commemorate the atomic bombing of Nagasaki, Japan, which took place on this date in 1945.
- On August 9, 1945, at 11:02 AM local time, a U.S. B-29 bomber named "Bockscar" dropped an atomic bomb called "Fat Man" on Nagasaki, Japan. This was the second atomic bombing during World War II, following Hiroshima's bombing three days earlier.
- Around 40,000 people were killed instantly. Another 35,000 to 40,000 died in the following months from injuries and radiation.
